RESOLUTION OF THE ASSEMBLY URGING EAC SUMMIT TO AMMEND THE TREATY TO MAKE KISWAHILI A FORMAL LANGUAGE OF THE COMMUNITY

RECALLING THAT the East African Community (EAC) Treaty establishes the aspiration of making Kiswahili the Lingua Franca of the Community;

COGNISANT THAT the Community has established the Kiswahili Commission as an institution of the Community with the noble objective of promoting this East African Language;

ACKNOWLEDGING THAT language is one of the most important aspect of human life including by being a vessel of human philosophy, values, attitudes, identity and meaning of life;

APPRECIATING THAT the African Union has made Kiswahili one of its official working languages;

CONSIDERING THAT Kiswahili is the fastest spreading African language across the globe;

CONVINCED THAT making Kiswahili one of the official languages of the Community will widen and deepen the integration process;

- 1. To urge the Summit of EAC to amend the Treaty for the establishment of the Community to provide that Kiswahili is one of the official Languages of the Community.
- 2. To urge the Council of Ministers to support this noble quest by the Assembly.
- 3. To further urge the Council of Ministers to allocate adequate resources to EAC Kiswahili Commission to effectively carry out its mandate.
- 4. To urge the Partner States to give legal status to Kiswahili as an official language.
- 5. To further urge the Partner States to promote and allow the use of Kiswahili in official domains.
