2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 The Petition

The Petition was presented to the National Assembly by Hon. Abdullahi Mohamed Diriye, Member of Parliament for Wajir South Constituency on behalf of the Citizens of Kenya referring themselves as the National Victims and Survivors Network.

The Petition is an appeal to the National Assembly to debate and adopt the report of the Truth Justice and Reconciliation Commission (TJRC) and draws the attention of the House to the following;

- a. That, following the tragic political violence that engulfed Kenya in the aftermath of the disputed 2007 elections, the People of Kenya embarked on comprehensive reforms aimed at ensuring the transition to a peaceful, prosperous, stable, inclusive and democratic state.
- b. That, the Truth, Justice and Reconciliation Commission (TJRC) was set up and mandated to promote, peace, justice, national unity, healing, reconciliation and inquiry into gross violations of human rights and historical injustices in Kenya since 1963 to February 2008.
- c. That the TJRC recorded over 40,000 statements, received memoranda and held public hearings across the Country, concluded its work and handed over the Report to H.E the President.
- d. That according to the TJRC Act the Minister responsible for justice was supposed to table the Report in Parliament and operationalising the implementation mechanism in accordance with the recommendations of the Commission under section 48 (2) (f) of the Act to facilitate implementation.
- e. That pursuant to section 49 (3) of the TJRC Act implementation of the report should have commenced within six months upon its publication.
- f. That in December 2013, the National Assembly passed an amendment to the TJRC Act to pave way for consideration of the report by the House before implementation.
- g. That to date the National Assembly has not considered the report and the victims and survivors of gross human rights violations continue to suffer.

h. That the National Assembly's inability to prioritize and act on the report is a source of frustration for thousands of Kenyans still nursing injuries and psychological torture from past injustices.

2.2 CONSIDERATION OF THE PETITION BY THE COMMITTEE

- i. The Committee held one sitting and deliberated on the Petition presented by Hon.Abdullahi Mohamed Diriye, MP on behalf of the National Victims and Survivors Network.
- ii. The Committee considered the Petition pursuant to provisions of the

Standing Orders of the National Assembly and Petitions to

Parliament (Procedure) Act.

2.2 PRAYERS

The Petitioners prays that the National Assembly:

- a. Prioritizes debate on the TJRC Report tabled in the House on 24th July 2013.
- b. Enacts necessary legislation required to anchor the implementation of the recommendations contained therein.
- c. Allocates sufficient funds for the immediate and effective implementation and recommendations contained in the Report.
- d. The relevant committee of the House monitors the comprehensive and effective implementation of the Report.

3.0 COMMITTEE'S OBSERVATIONS

The Committee considered the Petition and made the following observations;


- i. The TJRC Report made far- reaching recommendations including the implementation of requisite legal, political, and administrative measures that seek to address historical injustices.
- ii. The National Assembly has partially implemented the report through enactment of various legislations such as the Marriage Act, Matrimonial Property Act and the Protection Against Domestic Violence Act.
- iii. The Executive has made financial allocations towards the reparation of victims. There is need for appropriate measures to establish through policy, legislation and administrative framework to provide for effective and accountable management of the allocated funds.
- iv. The House needs to examine the report and critically consider the raft of proposals and recommendations contained therein.
- v. The TJRC Report be committed to the Departmental committee on Justice and Legal Affairs and thereafter table a report to the House for consideration.

4.0 RECOMMENDATION

The Committee recommends that;

The TJRC Report be committed to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs for consideration and thereafter report to the House for debate.

l, the UNDERSIGNED on behalf of Citizens of Kenya, referring themselves as the National Victims and Survivors Network;

DRAW the attention of the House to the following:

- (i) THAT, following the tragic political violence that engulfed Kenya in the aftermath of the disputed 2007 elections, the people of Kenya embarked upon comprehensive reforms aimed at ensuring Kenya transitioned into a peaceful, prosperous, stable, inclusive and democratic country where such violence did not reoccur:
- (ii) THAT, one of the measures adopted to address long-term issues that had contributed to the violence was the setting up of the Truth, Justice and Reconciliation Commission with a mandate to promote peace, justice, national unity, healing, and reconciliation among the people of Kenya by *inter alia* inquiring into gross violations of human and historical injustices that occurred in Kenya from 12 December 1963 and 28 February 2008;
- (iii)THAT, the TJRC recorded over 40,000 statements and memoranda and held public hearing across the country, concluded its work and handed over the Report to H.E the President, Hon. Uhuru Kenyatta, EGH on 21st May 2013;
- (iv)THAT, according to the Truth, Justice and Reconciliation Commission Act, the Minister was to table the TJRC Report in Parliament and operationalize the implementation mechanism in accordance with the recommendations of the Commission under section 48 (2) (f) of the Act to monitor the implementation of the recommendations of the Commission and to facilitate their implementation;
- (v) THAT, according to Section 49(3) of the TJRC Act, the implementation of the report of the Commission should have commenced within six months upon its publication;

BY THE NATIONAL VICTIMS AND SURVIVORS NETWORK APPEALING TO THE NATIONAL PUBLIC PETITION ASSEMBLY OF KENYA TO DEBATE AND ADOPT THE REPORT OF THE TRUTH, JUSTICE AND RECONCILIATION COMMISSION

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- THAT, in December 2013, the National Assembly passed the Truth, Justice and Reconciliation (Amendment) Act amending the TJRC Act so as to provide inter alia that the TJRC Report would be tabled before the National Assembly 'for consideration' and (vi) that implementation of the report of the Commission shall commence immediately after consideration of the report by the National Assembly;
- (vii) THAT, to-date National Assembly has not considered the report of the TJRC, while the victims and survivors of gross human rights violations continue to suffer;
- (viii) THAT, National Assembly's inability to prioritize, debate and act on the TJRC report is a source of great frustration for thousands of Kenyans still nursing injuries; physical, emotional and psychological from the dark years of our history;
- THAT the issues in respect of which this petition is made are not pending before any court of law, or constitutional or legal body; -- Observing (ix)

HEREFORE, your humble petitioners Pray that the National Assembly –

- 1. That the National Assembly consider prioritizing for debate the Report of the Truth, Justice and Reconciliation Commission that has been pending before the House since 24th July 2013 without further delay;
- 2. That in addition to adopting the TJRC report, the National Assembly enacts necessary legislation requisite to anchor the implementation process in law;
- 3. That the National Assembly allocates sufficient budget for the immediate and effective implementation of the recommendations contained in report, in particular reparation of victims: and
- 4. That the National Assembly mandates the relevant Committee of the House to monit the comprehensive and effective implementation of the TJRC Report.

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

The Petition on alleged non-refunded cash bails by Marimanti Law Courts was presented to the National Assembly by Hon. Beatrice Nkatha Nyaga, MP and member for Tharaka Nithi County on behalf of the residents of Tharaka Nithi County.

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The Petitioner prays that the National Assembly:

- a. Commences inquiry into the unclear circumstances cash bails due to be refunded to the petitioners have not been paid long after their cases were heard and determined by the court.
- b. Intervenes to ensure that the Judiciary reimburses the petitioners the cash bail owed, together with accrued interest as computed from the date the cases were determined and disciplinary action be instituted against any officer (s) who obstructed payment of the said cash bail refunds in one way or another, have the Government provide social assistance to the family and other victims of terror attacks for the loss of livelihood, injuries and any properties.

After lengthy deliberations, the Committee recommended the following:

- a. That, the outstanding cash bails be refunded by the Judiciary in the current financial year 2015/2016 Supplementary Budget Estimates.
- b. That, the Directorate of Criminal Investigations should conclude its investigations expeditiously and take legal action against persons who may have fraudulently contributed to non-refund of cash bails by Marimanti Law Courts.
