INTRODUCTION TO THE DEVELOPMENT ESTIMATES (SECTION I)

- 1. In 1955/56 the Development Estimates envisaged expenditure of £7,854,509, but—as indicated in Sessional Paper No. 97 of 1955—it was later calculated that the Estimates included some £870,000 more building work than there was the capacity to execute. Actual expenditure in 1955/56 is not now expected to exceed £6.95 million.
- 2. In preparing the 1956/57 Estimates, regard has been had both to the finance available and to building capacity, and the estimated expenditure exceeds the funds which are likely to be available by only £44,308. Similarly, the building projects which are included in the Estimates total a reasonable target figure which is likely to be approached, although not fully achieved. In order to bring expenditure within the finance available, it has been necessary to make savings on the approved plan value of some £2.4 million. The biggest saving is £750,000 out of the allocation to the Local Government Loans Authority. This arises because it is not now expected that the Nairobi City Council will have to draw on the Local Loans Authority for capital during this planning period.
- 3. The other savings arise mainly because of the limitation of building capacity. But even if there had been the capacity to carry out all the building work remaining in the plan in 1956/57, the necessary finance would not have been available. In the main, these savings must be regarded as expenditure which has had to be postponed until the next planning period, and they include the following:—

- 4. It will also not be possible to complete the programme for Nairobi Airport during 1956/57, and there should be a balance of £130,000 of expenditure to be met on this account in 1957/58. There will be savings of £135,000 in Public Works Department General Works Staff, mainly owing to the large number of vacancies in the establishment. The Central Stores and Transport Organization buildings cannot be completed before the end of the period, and there will be a balance of some £86,000 left for expenditure in 1957/58.
- 5. Certain urgent projects have been included in the plan since Sessional Paper No. 97 of 1955 was laid. This paper gave a revision of allocations up to the end of September, 1955. The largest new item is £150,000 for loans under the Agriculture Ordinance, and it was envisaged in paragraph 184 of Sessional Paper No. 55 of 1955 that further funds would be needed under this head. It has been necessary to provide a further £110,000 for Township Water Supplies and £63,500 for Rural Water Supplies, including provision for the greater part of the Kinangop Ring Main project. A further £91,250 has been included for the Industrial Development Corporation to enable the Corporation to meet certain guarantees and also to make possible a loan of £50,000 for the Malindi Electricity project. £51,826 has been provided for irrigation schemes in African areas and £14,620 for an aerodrome at Malindi. A further sum of £18,400 has had to be provided for the Plant Breeding Service and £74,700 for the new Meat Canning Factory at Athi River. An additional £20,000 has been allocated for National Parks and Tourism. It will be observed that the majority of these new allocations relate to projects of immediate economic importance.
- 6. Although the 1956/57 Estimates provide for expenditure of £7,064,830 as against £7,854,509 in 1955/56, actual expenditure is likely to exceed the 1955/56 figure. Total expenditure over the 3½-year period 1st January, 1954 to 30th June, 1957, is expected to average some £6·2 million a year, which compares with the average expenditure of only £3·7 million during the previous 8-year period 1946/1953. The main limitation on Development Expenditure is now finance rather than the capacity for spending.
- 7. The provision of the necessary funds to complete the 1956/57 programme depends upon the success of the Government in raising the balance of the amount shown under the loan programme—namely, £4,278,150. In addition to this sum, it will be necessary to raise some £2·15 million for the Mombasa Water Supply (Major Project).
- 8. The form of the Estimates has been simplified by a reduction in the number of columns in the expenditure estimates, and the tables have also been re-arranged and clarified. Ambits have been included for expenditure votes to improve financial control. Token provision has been made for the Nairobi African Housing Project, which has to be carried out by Government with funds provided by the Nairobi City Council. It was thought appropriate to include this expenditure in the Estimates, with a corresponding appropriation-in-aid, in order to assist in the proper control of the expenditure.

NOTES ON ALDEV LOANS (VOTE D.7-ITEM 3)

1. Loans for Cash Crop Development-£4,000

This item provides for loans to companies or associations of Africans for the development of cash crops such as sugar and pineapples.

2. Loans to Co-operative Societies-£12,000

This provides for loans to Co-operative Societies concerned with agricultural development, e.g. to Coffee Co-operatives for the construction of factories.

3. Loans to Individual Farmers—£30,200

The present vote had to be increased in order to meet the increasing demands for this type of loan. A further increase is expected in 1956/57 owing to the acceleration of land consolidation and farm planning.

4. LOANS FOR INDIVIDUAL WATER SUPPLIES-£16,850

With the development of individual holdings and farm planning, water supplies are being provided for the African farmer at the expense of the farmer himself. Several districts are setting up Joint Water Supplies Boards financed from revolving funds which are composed half by loan from the A.D.C., one-quarter by loan from Government, and one-quarter by grant from Government.

5. Loans for Large Dam Construction-£10,666

This sum represents the one-third loan element in the Large Dam Construction Programme under the Swynnerton Plan. Funds for the Grant element are being voted through Section II of the Development Estimates.

6. Loans for Boreholes, Small Dams, Weirs, etc.-£20,475

This represents the half Loan element under the programme in the Swynnerton Plan. Funds for the Grant element are being voted through Section II of the Development Estimates.

8. Loans for Settlement, Ranching and Tsetse Reclamation—£113,881

This item covers Loan elements for the following schemes, included in the Settlement, Ranching and Tsetse Reclamation section of the Swynnerton Plan, for which Grant elements are provided under Section II of the Development Estimates.

Section II: Intensified Development of African Agriculture

GENERAL MEMORANDUM NOTE (SECTION II)

- 1. The Form of the Estimate has been slightly recast:-
- (1) To show how provision has been made for Schemes which are being assisted by the United States of America under their International Co-operation Administration programme for aid to under-developed territories.
- (2) To allow accounting procedure to follow services. Under the original and first revised versions of Table D of the Swynnerton Plan, Agricultural Department expenditure appeared under four of the five major heads, which resulted in eleven subdivisions under which accounting had to be carried out, with resulting lack of flexibility in use of both staff and money. Table D has now been further revised so as to group within one main head all Agricultural Department Expenditure; this latest revision of Table D, which has been approved by the Secretary of State, appears at Appendix I. There are consequent alterations of block totals though the overall total estimate is still £6,745,133. As a result it has been possible to simplify and compress Appendix B relating to the Agricultural Department so as to include in one item only all proposed expenditure by that Department (exclusive of I.C.A. schemes), and similar simplification of Appendix D relating to the Veterinary Department has also been effected.
- (3) To make provision under a separate Vote—S.7—for the expenditure relating to the Forest and Game portions of the plan, previously shown under Vote S.1–5. The Secretary for Forest Development, Game and Fisheries will be the Accounting Officer.
- (4) To accommodate in Vote S.6 certain expenditure of an Emergency nature, which is offset by an Appropriation-in-Aid from the Emergency Fund. It will be noted that the Accounting Officer for Vote S.6-1 is the Director of Surveys, whilst the Accounting Officer for Vote S.6-2, which relates to Provincial Administration Staff is the Secretary for African Affairs.
- 2. Delays in recruitment and construction of buildings continued to affect the rate of expenditure by most departments during the first half of the year, but the position has improved considerably. Only a small proportion of the additional staff required still remains to be recruited, while the rate of building is continuing satisfactorily. Present indications are that expenditure in 1955–56 will amount to approximately £1,575,000 representing under-expenditure of only £173,435 out of the total estimate of £1,748,435. These figures take no account of any reimbursement which may be forthcoming from funds provided by the International Co-operation Administration.
- 3. In the General Memorandum Note on page 69 of the 1955-56 Estimates it was estimated that expenditure in the 15-month period April, 1954 to June, 1955 (originally estimated at £1,285,438) would amount to some £700,000 only. However, subject to the approval of the Secretary of State, certain items of expenditure by the Veterinary Department, notably on the African Livestock Marketing Organization, on additional Livestock Officers for Stock Control projects, and on Tsetse Survey and Control, formerly financed from the African Land Development block allocation of Development Funds, are being charged to the Main Head D, Semi-Arid Pastoral Areas, bringing expenditure for Swynnerton Plan Funds in 1954-55 to a total of £1,248,962 representing under-expenditure of only £36,376.
- 4. The total plan value of the Swynnerton Plan (excluding loans, to be found from ALDEV funds) amounts to £6\frac{3}{4} millions over five years giving a figure of average expenditure of £1,350,000 per year. On present estimates of 1955-56 expenditure the first 2\frac{1}{4} years of the plan have cost £1,222,000 per annum. The grant of £5 millions by the U.K. Government was made on the basis of an estimated expenditure of £1 million per year, but last year the Secretary of State approved estimates totalling £1,748,435, on the grounds of probable large under-expenditure in 1954-55 (which did not in fact materialize) and of probable reductions in future years' estimates. It has not, however, been found possible to reduce the estimates for 1956-57 below the figure of £1,350,000 without considerably slowing down the tempo of agricultural development in African areas. The Secretary of State and the Legislative Council are therefore being asked to approve of estimates for 1956-57 at this figure. It should be noted that, although there are, at present, no funds available to meet the shortfall of £1,745,133 between the total plan value of £6,745,133 and the £5 millions grant from the U.K. Government, it is hoped that this gap might be closed to the extent of some £798,720 by funds provided by the International Co-operation Administration.
- 5. Owing to circumstances, largely connected with the Emergency, it has been possible to proceed with certain sections of the Plan more quickly than was anticipated, with a resultant decrease in scheme value balances. It is therefore proposed to carry out a detailed review of the Plan, the funds available for its implementation, and expenditure to date, and to consider what readjustments to the Plan may be desirable in the light of changed circumstances.
- 6. Accounts will be kept in detail in accordance with the appendices. Power to reallocate between Votes and Main Sub-heads and between Recurrent and Non-Recurrent expenditure items will be retained by the Treasury, whilst reallocations between items within such divisions may be effected by written instructions from the Accounting Officer.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDA

Vote S.1.—African Land Development

- Item 1.—Paragraphs 68 and 69 of the Plan. A token figure only is included, since expenditure, as in 1955/56, is expected to be made from the funds provided for African Land Development (See Vote D.7 of Section I).
- Item 2.—Paragraph 79. The increase over the 1956/57 provision is due to the fact that schemes in the Rift Valley Province and Southern Province are now fully under way. The details are given in Appendix A.
- Item 3.—Paragraph 80. Expenditure under this sub-head is continuing at the same rate as in 1955/56, but half the proposed expenditure is devoted to Teita Stream Control, where water in the Teita Hills is being developed for a number of small irrigation schemes in the fertile highlands instead of allowing it to run to waste in the plains of the semi-desert. The details are given in Appendix A.
- Item 4.—Paragraphs 82–85. This sum is to cover the completion of investigations in Nyanza Province, and the continuation of the scheme at Ishiara in Embu.
- Item 5.—Paragraphs 88-93. Details of proposed expenditure are given in Appendix A. The Scheme value has been reduced by £193,720 from £2,184,770 as a result of transference of that portion relating to the Agricultural Department to its appropriate place in main-head A (Vote S.2) "Lands of High Potential: Agricultural Department." Certain expenditure relative to the Forest and Game Departments has been transferred to the new Vote S.7, where it will be under the control of the Secretary of Forest Development, Game and Fisheries.
- Item 6.—Paragraphs 88–93 and Table D. A revised estimate of expenditure has been given in Column 5 so that the whole of the remaining unspent balance may be utilized in 1956/57.

INTENSIFIED DEVELOPMENT OF AFRICAN AGRICULTURE

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDA

Vote S.2.—Agriculture Department

General

In previous years many difficulties in accounting, and lack of flexibility in use of staff and money, resulted from the fact that funds available to the Agriculture Department were distributed between the four main heads, A, B, C and D of Table "D". This has been revised (Appendix I), with the Secretary of State's agreement, and all the schemes operated by the Department are now grouped under one head. Consequently the accounting system can follow the services provided, and the eleven subdivisions of 1955/56 have been reduced to six, three-quarters of the total estimate being concentrated in item (1). The other five items have been created to enable schemes aided by the International Co-operation Administration of the United States of America to be accounted for separately. A detailed breakdown of expenditure is given in Appendix B.

Item 1.—Lands of High Potential—Agriculture Department (Non-I.C.A.)

Paragraphs 10–12, 16–51, 86, 87, 94–100 of the Plan. This item of Vote S.2 provides for expenditure on all schemes in Head A of the Revised Table "D" (Appendix I) operated by the Department of Agriculture with the exception of those aided by the International Co-operation Administration. The total scheme value has been reduced to give sub-allocations to the latter schemes.

Increases in establishment are within the planned expansion of staff, and are in accordance with Table "E" at page 65 of the Swynnerton Plan.

Items 2 and 3.—Soils and Hydrological Survey and Irrigation Stations (I.C.A.)

Paragraph 96. These two items cover expenditure on the two I.C.A.-aided schemes for the establishment of Irrigation Investigation and Training Stations on the Kano Plains in Nyanza Province and the Mwea flats in Central Province. The scheme values shown for each of these schemes, as for all other first round I.C.A. schemes, is the full estimated cost of the scheme set out in the I.C.A. application, including the cost to Kenya of employing U.S. technicians, but excluding the I.C.A.-paid dollar salaries of such staff.

Item 4.—I.C.A. Headquarters (I.C.A.)

This item provides for equipment and passages, and travelling, subsistence and house allowances for the group of U.S. specialists to be stationed at headquarters in Nairobi. Provision has been included for the full requirements for equipment, which will all be needed as soon as they arrive, and for half the requirements (one year of this two-year scheme), in respect of passages and allowances. The same assumption has been made in respect of all other I.C.A.-aided schemes on which U.S. technicians are to be employed.

Item 5.—Agricultural Education—Farm Institutes (I.C.A.)

Paragraphs 96–99. The provision in this item is to cover expenditure on farm institutes in the Nyanza and Rift Valley Provinces, which form a sub-section of the Agricultural Education programme, and for which I.C.A. assistance has been approved. Provision for the Non–I.C.A.-aided part of the programme is included in item 1 above.

Item 6.—Pasture Research (I.C.A.)

Paragraphs 94 and 95. Provision is made in this item for the I.C.A.-aided Pasture Research scheme, a sub-section of the Agriculture Department's Swynnerton Plan programme of Agricultural Investigation. Non-I.C.A.-aided sub-sections of that programme are covered by the provision included at item 1 above.

INTENSIFIED DEVELOPMENT OF AFRICAN AGRICULTURE

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDA

Vote S.4-Veterinary Department.

- General.—The form of the appendix has been simplified by distributing charges previously shown under Settlement, Ranching and Tsetse Reclamation (I); Reconditioning of African Areas (Stock Control Projects) (II); African Livestock Marketing Organization (III); and Tsetse Survey and Control (IV); over the appropriate items of the three normal sub-heads of Personal Emoluments, Other Charges and Non-Recurrent. The estimate now follows the accounting procedure and presents a clearer picture.
- Item 1.—Paragraphs 61-67 of the Plan. This provides for the teaching to African farmers of the principles of animal husbandry, to raise the production of milk and cream, and the quality of the stock. The latter involves the upgrading of stock, and beasts from breeding centres will be sold to selected farmers at cost price.
- Item 2.—Paragraphs 88–93 of the Plan. In paragraph 93 (4) it is explained that many of the 41 schemes listed in paragraph 92 will need extra work on tsetse surveys and control. These estimates represent the necessary expansion of that work.

INTENSIFIED DEVELOPMENT OF AFRICAN AGRICULTURE

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDA

Vote S.6.—Survey

Item 1.—Survey for Planned Farming

Paras. 16–24 of the Plan. The ultimate aim is to produce economic family units in the agricultural areas of Kenya and to raise their productivity. To achieve this farms are being planned, holdings consolidated, and security of tenure by the issue of documentary titles will be provided to the African farmers.

- 2. It will be noted that the Survey provision formerly made under Vote S.2-4 has been eliminated as it has been found more convenient to concentrate staff and expenditure under the Survey Department. The number and grades of certain posts is rather higher than was envisaged in the original plan, but experience has shown that the changes are essential to carry out the work of the African Lands Section of the Department to its maximum efficiency.
- 3. To take advantage of the opportunities afforded by the present Emergency and to expedite the resettlement of the Kikuyu, the scheme is being expanded and accelerated in the Central Province and, to achieve this, £87,000 has been made available by the Emergency Fund. Non-recurrent expenditure in future years should be small, particularly in this province, as most capital items will have been provided. These requirements cannot be spread over several years as it is hoped to commence to issue title deeds during the latter half of 1957 and all accommodation and offices will be necessary in order to achieve this aim.

Item 2.—Land Consolidation, Central Province

This item has been created to enable the Legislature to scrutinize the details of the recurrent and non-recurrent expenses of the Provincial Administration field staff who are to carry out, under the general direction of the Special Commissioner for the Kikuyu, Embu and Meru, the accelerated consolidation of holdings, particularly in the Kiambu, Nyeri and Fort Hall districts of the Central Province.

- 2. The consolidation of fragmented land holdings and the grant of secure title to individuals is essential to better farming and increased yields in the African Lands. Pilot Schemes launched in the Central Province have met with an encouraging response and there is now a general desire for land consolidation over the Kikuyu districts of Kiambu, Fort Hall and Nyeri and to a lesser degree in the districts of Embu and Meru.
- 3. As it is hoped that this measure will make a useful contribution to the solution of the problem of absorbing displaced Kikuyu, expenditure is being met by the Emergency Fund. It is intended that the cost of this scheme will eventually be recovered through payments of registration and farm planning fees by the Kikuyu themselves, but obviously these receipts will not be collected at the outset. It is estimated, however, that revenue amounting to some £70,000 will be collected during the 1956–57 fiscal period.
