A R Nature Kenya - the East Africa Natural History Society – thanks you for the opportunity to comment O Fon the Kenya Roads Bill 2017. Nature Kenya appreciates the Roads Bill for respecting the authority of Kenya Wildlife Service and Kenya Forest Service over the lands they administer. However, we note that there are sensitive areas of natural or cultural importance which do not yet have protected status.

Nature Kenya therefore recommends inserting sub-sections (12) and (13) under Section 48, as follows:

48.

- (12) Road works referred to in sub-section (1) shall not be carried out where they may endanger any rare or threatened species, wildlife migration, water sources or springs, or sites of cultural or natural importance.
- (13) Roads or road works in sensitive areas of cultural or natural importance such as wetlands, indigenous forests and historic or pre-historic sites shall require an Environmental Impact Assessment, as per the EMCA subsidiary legislation 2016.

When the only feasible route for a road is to pass through protected areas, then migration corridors need to be respected and road kills by speeding cars avoided. Therefore we recommend inserting the following sub-section 14 in Section 48 as follows:

(14) Where it is unavoidable for roads to pass through protected areas, overpasses or underpasses to allow wildlife movement shall be built at frequent intervals (every 1 or 2 kilometers). In sections where there are no overpasses or underpasses, the road shall be fenced on both sides.

In the spirit of the Constitution, there is need to be able to seek redress from the courts. Therefore we recommend amending sub-section 4 under Section 48 by inserting "or any court of law" to read as:

If the owner or occupier of such land is aggrieved by the proposed exercise by the road authority of the powers conferred by this section or by the proposed exercise of the powers in the area specified in the notice, he may, within one month from the service upon him of the notice under subsection (3), make representations to the National Land Commission or any court of law thereon and shall within the same period inform the road authority concerned of the nature of such representations.

Nature Kenya would be happy to answer questions you may have or appear before a Senate committee to explain our position.
