ANNUAL REPORT OF THE EUROPEAN HOSPITAL FUND AUTHORITY

Sir,

In accordance with the provisions of section 16 (b) of the Hospital Treatment Relief (European) Act (Cap. 249), the European Hospital Fund Authority established under the Act is required to furnish as soon as possible after the expiration of each year a Report upon the administration of the affairs of the Authority during such year together with a Balance Sheet and Statement of the Receipts and Payments of the Authority, duly audited by the Government Auditor.

The Authority now has pleasure in submitting its Report for the year ended 31st December 1964 supported by Audited Accounts.

AUTHORITY

2. The Hospital Fund Authority constituted in accordance with clause 3 (2) of the Act, comprised the following Members during the

Originally appointed by the European Elected Members of Legislative Council and after Independence permitted to continue in office by your Ministry.

BENEFITS AVAILABLE

3. The Authority is empowered to make payments out of the Fund of the following allowances to contributors:—

- (i) A daily allowance of such amount and for such period as may be prescribed towards the cost of fees incurred by a contributor in respect of hospital treatment received as an in-patient, by such contributor.
- (ii) A daily allowance of such amount for such period and towards such expenses actually incurred by a contributor as may be prescribed during a disability suffered by him, in cases where hospital facilities are not utilized.
- (iii) Such sum as may be prescribed in respect of expenses actually incurred in connexion with confinement for maternity purposes of a contributor.
- 4. Benefits payable throughout the year ended 31st December 1964 were as follows:-
 - (i) Hospital Treatment Benefits-Sh. 65 per day.
 - (ii) Qualified Nursing Service-Sh. 55 per day.
 - (iii) Maternity Benefits-Sh. 200.
- 5. The following comparative summary of benefits paid and number of claims will be of interest to contributors:-

- 6. In my report for the year 1963, in paragraph 7 of that report, I stated that the Authority in consultation with the Minister for Health and Housing had agreed to introduce a scheme to cover Voluntary Contributors to the Fund. The legislation to bring this Voluntary Scheme into operation was eventually shelved by your Ministry in view of the Government's decision to bring into being a National Health Scheme on a non-racial basis. In order to help finance the starting of the National Scheme, the Authority was instructed by your Ministry to contribute a sum of £55,309 from its funds. The amount of £55,309 represents part of the Authority's accumulated reserves. The amount is considered to represent the proportion of the total of the Authority's reserve funds which were originally contributed by the Government to the Fund in accordance with para. 13 of the Hospital Treatment Relief (European) Act (Cap. 249).
- 7. In paragraph 8 of my 1963 report reference was made to a change of the name of the Fund, this change has not taken place as it formed part of the proposed legislation referred to in paragraph 6 above, which was shelved by your Ministry for reasons already mentioned.
- 8. The Authority has set aside a sum of £55,309 which sum is available for payment to your Ministry as soon as this money is called for by your Ministry.
- 9. It was with great sorrow that due to the death of Mr. K. A. Jeremy we lost the services of a hardworking and loyal member of our Authority. Mr. Jeremy had served the Authority for many years and had been Chairman for a number of years. The vacancy caused by Mr. Jeremy's untimely passing has been filled by Mr. Ian R. Leslie.
