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1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment of the Committee

- 1. The Departmental Committee on Blue Economy, Water and Irrigation is one of the twenty Departmental Committees of the National Assembly established under **Standing Order 216** whose mandates pursuant to the **Standing Order 216** (5) are as follows:
 - i. To investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;
 - ii. To study the programme and policy objectives of ministries and departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
 - iii. On a quarterly basis, monitor and report on the implementation of the national budget in respect of its mandate;
 - iv. To study and review all legislation referred to it;
 - v. To study, assess and analyze the relative success of the ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
 - vi. To investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned ministries and departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the House;
 - vii. To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 204 (Committee on Appointments);
 - viii. To examine treaties, agreements and conventions;
 - ix. To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation;
 - x. To consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
 - xi. To examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.

1.2 Subject of the Committee

- 2. In accordance with the Second Schedule of the Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to consider matters of: use and regulation of water resources, irrigation, fisheries development including promotion of aquaculture, fish farming, marine fisheries, the sustainable use of ocean resources for economic growth and improved livelihoods, except seaports and marine transport.
- 3. In executing its mandate, the Committee oversees the following government ministries and departments and agencies (MDAs), namely:
 - i. The State Department for Water and Sanitation
 - ii. The State Department for Irrigation
 - iii. The State Department for Blue Economy and Fisheries

1.5 CHAIRPERSON'S FORWARD

- 6. The Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill (National Assembly Bills No. 67 of 2023) was read a first time on 15th November, 2023 and was subsequently committed to various Departmental Committees for consideration and facilitation of public participation pursuant to Standing Order 127. The Bill proposes amendments to various pieces of legislation including those relating to the Fisheries Management and Development Act, 2016 which was committed to the Departmental Committee on Blue Economy, Water and Irrigation.
- 7. The Clerk of the National Assembly placed adverts in the print media on 18th November 2023 seeking for comments from the public on the Bill pursuant to Article 118 (1) (b) of the Constitution and the Standing Order 127 (3) of the National Assembly.
- 8. The Committee received comments from the State Department for Blue Economy and Fisheries on the proposed amendments to the Fisheries Management and Development Act,2016 (No. 35 of 2016)
- The Committee is grateful to the Offices of the Speaker and the Clerk of the National Assembly for the logistical and technical support accorded to it during the consideration of the Bill.
- 10. On behalf of the Departmental Committee on Blue Economy, Water and Irrigation and pursuant to provisions of Standing Order 199 (6) of the National Assembly, it is my pleasant privilege and honour to submit this report of the Committee on its consideration of the Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill (National Assembly Bills No. 67 of 2023)

PART II

2.0 INTRODUCTION

11. The Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill, 2022 (National Assembly Bills No. 67 of 2023) sponsored by the Leader of the Majority Party was published on 30th October 2022 and Read a First Time on 15th November, 203. The Bill which seeks to make various amendments to various statutes while keeping with the practice of making various amendments which do not merit the publication of separate Bills into one Bill. The Fisheries Management and Development Act, 2016 (No. 35 of 2016) is amongst legislations being proposed for amendments.

2.1 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

- 12. In accordance with Article 118(1)(b) of the Constitution and the Standing Order 127 (3) of the National Assembly that provides that Parliament shall facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative and other business of Parliament and its committees, an advertisement was published inviting for public participation and submission of memoranda by 30th November, 2023. The Committee received comments from the State Department for Blue Economy and Fisheries.
- 13. The State Department for Blue Economy and Fisheries were in support of the proposed amendments to the Fisheries Management and Development Act, No 35 of 2016.
- 14. The Committee extensively considered the contents of the submission on the Bill and the details of the deliberations and the Committee's observations and resolutions as relates to specific section is captured in this report.

PART III

- 3.0 CONSIDERATION OF THE STATUTE LAW (MISCELLANEOUS AMENDMENTS) NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 67 OF 2023
- 15. The Committee considered the proposed amendments to the Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendments) National Assembly Bill No. 67 of 2023 on the Fisheries Management and Development Act No. 35 of 2016 as follows:
- 16. Amend section 6 (1)

By deleting paragraph (a) and substitute therefor the following new paragraph—

(a) the Cabinet Secretary responsible for matters relating to fisheries, who shall be the chairperson

Committee Observation

The proposal seeks to provide that the Chairperson of the Council shall be the Cabinet Secretary (CS) responsible for fisheries.

Committee Recommendation

Agreed to proposed amendment

17. **Amend section 6 (3)** that provides that the chairperson of the Council shall be appointed by the President from persons nominated under clause (6) (2) not being a Cabinet Secretary, upon recommendation by the Cabinet Secretary responsible for fisheries.

By deleting 6 (3)

Committee Observations

The proposal seeks to provide that the Chairperson of the Council shall be the Cabinet Secretary (CS) responsible for fisheries.

Committee Recommendation

Agreed to proposed amendment

PART IV

4.0 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

- 18. Having considered the Bill the Committee made the following observations:
 - i. The Fisheries Management and Development Act, 2016 establishes the Kenya Fisheries Advisory Council whose main function is to review and advise the national Government on policies in relation to the co-ordination of fisheries management.
 - ii. The Fisheries Management and Development Act, 2016 currently provides that the chairperson of the Council shall be appointed by the President from persons nominated under section (6)(2) not being a Cabinet Secretary, upon recommendation by the Cabinet Secretary responsible for fisheries.
- iii. In this regard, the Chairperson may be appointed from amongst the representative from a university or research institution with expertise in fisheries nominated by the University council; representative from the consumer federation nominated by the national consumer federation; the designate from the Council of Governors with expertise in fisheries who shall be nominated by the Council of governors; or the representative of fisheries nominated by a national umbrella of body fisheries.
- iv. The current provision on appointment of the Chairperson poses a governance challenge noting that the Council is mainly composed of Cabinet Secretaries.
- v. The Bill consequently seeks to provide that Cabinet Secretary responsible for matters relating to fisheries shall be the Chairperson of the Council.

PART V

5.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

Having considered the Bill the Committee recommends that the House **approves** the Second reading of the proposed amendments to the Fisheries Management and Development Act, 2016 as contained in Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendments) Bill (National Assembly Bills No. 67 of 2023).
