- 1. Amends the Bribery Bill, 2016 in **Clauses 2, 10, 16, 17, 18, 21 and 26.****

1.0 Introduction

The Bribery Bill, 2016 was read for the first time on 26th May 2016 and subsequently committed to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs for consideration pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 127 (1), and report to the House.

2.0 Consideration of the Bribery Bill, 2016

The Committee considered the Bribery Bill, 2016 in its Sitting held on Tuesday, 2nd August, 2016. The Committee's decision to make amendments was based on the Constitutional requirements and borrowed best practices in other jurisdictions with similar experiences.

CLAUSE 2

THAT clause 2 of the Bill be amended in the definition of "Cabinet Secretary" by deleting the words "the prevention of bribery" and substituting therefor the words "to justice".

CLAUSE 10

THAT clause 10 of the Bill be amended by deleting sub clause (2).

CLAUSE 16

THAT clause 16 of the Bill be amended in sub clause (2) by deleting the words "to be proceeded against and punished accordingly" and substituting therefor the words "for prosecution".

CLAUSE 17

THAT clause 17 of the Bill be amended in sub clause (1) by inserting the words "partners and the" immediately after the words "name of the".

CLAUSE 18

THAT clause 18 of the Bill be amended —

- (a) in sub clause (1) by deleting the word “one” appearing in paragraph (a) and substituting therefor the word “five”;
- (b) in sub clause (5) by deleting the word “behaviour” and substituting therefor the word “offences”;
- (c) in sub clause (9) by deleting the word “less” and substituting therefor the word “more”;
- (d) in sub clause (10) deleting the word “less” and substituting therefor the word “more”;
- (e) in sub clause (11) by inserting the words “not more than” immediately before the words “ten years after conviction”; and
- (f) deleting sub clause (13).

CLAUSE 21

THAT clause 21 of the Bill be amended —

- (a) in sub clause (1) by inserting the word “informant” immediately after the word “whistleblower”;
- (b) in sub clause (2) by deleting the word “unfavorable” and substituting therefor the word “unfavourable”; and
- (c) in sub clause (3) by deleting the words “on a case by case basis” immediately after the words “Witness Protection Agency”

CLAUSE 26

THAT clause 26 of the Bill be amended in sub clause (2) by deleting the word “commenced” and substituting therefor the word “instituted”.

3.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

Having considered the Bribery Bill, 2016 clause by clause, the Committee recommends that the National Assembly:

- 1. Approves** the proposed amendments by the Committee to the Bribery Bill, 2016 in **Clauses 2, 10, 16, 17, 18, 21 and 26.**

The Committee considered the Senate amendments in its Sitting held on Tuesday, 16th August, 2016 and adopted its report on the same day. The Committee's decision to accept the amendments was guided by law and after thorough scrutiny of each of the proposed amendments.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee having considered the Senate amendments to the Protection of Traditional Knowledge and Cultural Expressions Bill, 2015 and recommends that the National Assembly:

- 1. Approves** the Senate amendments to **Clauses 4, 22, 25, 34 & 43**

ADOPTION OF THE REPORT

We the Members of the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs have, pursuant to Standing Order 199, adopted this report and affix our signatures to affirm our approval and confirm its accuracy, validity and authenticity as per the attached adoption list (Appendix II).

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Protection of Traditional Knowledge and Cultural Expressions Bill, 2015 was passed by the National Assembly on 16th March, 2016 and subsequently forwarded to the Senate for consideration pursuant to provisions of Article 110(4) of the Constitution and Standing Order 142. It was reverted, with amendments, to the National Assembly for concurrence on Tuesday, 19th July, 2016 through a message from the Speaker. The Speaker of the National Assembly directed the Committee to table its Report on the amendments for consideration by the House.

2.0 CONSIDERATION OF THE PROPOSED SENATE AMENDMENTS TO THE PROTECTION OF TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE AND CULTURAL EXPRESSIONS BILL, 2015

The Committee considered the Senate amendments in its Sitting held on Tuesday, 16th August, 2016. It is in the same sitting that the report was adopted. The Committee's decision to accept the amendments was guided by law and after thorough scrutiny of each of the proposed amendments.

The following are the Senate's amendments to the Protection of Traditional Knowledge and Cultural Expressions Bill, 2015:

Clause 4

THAT Clause 4 of the Bill be amended by inserting the following new sub-clauses immediately after paragraph (d)-

- (e) the allocation of financial resources for the promotion of cultural activities; and
- (f) subject to this Act or any other law, the establishment of mechanisms for using culture as a tool for conflict resolution and promotion of cohesion.

The Committee concurred with the Senate. This amendment seeks to expand the functions of the County Government, and therefore reasonable.

Clause 22

THAT clause 22 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (3) by inserting the words “and the respective county executive committee member in charge of matters relating to traditional knowledge and culture” immediately after the words “Cabinet Secretary”.

The Committee concurred with the Senate. It was reasonable to include the County Executive Committee Member.

Clause 25

THAT clause 25 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (3)(d) by inserting the words “after consultations with the person in charge of matters relating to traditional knowledge and culture in the relevant county” immediately after the words “relevant community”.

The Committee concurred with the Senate. The amendment seeks to promote a culture of consultation between the Cabinet Secretary and the County Executive Committee Member.

Clause 34

THAT clause 34 of the Bill be amended by deleting paragraph (h).

The Committee concurred with the Senate. The proposed amendment was reasonable.

Clause 43

THAT clause 43 be amended by inserting the following new sub-clause immediately after sub-clause (2)-

(3) Whenever the Cabinet Secretary is required to make regulations or rules under this Act, the Cabinet Secretary shall make the regulations in consultation with the Council of County Governors.


The Committee concurred with the Senate on the amendment. The Committee also noted that the word ‘County’ immediately before the word ‘Governors’ was a typographical error, which can be addressed in line with Standing Order 152.

The following amendments to the **Protection of Traditional Knowledge and Cultural Expressions Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 48 of 2015)** were passed by the Senate on Thursday, 14th July, 2016-

Clause 4

THAT Clause 4 of the Bill be amended by inserting the following new sub-clauses immediately after paragraph (d)-

- (e) the allocation of financial resources for the promotion of cultural activities; and
- (f) subject to this Act or any other law, the establishment of mechanisms for using culture as a tool for conflict resolution and promotion of cohesion.

Clause 22

THAT clause 22 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (3) by inserting the words "and the respective county executive committee member in charge of matters relating to traditional knowledge and culture" immediately after the words "Cabinet Secretary".

Clause 25

THAT clause 25 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (3)(d) by inserting the words "after consultations with the person in charge of matters relating to traditional knowledge and culture in the relevant county" immediately after the words "relevant community".

Clause 34

THAT clause 34 of the Bill be amended by deleting paragraph (h).

Clause 43

THAT clause 43 be amended by inserting the following new sub-clause immediately after sub-clause (2)-

- (3) Whenever the Cabinet Secretary is required to make regulations or rules under this Act, the Cabinet Secretary shall make the regulations in consultation with the Council of County Governors.

CONSIDERATION OF THE SENATE AMENDMENTS TO THE PROTECTION OF TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE AND TRADITIONAL CULTURAL EXPRESSIONS BILL, 2015

The Committee considered the amendments, and concurred with the Senate on the same. The following are the amendments and the committee's comments:

Clause 4

THAT Clause 4 of the Bill be amended by inserting the following new sub-clauses immediately after paragraph (d)-

(e) the allocation of financial resources for the promotion of cultural activities; and
(f) subject to this Act or any other law, the establishment of mechanisms for using culture as a tool for conflict resolution and promotion of cohesion.

The Committee concurred with the Senate. This amendment seeks to expand the functions of the County Government, and therefore reasonable.

Clause 22

THAT clause 22 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (3) by inserting the words "and the respective county executive committee member in charge of matters relating to traditional knowledge and culture" immediately after the words "Cabinet Secretary".

The Committee concurred with the Senate. It was reasonable to include the County Executive Committee Member.

Clause 25

THAT clause 25 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (3)(d) by inserting the words "after consultations with the person in charge of matters relating to traditional knowledge and culture in the relevant county" immediately after the words "relevant community".

The Committee concurred with the Senate. The amendment seeks to promote a culture of consultation between the Cabinet Secretary and the County Executive Committee Member.

Clause 34

THAT clause 34 of the Bill be amended by deleting paragraph (h).

The Committee concurred with the Senate. The proposed amendment was reasonable.

Clause 43

THAT clause 43 be amended by inserting the following new sub-clause immediately after sub-clause (2)-
(3) Whenever the Cabinet Secretary is required to make regulations or rules under this Act, the Cabinet Secretary shall make the regulations in consultation with the Council of County Governors.

The Committee concurred with the Senate on the amendment. The Committee also noted that the word 'County' immediately before the word 'Governors' was a typographical error, which can be addressed in line with Standing Order 152.

The Committee also went through a draft report on the Senate amendments before the same was proposed for adoption.


