1.0 INTRODUCTION

Mr. Speaker Sir, on behalf of the Members of the Departmental Committee No. F on Finance, Trade Tourism & Planning and pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 162, I would like to take this opportunity to present to the House, the Committee's Report on the Privatization Bill, 2005.

The functions of this Departmental Committee as established under Standing Order No. 151 are <u>interalia:</u>

- (i) to study and review all legislation after First Reading subject to the exemptions under Standing Order No. 101 A (4)
- (ii) to make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible including recommendations of proposed legislation.

The Privatization Bill, 2005 was referred to the Departmental Committee on Finance, Planning and Trade upon a motion moved by the Minister for Finance pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 101(1). The Committee held a one day workshop for all Members of Parliament in Mombasa to deliberate on both the Public Procurement & Disposal Bill, 2005 and the Privatization Bill, 2005.

3.0 PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE BILL

CLAUSE 5 - Composition of Commission

THAT, Clause 5 be amended as follows:-

- (i) In subsection (d) by:-
 - (a) Deleting the word "four" and substituting the word "seven" in place therefor.
 - (b) Inserting the following words after the word "Minister"

"approved by the relevant committee of Parliament"

(ii) By deleting **subsection** (e) and renumbering accordingly.

CLAUSE 6 - Term of office

THAT, Clause 6 be amended by adding the following words at the end.

"for one more term"

CLAUSE 8 - Removal

THAT, Clause 8(2)(c) be amended by inserting the word "criminal" before the word "offence" and by deleting the rest of the sentence to the end from the word "and".

<u>CLAUSE 23</u> - <u>Privatization proposal by Commission</u> THAT, Clause 23 be amended by

deleting subsection (2) and inserting the

following new subsection.

23(2) – The Minister in charge of Finance shall present a report on the privatization proposals approved by the Cabinet to the relevant committee of Parliament.

CLAUSE 29 - Eligible investors in privatization

THAT, Clause 29 be amended by inserting the following new subsection

- 29(2) immediately after subsection 29(1) and renumbering accordingly.
- 29(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), the Minister may direct the Commission to: -
- (a) limit participation in the privatization to Kenyans.
- (b) ensure that there is a specified minimum level of participation in the privatization by Kenyans.

CLAUSE 44 - Establishment and composition of Tribunal

THAT, Clause 44(7)(b) be amended by inserting the word "criminal" before the word "offence" and by deleting the rest of the sentence to the end from the word "and".

FIRST SCHEDULE

THAT, the First Schedule be amended in **subsection 2(3)** by deleting the word "two-thirds" and inserting the word "eight" in place therefor.

4.0 CONCLUSION

The Committee recommends that the House adopts its Report on the Privatization, 2005. Mr. Speaker Sir, may I take this opportunity to thank all Members and the Committee for their input and valuable contributions during the deliberations on the Bill.
