1. POLICY BACKGROUND

The Partnerships Act, No. 16 of 2012, an Act of Parliament to provide for Partnerships and related purposes was assented to on 15th June, 2012 and was commenced by notice on the Gazette. Section 1 of the Act provides that the Act shall come into operation on such a date as the Minister, by Notice in the Gazette, appoints. The commencement of the Act was delayed pending preparation of the Regulations which would dictate how the provisions of the Act are to be applied including the Forms and Fees for effective implementation of the Act.



EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO THE PARTNERSHIPS (LIMITED PARTNERSHIPS) REGULATIONS, 2021

1.LEGISLATIVE CONTEXT

The Partnerships Act, 2012 empowers the Attorney General to make Regulations necessary or convenient for carrying out or giving effect to the Act. The Partnerships (Limited Partnerships) Regulations, 2021 are therefore issued to give effect to the Act.

2.THE PURPOSE OF THE PARTNERSHIPS (LIMITED PARTNERSHIPS) REGULATIONS, 2021

The purpose of these Regulations is to provide for the proper conduct of the business in the registration of Limited Partnerships as well as prescribe fees and forms for effective implementation of the Act.

Limited partnership is required to have both general partners and limited partners. General partners have unlimited liability and have full management control of the partnership. Limited partners on the other hand are not engaged in management of the partnership and their liability is limited to the extent of their contribution in the Limited Partnership.

Partnerships registered under the Partnerships Act are usually a type of limited partnership and are used as investment vehicle for establishing private equity funds. The Partnerships Act, 2012 is therefore an instrumental reform that provides for the formation of this entity type.

The Act provides for public participation in compliance with the provisions of the Act. Comments from various stakeholders by

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writing to them directly and by advertisement in MyGov issue No. 7/2020/2021 dated 18th August, 2020. Adhering to COVID 19 protocols, the Service undertook virtual workshops in the bid to obtain stakeholder comments.

The Attorney General in developing the Regulations has received input from the Director General, BRS and the Registrar of Companies who is charged with the mandate to implement the Partnerships Act. The other key stakeholders are the Board of Directors BRS, Public Sector Agencies, a Private Sector Institutions, Strategic Donor, General Public, Media and Professional Bodies. Of the above the Institute of Certified Public Secretaries of Kenya, Kenya Law Reform Commission, Strategic Donors, Law Society of Kenya, Micro and Small Enterprise Authority (MSEA) gave their invaluable input on the same.

Lastly the Office through the www.brs.go.ke published the Regulations for comments by the users of the Companies' Registry.

4.Guidance

The Business Registration Service will sensitize its officers for adherence to the objectives of accountability and efficiency in the management of the Registry. The Service will also continuously engage the Law Society of Kenya and the company secretaries as well as key stakeholders whose participation and cooperation remains instrumental in ensuring compliance on the company's side and in the successful implementation of the key aspects of the Partnerships Act and the Regulations.

5.Review of the Regulations

The Director General shall monitor the application of the Partnerships (Limited Partnerships) Regulations, 2021. This will be done through the reports prepared at regular intervals. In addition, the implementers of the Regulations will carry out regular

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monitoring and evaluation of the specific provisions of these Regulations with the aim of initiating any legislative amendments as may be necessary on an annual basis.

- (c) acquire, hold and dispose of movable and immovable property in accordance with the Laws of Kenya.

4. The Organisation shall have the privileges and immunities specified in Part I of the Fourth Schedule to the Act:

Provided that—

- (a) immunity from legal processes shall not apply in the case of commercial disputes, labour disputes or where immunity has been waived by the Fund;
- (b) tax exemption shall not extend to the owner or lessor of any movable or immovable property rented by the Fund; and
- (c) tax exemption shall not extend to the charges for public utility services, business and investment income, and indirect taxes which constitute part of the cost of goods purchased or services rendered.

5. Any person who is an official of the Organisation shall, while sojourning to, through and from Kenya and performing duties in the service of the Fund, have the privileges and immunities specified in paragraphs 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 of Part III of the Fourth Schedule to the Act:

Provided that the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to citizens of Kenya or to any person who is ordinarily resident in Kenya except solely for the purpose of being an employee of, and working exclusively for, the Organisation.

- (b) institute and defend legal proceedings; and
- (c) acquire, hold and dispose of movable and immovable property in accordance with the Laws of Kenya.

4. The Fund shall have the privileges and immunities specified in Part I of the Fourth Schedule to the Act:

Provided that—

- (a) immunity from legal processes shall not apply in the case of commercial disputes, labour disputes or where immunity has been waived by the Fund;
- (b) tax exemption shall not extend to the owner or lessor of any movable or immovable property rented by the Fund; and
- (c) tax exemption shall not extend to the charges for public utility services, business and investment income, and indirect taxes which constitute part of the cost of goods purchased or services rendered.

5. Any person who is an official of the Fund shall, while sojourning to, through and from Kenya and performing duties in the service of the Fund, have the privileges and immunities specified in paragraphs 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 of Part III of the Fourth Schedule to the Act:

Provided that the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to citizens of Kenya or to any person who is ordinarily resident in Kenya except solely for the purpose of being an employee of, and working exclusively for, the Fund.

- (c) acquire, hold or dispose of movable and immovable property in accordance with the laws of the Republic of Kenya.

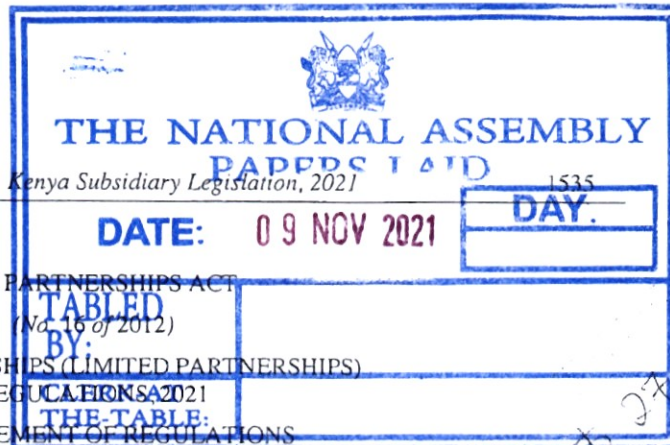
