- I, JUSTUS KARIUKI MATE of Post Office Box 102106 00101 JAMIA in the Republic of Kenya do hereby make oath and state as follows;
- 1. THAT I am an adult of sound mind and the Speaker of Embu County Assembly therefore competent to swear this affidavit.
- 2. THAT I am fundamentally and adversely affected by Legal Notice No... of 2013 as follows:-
 - (i) The Gazette Notice undermines the County Representatives, Members of the national Assembly, Senators, Women Representatives and Governors to execute their mandate effectively and competently.
 - (ii) The offices of Speakers, County Representatives, Speakers, Senators, Women Representatives, Member of the National Assembly and Governors are too demanding and they require reasonable remuneration commensurate to their duties and responsibilities which are taxing in nature.
 - (iii) The Gazette Notice No VOL.CXV-NO. 33 of 2013 offends the principles and values of article 230 as read with article 1 and 94 of the Constitution as shown by the exhibit herein attached and marked "JKM 1".
- 3. THAT the actions of the 1st Respondent exceed its mandate accorded to them by article 230 of the Constitution.
- 4. THAT the 1st Respondent should have published the Notice after presenting the proposals to the National Assembly to facilitate harmonization with other existing laws. Further, the commission ought to have published the statutory instrument before the Elected Leaders ventured into these elective positions in the first place.
- 5. THAT the purported rationalization of Salaries for State Officers is unreasonable in a democratic society and cannot be justified taking all the circumstances into account.
- 6. THAT the Gazette Notice No VOL.CXV-NO. 33 of 2013 offends clause 32 of the Sixth Schedule to the Constitution which protects Pension Funds for Elected Leaders.
- 7. THAT the Honourable Court needs to intervene to adjudicate whether the Salaries and Remuneration Commission can purport to alter the Provisions of a Parliamentary Statute without recourse to Parliament.
- 8. THAT I am informed by my Advocates on record which information I verily believe to be true that, the 1st Respondent's actions are null and invalid as they offend article 94, 2(4), 127 of the Constitution.
- 9. THAT I am aware that the Primary duty of the first Respondent under articles 10, 230, 249 (1) (2) of the Constitution is to observe democratic values and principles and promote constitutionalism.
- 10. THAT I am aware that article 250 (8) of the Constitution protects remuneration of constitutional Commissions including the Parliamentary Service Commission under article 248(2) (d) of the Constitution and there was no justification to breach this provision.
- 11. THAT I swear this affidavit in support of the Chamber Summons herein.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by Article 230 (4) (a), the Salaries and Remuneration Commission has set the remuneration and benefits of State Officers in the Executive as follows:

- (i) Accommodation and Subsistence Allowance: Retain the existing rates pending review by the Salaries and Remuneration Commission.
- (ii) Airtime: Retain the existing rates pending review by the Salaries and Remuneration Commission.
- (iii) Security: To be provided as advised by the Inspector-General. National Police Service.
- (iv) Official car: Chauffer driven official car; or as reviewed by the Salaries and Remuneration Commission.
- (v) Medical Scheme: The medical cover shall be provided per family for self, spouse and up to four children below twenty five years fully dependent on the State Officer as follows:

Inpatient KSh. 10 million
Outpatient KSh. 300.000
Maternity KSh. 150.000
Dental KSh. 75.000
Optical KSh. 75.000

The State Officers in the Defence Forces shall retain the existing medical scheme arrangement.

(vi) Retirement Benefits.—A State Officer serving on Permanent and Pensionable terms shall join a contributory pension scheme and contribute at the rate of 7.5% of basic salary with the employer's contribution at the rate of 15% of basic salary.

A State Officer serving on fixed term shall serve on contract and be paid a service gratuity at the end of the term at the rate of 31% of annual basic pay for every year served.

(vii) Group Life Assurance. - Officers shall be covered for a value equivalent to three times annual basic salary.

(viii) Work Injury Benefit (WIBA). - Work Injury Benefits Act shall apply where applicable.

- (ix) Group Personal Accident.—State Officers serving in the Executive shall be covered for a value equivalent to up to three times annual basic salary where applicable.
- (x) Home. Utilities and Attendants.—The President and Deputy President shall be housed by the State and provided with all commensurate home utilities and attendants, subject to review by the Salaries and Remuneration Commission from time to time.

- 2 The 1st Respondent is a Constitutional Body established under Article 248 (2) (h) as read with article 249 and 250 of the Constitution
- 3 The 2nd Respondent is Chief and Principal legal Adviser of the Republic of Kenya and is sued in his representative capacity as the protector and promoter of the Rule of law and Public Interest as contemplated by article 156 of the Constitution
- 4 The Petitioner avers that the 1st Respondent has breached the Constitution and the law by purporting to vary, amend and/or change a legislative framework enacted by Parliament within the meaning of article 94 of the Constitution
- The Petitioner avers that Parliament acting under article 94 of the Constitution enacted the National Assembly Remuneration Act, the Pensions Act The Appropriation Act which have defined the various remunerations for various state officers. The Appropriation Act contains the salaries of all officers.
- 6 The Petitioner avers that the 1st Respondent have breached the law and the Constitution by purporting to amend, vary and/or repeal sections of the -
 - (1) Article 230 clause 5 (a), (b), (c), and (d) of the constitution as read with article 1, 94 of the constitution
 - (11) The Petitioner contends that the mandate donated to the 1ST Respondent by article 230 (4) (a) of the Constitution is not absolute as it is expected to be an objective review done in good faith
 - (iii) The Petitioner avers that in execution of their mandate, the First Respondent totally disregarded the principles and values under article 230 (5) of the constitution to the prejudice of the petitioner
 - (iv) National Assembly Remuneration Act particularly sections 2, 3, 4 as read with the First Shedule and second schedule and as amended in 2012
 - (v) The Parliamentary Pensions Act (Chapter 196) Laws of Kenya sections 2, 3, 4, and 5

- 8. The Gazette Notice has far reaching implications of the performance of the state officers.
- 9. The actions of the 1st Respondent are in breach of article 1, 2, 10, 230 of the Constitution.
- 10. The Respondents have breached the rights of the Petitioner by purporting to amend, vary, change and/or repeal the basic values and principles of THE VARIOUS Acts of Parliament and by extension the Constitution.
- 11. The 1st Respondent violated the rights of the Petitioners under article 1, 2, 10,, 27, 40, 43, 47, 94, 127 and 230 of the constitution by carrying out a process that was discriminatory nature.
- 12. The actions of the 1st Respondent are in breach of the express provisions of the Constitution to wit Article 1, 2, 10, 94, 127 and 230 of the Constitution and clause 32 of the 5th Schedule.
- 13. The rights that have been denied, violated, infringed and/or threatened by the 1st Respondent are so fundamental that they cannot be taken away.
