CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

This report contains proceedings of the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock on its consideration of the Crops (Amendment) Bill (*National Assembly Bill No. 8 of 2023*) which was published on 15th March 2023. The Bill went through the First Reading on 5th July 2023 and was thereafter committed to the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock for consideration and reporting to the House pursuant to the provision of Standing Order 127(1).

The Bill has two (2) clauses and seeks to amend the First Schedule to the Crops Act No. 16 of 2013 to include *Achiote* (*Mrangi*) or *Bixa Orellana* in the list of scheduled crops.

Following placement of advertisements in the print media on Friday, 7th July 2023 seeking public and stakeholder views on the Bill pursuant to Article 118(1) (b) of the Constitution and Standing Order 127(3), the Committee did not receive any memorandum on the Bill.

In considering the Bill, the Committee established that the Cabinet Secretary for Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Co-operatives had declared *Bixa* a scheduled crop vide Gazette Notice No. 2164 dated 13th March 2020.

The Committee is grateful to the Offices of the Speaker and the Clerk of the National Assembly for the logistical and technical support accorded to it during its sittings. The Committee further wishes to thank the sponsor of the Bill, Hon. Tandaza Kassim Sawa, MP. I also wish to express my appreciation to the Honorable Members of the Committee and the Committee Secretariat who made useful contributions towards the consideration of the Bill and production of this report.

On behalf of the Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock and pursuant to provisions of Standing Order 199 (6), it is my pleasant privilege and honour to present to this House the Report of the Committee on its consideration of the Crops (Amendment) Bill (*National Assembly Bill No. 8 of 2023*).

It is my pleasure to report that the Committee has considered the Crops (Amendment) Bill (*National Assembly Bill No. 8 of 2023*) and has the honor to report back to the National Assembly with the recommendation that the Bill be **DELETED IN ITS ENTIRETY**.

1 PREFACE

1.1 ESTABLISHMENT OF THE COMMITTEE

- 1. The Departmental Committee on Agriculture and Livestock is one of the twenty Departmental Committees of the National Assembly established under **Standing Order 216** whose mandate pursuant to the **Standing Order 216** (5) is as follows:
 - *i.* To investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;
 - *ii.* To study the programme and policy objectives of Ministries and departments and the effectiveness of their implementation;
 - iii. On a quarterly basis, monitor and report on the implementation of the national budget in respect of its mandate;
 - *iv.* To study and review all the legislation referred to it;
 - v. To study, assess and analyse the relative success of the Ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
 - vi. To investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned Ministries and departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the House;
 - vii. To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 204 (Committee on appointments);
 - viii. To examine treaties, agreements and conventions;
 - ix. To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation;
 - x. To consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
 - xi. To examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.

- 2. In accordance with the Second Schedule to the Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to consider, agriculture, livestock, food production and marketing.

PART TWO

2 BACKGROUND

2.1 INTRODUCTION

- 6. *Achiote* (Spanish) or *Annatto* is native to South America and the Caribbean Tropics which now produces about 60% of the global production. The *Achiote* fruit is harvested for its seeds which are processed to extract the natural red or yellow pigment used in various industrial and food applications the world over and its demand has been rising over the last decade and is used in cooking, textile, pharmaceutical and cosmetic industries.
- 7. In food industries, *Annatto* is used to add yellow or orange color to dairy products, salad oil, meat and condiments. It is said to have medicinal properties and is used by pharmaceutical companies as a coloring agent in the manufacture of medical drugs. The dye is also used to manufacture cosmetics such as lipstick.
- 8. The United States, western Europe and Japan have emerged as the major markets for *Annatto*.

2.2 COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS

- 9. Annual world production of *Achiote* seeds is approximately 14,500 tons (dry weight) of which twothirds of the production is commercialized as dried seeds and the rest as colorant. Latin America produces 60% of the total world production, followed by Africa (27%) and Asia (12%). The main producers in Latin America are Peru, Brazil and Mexico.
- 10. Brazil produces 5000 tons, Peru 4,000 tons and Kenya 1,500 tons of *Achiote* seeds annually. However, Kenya is currently the second top exporter since Brazil consumes its produce locally, with additional importation.

PART THREE

3 OVERVIEW OF THE CROPS (AMENDMENT) BILL (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 8 OF 2023)

3.1 INTRODUCTION

- 11. Section 7 of the Crops Act No. 16 of 2013 provides that the Cabinet Secretary for Agriculture may, by notice in the Gazette, declare any other crop to be a scheduled crop. In line with this provision, the Cabinet Secretary for Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Co-operatives declared *Bixa Orellana* a Scheduled Crop under Part 3 of the First Schedule to the Crops Act vide Gazette Notice No. 2164 of 13th March 2020.
- 12. Section 8 of the Crops Act No. 16 of 2013 provides that the Agriculture and Food Authority shall institute measures for supporting scheduled crops which will ensure that the full potential of the crops is realized.

3.2 REVIEW OF THE BILL

The Bill has two (2) clauses and has the following provisions:

- 13. The principal objective of the Bill is to amend Part 3 of the First Schedule to the Crops Act No. 16 of 2013 to include *Achiote* as one of the Scheduled Crops.
- 14. Clause 1 of the Bill provides the short title of the Bill.
- 15. Clause 2 of the Bill provides for the amendment of the Crops Act No. 16 of 2013 by inserting the words *Achiote (Mrangi) (Bixa Orellana)* in Part 3 of the Third Schedule.
- 16. The Bill will affect the functions of county governments and is therefore a Bill concerning counties for purposes of the Standing Orders.
- 17. Enactment of the Bill will not occasion additional expenditure of public funds.

PART FOUR

4 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION/STAKEHOLDERS CONSULTATION

- 18. Following the call for memoranda from the public through the placement of advertisements in the print media on 7th July 2023, the Committee did not receive any memorandum from members of the public or relevant stakeholders on the Bill.
- 19. The Committee requested for the comments of the sponsor of the Bill, Hon. Tandaza Kassim Sawa, MP given that *Achiote* had been Gazetted as a Scheduled Crop by the Cabinet Secretary for Agriculture as mandated by Section 8 of the Crops Act No. 16 of 2023.

4.1 HON. TANDAZA KASSIM SAWA, MP

Hon. Tandaza was invited for a meeting with the Committee on Thursday, 26th October 2023 but was not able to attend the meeting because of an emergency in his Constituency. He however submitted comments to the Committee on the Bill stating that:

- 20. The potential of *Achiote* is underutilized because farmers suffer from lack of incentives, financial support and inadequate marketing. In light of the above challenges, the Hon. Member came up with the Bill to include *Achiote* in the list of Scheduled Crops. *Achiote* is locally known as "*mrangi*" at the Kenyan Coast and is processed by the Kenya Bixa Limited.
- 21. He noted that he was not aware that the crop had already been included in the list of Scheduled Crops by the Cabinet Secretary for Agriculture vide a Gazette Notice as mandated by Section 8 of the Crops Act No. 16 of 2020 when drafting the Bill. Given the new development, Hon. Tandaza observed that the Bill would add no value if enacted and proposed that the Committee can stop consideration of the Bill.

PART FIVE

5 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

Having considered the Bill, the Committee made the following observations on the Crops (Amendment) Bill (*National Assembly Bill No. 8 of 2023*):

- 1. The Cabinet Secretary for Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Co-operatives declared *Bixa Orellana* as a Scheduled Crop under Part 3 of the First Schedule to the Crops Act No. 16 of 2013 vide Gazette Notice No. 2164 dated 13th March 2020.
- 2. There are no regulations for *Achiote (Bixa Orellana*). In the scheduling Notice, the Cabinet Secretary gave the responsibility of developing *Bixa Orellana* and its regulations, handling, licensing and seeking export markets for the crop to the Agriculture and Food Authority (AFA).
- 3. The Crop has a great potential given that it is a replacement to synthetic colors for the growing health-consciousness in today's world.



PART SIX

6 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

The Committee having reviewed the Crops (Amendment) Bill (National Assembly Bill No. 8 of 2023) recommends that:

1. The Bill be **DELETED IN ITS ETIRETY**.

2. The Agriculture and Food Authority puts in place regulations providing for the development, handling, licensing and export of Achiote (Mrangi) within six months of adoption of this report by the National Assembly.

The chairperson requested those present in the meeting to introduce themselves before inviting Hon. Baya to brief Members on the proposed Coconut and Cashew Nut Bill, 2023. Hon. Baya informed the Committee that:

Coconuts and cashew nuts are mainly grown in the Coast Region of Kenya. Previously, the industry thrived mainly because of the government's support. This has however changed because of the disbandment of the Coconut Board of Kenya after establishment of the Agriculture and Food Authority (AFA).

A policy framework needs to be put in place to improve the value chain of the two crops from production to marketing. The Coconut and Cashew Nut Board of Kenya that has been proposed in the Bill will ensure that the value chains are put in place. It will also ensure that the crops are fully exploited in order to increase the amount of money realised from them.

Coconuts have one-hundred and twenty (120) uses while cashew nuts have twenty (20) uses yet only one or two of these are currently utilised in Kenya. If fully exploited, one coconut tree can give up to KSh. 500,000 in a year. The Coconut and Cashew Nut Bill needs to be enacted into law to give a lifeline to the people in the Coast Region.

DELIBERATIONS

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- 1. On whether the establishment of AFA was a good idea, Hon. Baya informed the Committee that establishment of AFA stifled growth and development of cash crops.
- 2. On the inclusion of macadamia in the Bill, Hon. Baya stated that macadamia is not grown in the Coast Region and does not have the same value as cashew nuts. He further stated that coconuts and cashew nuts can easily be managed by one authority because they are domiciled in the Coast Region hence his reluctance to include other nuts and oil crops in the Bill.
- 3. On why farmers have not sought for loans from AFC and Commodities Fund to improve their coconuts and cashew nuts, the meeting was informed that this was because the returns from the crops are very low and the farmers will not be able to repay the loans.

COMMITTEE RESOLUTION

The Committee resolved that they were in support of the Bill and recommended that it should be published.

MEETING WITH HON. TANDAZA KASSIM SAWA, MP TO DISCUSS THE CROPS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2023

The Committee Clerk informed the meeting that Hon. Tandaza was not able to attend the meeting due to an emergency in his Constituency. He had stated that his intention was that "*Achiote*" is included in the list of Scheduled Crops but since this had already been done by the Cabinet Secretary through a Gazette Notice, there was no point in proceeding with consideration of the Bill.

The Committee resolved that a report should be tabled in the House explaining that "Achiote" was already a Scheduled Crop.



BRIEFING ON THE CROPS (AMENDMENT) BILL (N.A. BILL NO. 8 OF 2023)

Legal Brief

The Legal Counsel, Mr. Gerald Kadede informed the meeting that the Bill was sponsored by Hon. Tandaza Kassim Sawa, MP. The Bill seeks to amend the Crops Act No. 16 of 2013 to include *Achiote (mrangi).... Bixa Orellana*, in Part 3 of the First Schedule to the Act.

He informed the Committee that the Cabinet Secretary for Agriculture, in exercise of powers conferred upon him under section 7(2) of the Crops Act, 2013 declared *Bixa (Bixa Orellana)* as a Scheduled Crop under Part 3 of the First Schedule to the Crops Act on 13th March 2020 via Gazette Notice No. 2164.

The committee resolved to invite Hon. Tandaza Kassim Sawa, MP to give his opinion on whether the Gazettement of Achiote by the Cabinet Secretary was sufficient or if the Committee should proceed with consideration of the Bill.

It was further resolved that a letter should be written to the Office of the Attorney General seeking their opinion on the matter.

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BRIEFING BY THE PARLIAMENTARY BUDGET OFFICE ON BUDGET IMPLEMENTATION FOR FY 2022/2023 FOR THE STATE DEPARTMENT FOR CROP DEVELOPMENT AND THE STATE DEPARTMENT FOR LIVESTOCK DEVELOPMENT

The Chairperson invited the Committee Secretariat to brief the meeting on the budget implementation of the two State Departments.

The Fiscal Analyst, CPA Robert Ngetich briefed the Committee on the approved budget for FY 2022/23, the actual expenditure and absorption of the budget, pending bills and performance of development projects in the two State Departments. The following issues arose from the briefing:

- 1. The budget performance for various SAGAs under the State Departments was not provided. The SAGAs need to provide a detailed breakdown of the 2022/23 budget performance including: Financial performance i.e. A-i-A, recurrent and development budget and non-financial performance including performance of KPIs and targets.
- 2. The State Department for Livestock Development needs to provide explanations on the following over expenditures:
 - a. The Bee Health Project: Vector Regulatory and Zoological Services to the tune of 201% from an approved allocation of KSh. 8.2 million to an actual expenditure of KSh. 16.6 million, an over expenditure of KSh. 8.3 million; and
 - b. The Bee Bulking Project: Apiculture and Emerging Livestock Services with an over expenditure of KSh. 408,648 from an approved budget of KSh. 17 million to an expenditure of KSh. 17.4 million.

State Department for Crop Development

- 3. There is a difference in the approved recurrent budget as reported by the State Department from what is provided in the budget books. The State Department reported a figure of KSh. 14,027,154,283 while the budget books had a figure of KSh. 14,189,135,038 giving a difference of KSh. 161,980,755.
- 4. Recurrent Over Expenditure: The State Department had a recurrent over expenditure of KSh. 1,257 million when compared to the approved allocation of KSh. 14,189 million and the actual expenditure of KSh. 15,447 million an over expenditure of 109% of the approved budget. The State Department had an over expenditure on:
 - a. Use of Goods and Services by spending KSh. 193 million against a budget of KSh. 160 million: and

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- b. Acquisition Of Non-Financial Assets by spending KSh. 527 million against an approved budget of KSh. 5.9 million, an over expenditure of 9006% of the approved budget.
- 5. The State Department had an over-expenditure of KSh. 3,347 million (58%) on the Agricultural Research & Development programme following an expenditure of KSh. 9,092 million against an approved budget of KSh. 5,745 million.
- 6. Implementation of the Food Security and Crop Diversification Project: The project utilized 96.5% of the allocation (KSh. 255 out of KSh. 265 million) but achieved less than 50% in targets.
- 7. Provision of Non-Financial Performance: a number of performances of KPIs and targets were missing i.e. the performance on Fertilizer subsidy, Cotton Revitalization, and Sugar Reforms among others.
- 8. During the FY 2022/23 there was an allocation for provision of fertilizer subsidy for tea farmers. The performance and KPIs were not provided.
- 9. Farmers Database Establishment Project had been allocated KSh. 100 million in the FY 2022/23 but the performance and KPIs were not provided.

The Committee resolved to have a retreat with the State Department on Crops and the State Department on Livestock from 19th to 22nd October 2023 for the State Departments to clarify the above issues.
