SITTINGS

The Committee considered the Public Fundraising Appeals Bill, 2014 in its Sitting held on Tuesday, 9th August, 2016 and adopted its report on 16th August, 2016. The Committee's decisions to propose amendments were arrived at after thorough scrutiny, and after studying all the relevant provisions of law and other practices.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee having considered the Public Fundraising Appeals Bill, 2014 recommends that the National Assembly:

1. Approves amendments to Clauses 2, 14, 17, 20, 21, 23, 25, 30, & 54.

ADOPTION OF THE REPORT

We the Members of the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs have, pursuant to Standing Order 199, adopted this report and affix our signatures to affirm our approval and confirm its accuracy, validity and authenticity as per the attached adoption list (Appendix II).

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Public Fundraising Appeals Bill (Senate Bill No. 28 of 2014) was passed by the Senate on 12th May, 2015 and subsequently forwarded to the National Assembly for consideration pursuant to provisions of Article 110(4) of the Constitution and Standing Order 142. The Bill was then read for the first time on 2nd December 2015 and subsequently committed to the Committee pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 127 (1); it is on the basis of this that the Committee makes this Report.

2.0 CONSIDERATION OF THE PUBLIC FUNDRAISING APPEALS BILL (SENATE BILL NO. 28 OF 2014)

The Committee considered the Bill in its sitting held on Tuesday, 9th August, 2016. The Committee in its sitting held on 16th August, 2016 adopted its report, the same having been proposed by Hon. Paul Bii and seconded by Hon. Florence Kajuju. Public participation process was already conducted by the Senate.

CLAUSE 2

THAT clause 2 of the Bill be amended by inserting the following new definition in its proper alphabetical order-

"elected leaders" means all persons voted into office and includes the President, the Deputy President, the governor, and the deputy governor, Members of Parliament and Members of County Assemblies;"

CLAUSE 14

THAT clause 14 of the Bill be amended by inserting the words "and the national committee" immediately after the words "County Assembly".

CLAUSE 17

THAT clause 17 of the Bill be amended —

- (a) by deleting paragraph (b);
- (b) by deleting paragraph (d);

- (c) by deleting paragraph (e);
- (d) by deleting paragraph (f); and
- (e) in paragraph (g) by inserting the words "by Regulations" immediately after the words "the Cabinet Secretary may".

CLAUSE 20

THAT clause 20 of the Bill be amended—

- (a) by deleting sub clause (1) and inserting the following new sub clause—
- "(1) A nominated or elected leader shall not participate in a fundraising function or conduct a fundraising appeal during their term."
 - (b) in sub clause (2) by inserting the words "and shall be barred from participating in the subsequent general election" immediately after the words "eight hundred thousand shillings".

CLAUSE 21

THAT clause 21 of the Bill be amended in sub clause (4) by deleting the word "appointment" and substituting therefor the word "appointed" appearing in sub paragraph (ii) of paragraph (d).

CLAUSE 23

THAT clause 23 of the Bill be amended in paragraph (b) by deleting the word "a query" and substituting therefor the word "inquiry" appearing in sub clause (1).

CLAUSE 25

THAT clause 25 of the Bill be amended —

- (a) in sub clause (1) by deleting the word "check" and substituting therefor the word "verify"; and
- (b) in sub clause (2) by deleting the word "A" and substituting therefor the word "Any";

CLAUSE 30

THAT clause 30 of the Bill be amended by deleting paragraph (c).

CLAUSE 54

THAT clause 54 of the Bill be amended in sub clause (2) by inserting the following new paragraphs immediately after paragraph (f) —

(a) "(g) for the registration of public collection entities under this Act;" and "(h) for activities that do not constitute a fund raising appeal."

3.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

Having considered the Public Fundraising Appeals Bill, 2014 the Committee recommends that the National Assembly:

1. Approves amendments to Clauses 2, 14, 17, 20, 21, 23, 25, 30, & 54.

CONSIDERATION OF THE SENATE AMENDMENTS
TO THE PROTECTION OF TRADITIONAL
KNOWLEDGE AND TRADITIONAL CULTURAL
EXPRESSIONS BILL, 2015

The Committee considered the amendments, and concurred with the Senate on the same. The following are the amendments and the committee's comments:

Clause 4

THAT Clause 4 of the Bill be amended by inserting the following new sub-clauses immediately after paragraph (d)-

(e) the allocation of financial resources for the promotion of cultural activities; and (f) subject to this Act or any other law, the establishment of mechanisms for using culture as a tool for conflict resolution and promotion of cohesion.

The Committee concurred with the Senate. This amendment seeks to expand the functions of the County Government, and therefore reasonable.

Clause 22

THAT clause 22 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (3) by inserting the words "and the respective county executive committee member in charge of matters relating to traditional knowledge and culture" immediately after the words "Cabinet Secretary".

The Committee concurred with the Senate. It was reasonable to include the County Executive Committee Member.

Clause 25

THAT clause 25 of the Bill be amended in sub-clause (3)(d) by inserting the words "after consultations with the person in charge of matters relating to traditional knowledge and culture in the relevant county" immediately after the words "relevant community".

The Committee concurred with the Senate. The amendment seeks to promote a culture of consultation between the Cabinet Secretary and the County Executive Committee Member.

Clause 34

THAT clause 34 of the Bill be amended by deleting paragraph (h).

The Committee concurred with the Senate. The proposed amendment was reasonable.

Clause 43

THAT clause 43 be amended by inserting the following new sub-clause immediately after sub-clause (2)-

(3) Whenever the Cabinet Secretary is required to make regulations or rules under this Act, the Cabinet Secretary shall make the regulations in consultation with the Council of County Governors.

The Committee concurred with the Senate on the amendment. The Committee also noted that the word 'County' immediately before the word 'Governors' was a typographical error, which can be addressed in line with Standing Order 152.

The Committee also went through a draft report on the Senate amendments before the same was proposed for adoption.
