



- 3. THAT, the Ministry of Lands and Physical Planning does secure the title relating to LR.No.23393 with a view of ensuring that innocent Kenyans do not lose money through fraudulent transactions as evidenced by the attempt to amalgamate it with LR. No5875/2;
- 4. THAT, Mr. Speaker the petitioners efforts and pursuit to have the government agencies and departments directed to implement these recommendations have not born any fruit;
- 5. THAT, my interventions accompanied by other constituency leaders and all the Nairobi Members of Parliament to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Lands and to the Attorney General have been ignored;
- 6. THAT, in particular the office of the Attorney General disputes the validity of the Parliamentary Committee Report claiming that the same has not been adopted by Parliament even after being supplied with a copy;
- 7. THAT, Mr. Speaker the time window given by the report within which the recommendations should be implemented lapsed on 5th June 2020;
- 8. THAT, in those circumstances I am requesting your permission that a motion be authored to adopt the Report by a Resolution of the House and any other relief that Mr. Speaker in your wisdom will compel the Government Agencies to obey and implement the recommendations of the Departmental Committee of Lands.
