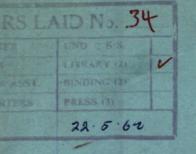

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#### General Memorandum Note

The 1962/63 Expenditure Estimates are presented in a condensed and simplified form. Legislative Council was informed on the 24th January this year of the Government's proposals in this matter, and copies of two Votes in the amended form were circulated.

It was explained that the object of the change was to exclude matters of detail not required for an informed discussion of our financial affairs, and hampering rather than assisting financial control. It was indicated that the new form had been discussed and agreed with the Controller and Auditor-General, and that the main feature of the simplified system was the elimination of items within subheads, and their replacement by a clearly defined description of the services to which the subheads relate. Each Vote containing personal emoluments has been supplemented by an Appendix giving an analytical break-down of staff into broad categories. Similarly details of receipts included under Appropriations-in-Aid and details of items under Grants and Grants-in-Aid have also been given in an Appendix where necessary.

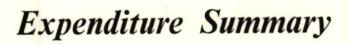
A major simplification of the United Kingdom Estimates has also recently been made on the recommendation of the Plowden Committee, and the recommendations of this Committee and of a Government Working Party on the simplification of Government procedure have been taken into account in framing the Estimates. It is hoped that the Estimates in the new form—which will certainly assist and simplify accounting work—will also assist in the general understanding of the Government's expenditure proposals.

The summary on page 2 shows that total estimated expenditure in 1962/63 is £36,486,840. In the memoranda on individual Votes proposed expenditure in 1962/63 is compared with voted expenditure this year, including Supplementary Estimates Nos. 1 and 2 of 1961/62 passed prior to the printing of the Annual Estimates. However, in view of the major changes in expenditure resulting from the implementation of the Raisman Commission's Report and additional provision included in Supplementary Estimate No. 3, it is thought better to compare in this general note proposed expenditure in 1962/63 with the latest revised estimates of expenditure in the current year, which are shown in column 2 in the Summary on pages 2 and 3. From this it will be seen that the 1962/63 estimates of £36,486,840 compare with revised estimates of expenditure for 1961/62 of £34,793,500, representing an increase of £1,693,340. In order to obtain a true comparison of ordinary recurrent expenditure, it is necessary to eliminate from both years special expenditure on flood and famine relief and on rehabilitation measures based on the recommendations of the Delamere Report. Expenditure on these items totals £1,351,721 in 1961/62 and £1,278,500 in 1962/63. The 1962/63 figures are made up of the following items in the following Votes:—

For a true comparison it is also necessary to eliminate from both sides of the account the effect of income tax deducted from Overseas Aid. The figures, including Public Debt, then become £33,241,779 in 1961/62, and £34,478,340 in 1962/63, leaving an increase of £1,236,561 to be explained.

The biggest single increase is £585,300 for the Public Debt, balanced to the extent of £208,500 by an increase in revenue from interest and redemption. The next biggest item is £534,600 in the Pensions Vote, accounted for in the main by the limited compensation scheme for designated officers. These two commitments, plus the need to provide £59,000 for the Census and £64,000 for the creation of new Ministries, accounts for the whole of the increase over the 1961/62 Estimates. All other increases, including £127,000 for Education, £99,000 for the Police, £67,600 for the transfer of development expenditure from the Development to the Colony Estimates in Vote 14, £41,000 for Health and £40,000 for Elections, have been covered by savings. This demonstrates that a successful effort has been made to economize in expenditure while, at the same time, maintaining the level of essential security, administrative and social services.

The Estimate for the Judicial Department is £175,500, compared with £130,500 in 1961/62. The increase is due primarily to a drop in Fees of Court (£50,000) owing to the current decline in civil business and to an increase in the cost of passages (£4,576).

Four training posts, three of Resident Magistrate and one of Deputy Registrar to the Supreme Court have been included, and there are also increases of four Executive Staff and three Clerks to deal with increased work, primarily criminal cases. The provision for Honoraria to Special Magistrates has been doubled and the extra Executive and Clerical Staff are required to service the additional Special Magistrates it is hoped to recruit. Three posts of Shorthand Writer and four Subordinate Staff have been surrendered.

The gross expenditure figure has been reduced as the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa is now being financed by the East African Common Services Organization. The Appropriations-in-Aid have consequently been reduced by £35,332, being the sum formerly contributed by other territories within the Court's jurisdiction.

The net Estimate for Exchequer and Audit for 1962/63 amounts to £64,800 as compared with £65,000 in the present financial year.

The establishment of staff for Kenya audit has been increased by one Senior Auditor and two Executive Officers against a reduction of six Audit Assistants (Clerks). For audit of the East African Common Services Organization, in the East African Railways and Harbours Branch one Auditor and one Executive Officer have been added with a reduction of three Audit Assistants, whilst in the Non-self-contained Services Branch, one Auditor has been added. The cost of staff engaged in East African Common Services Organization audit is fully reimbursable through Appropriations-in-Aid.

The estimates for the Civil Service Commission is £28,900 compared with £22,100 in 1961/62. Additional work continues to fall upon the Commission as a result of the policy of localisation and increased recruitment in East Africa.

Five additional posts have been provided, but three of these will be offset by a reduction in the Service and Training Branch.

Vote 7 includes provision for the Broadcasting and Information Services which were previously shown under separate Votes. At £3,043,400 the net estimate is £482,144 less than the approved estimate for 1961/62, which is due to the greatly reduced cost which it is hoped will occur in 1962/63 for Famine Relief. £681,221 had to be provided in 1961/62 as against £65,000 in 1962/63.

The 1961/62 Estimates showed a reduction of 526 posts. A further net reduction of 269 posts has been made in these Estimates bringing the total staff numbers down to 13,437.

Provision of £40,000 has been included for Election expenses, and a further £15,000 for various Commissions which will be visiting the Colony as a result of the London Constitutional Conference.

A sum of £171,000 has been shown as the Government Subvention to the Kenya Broadcasting Corporation which will be taking over from the Kenya Broadcasting Services on 1st July, 1962: a further £15,000 is provided being the estimated Services on 1st July, 1962: a further £15,000 is provided being the estimated cost of stores and equipment destroyed by fire on 15th March, 1962, which would otherwise have become the property of the Corporation. In addition provision of £21,000 has been made for the Government's liability for gratuities due to contract staff of the Kenya Broadcasting Services.

Although 31 new posts and other additional provision were approved for the Information Services under Supplementary Estimate No. 2 of 1961/62, the additional expenditure then envisaged has been reduced as a result of the recommendations of the Marett Report.

Economies have also been made on replacement of Vehicles, and travelling expenses. The Vehicle establishment of the Provincial Administration has been reduced by 15 per cent.

The net estimate for the Ministry of Legal Affairs is £109,700 compared with £102,300 in 1961/62.

There are three upgradings of superscale posts as part of the general review undertaken after the Flemming Report. There is one new post and one upgrading in the Accounts and Establishment Section, and five new posts and one upgrading in the Registrar General's Department. Against these, two posts have been surrendered and one downgraded. All these changes are due to an increase of work and some reorganization in the Registrar General's Department, and the net extra cost is more than covered by increased receipts of fees.

Provision of expenditure of £8,000, with appropriations in aid of £1,000, is made for the Council of Legal Education and the School of Law. These new institutions are essential for training local advocates for the Kenya Bar.

This Vote now includes provision formerly shown in the Miscellaneout Vote and in the Vote for the Annuity to H.H. The Sultan of Zanzibar.

The net Estimates for 1962/63 amounts to £642,300 as compared with £557,073 in the present financial year, an increase of £85,227. The principal additions consist of approximately £59,000 for the Population Census which will be taken in August, £27,000 to take account of a larger administrative loss on the Post Office Savings Bank, £10,000 to cover the cost of the new Ministry of State for Constitutional Affairs and Economic Planning and £10,000 for Commissions of Inquiry on sources of revenue and staffing of the public service. These increases are offset by a reduction of £24,000 in the provision for the Economic Survey of Kenya.

Of the 19 new posts mentioned in the Estimate, 11 are required for the new Ministry of State which has taken over responsibility for the Economics and Statistics, and the Development and Planning Divisions of the Treasury. Apart from provision for the Minister, two Parliamentary Secretaries and two Executive Staff for the Minister's Office, two further administrative posts have been provided. One of these is to accommodate the Permanent Secretary who is also Deputy Permanent Secretary in the Treasury, token provision only now being made for the latter post: the other is included in connexion with work on the next Development Plan. Four posts have been added to the complement of the Economics and Statistics Division: of these, one administrative post is supernumerary without financial provision and three clerical posts have been transferred from another Ministry. The nine other new posts, one of which is in the administrative grade, are largely required for increased Pensions work, both in the Accounts and Assessment Sections.

In the Other Charges subheads, provision of £1,000 is made for local expenses of the East African Office of the United Nations Technical Assistance Board and £6,669 for a grant-in-aid of C.C.T.A. Provision for the latter has previously been made in other Votes.

The 1962/63 net Estimate for Pensions and Gratuities amounts to £2,387,500, as compared with £1,761,500 in the present financial year, an increase of £626,000.

The increase in Subhead A, Civil Pensions and Gratuities, amounts to £384,300. Of this sum, £55,200 relates to normal pensions and gratuities, whilst the requirement for pensions payable under the Limited Compensation Scheme amounts to £63,000. The provision for normal commuted pensions shows a decrease of £15,200 as compared with the present financial year. This results from the inflation of the 1961/62 figure by provision for arrears payable under the Flemming arrangements. Commuted pensions payable to officers retiring under the Limited Compensation Scheme will cost £215,000 more in 1962/63. There is a decrease of £7,200 in the provision for ex gratia pensions and gratuities and an increase of £10,000 in advances against commuted pensions, as compared with the 1961/62 printed Estimate. In addition, £63,000 has been included for pensions and commuted pensions in respect of a scheme for non-designated officers.

Subhead F, Payments under Compensation Scheme, shows an increase of £243,000. This, together with the provision mentioned above for pensions and commuted pensions payable under the Limited Compensation Scheme, relates to a continuing commitment in respect of approximately 180 officers retiring during 1961/62 and to a further commitment in respect of an additional 200 officers whom it is estimated will retire under the scheme in 1962/63.

The increase in the requirement for advances against commuted pensions is offset by a larger Appropriation-in-Aid, through which recovery is made.

The net estimate for the Ministry of Defence is £237,500 compared with a total of £307,441 for Votes 16, 17 and 20 in 1961/62.

This reduction is principally accounted for by savings on the Kenya Regiment subhead, arising from the decision not to call up Europeans for compulsory military training in 1962/63. The saving is partially offset by a considerable fall in fees collected by the Immigration Department, and increased provision for the expenses of persons restricted under the Preservation of Public Security Ordinance, 1960.

The net estimate for the Police is £4,304,000, compared with a total of £4,173,980 in 1961/62.

The annual increase in Personal Emoluments which is attributable to increments, is offset by a reduction in the total establishment of 155 uniformed and five civilian staff. These reductions have been achieved in the main by reducing the establishments of certain police stations and posts. The rank of officer-in-charge of many police stations has been down-graded from Inspector to Sub-inspector or Sergeant, and with the growing availability of literate and skilled constables it has been possible to amend the ratio of constables to corporals with a consequent reduction of the latter. There is increased expenditure in 1962/63 on account of literacy allowances, a result also of a better qualified force.

One post of Senior Assistant Commissioner was upgraded to Deputy Commissioner in 1961 as part of the post-Flemming salaries revision review of the gradings of superscale posts. The post of Senior Establishment Officer of this very large department was similarly upgraded to Chief Establishment Officer. A general reconstruction of grades and designations was also carried out in the Police Signals Branch. The pensions section at Police Headquarters has been strengthened to cope with increased work, and six training posts of clerk have been included for general clerical purposes.

There are increases in provision for house allowances, passages and leave exepenses, electricity, water and conservancy, and postal services. The increase in the cost of passages is a result of the Flemming two-year tour, and the increase in electricity and water charges is a result of the occupation of new flats provided with electric light and individual water connections. There is an increase of £6,670 on the replacement and running expenses of motor vehicles. The provision for uniforms is increased by £22,000 as this is the first year in which the force's blue shirts (introduced in early 1961) have to be replaced, and also the effect of some of the serious cuts in 1961/62 is being righted. This is also the explanation for increased cost of £15,500 for equipment and stores.

The figure for appropriations in aid is down on the 1961/62 estimate by £23,200, for in spite of increases on several items, these are more than negatived by the fall of £33,000 on the sale of stores, of which £26,000 is a drop in the sale of vehicles and £7,000 on other stores. The increase in reimbursement for police officers seconded to the E.A.R. & H., to special guards and the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa, is due to some increases in numbers seconded and to the cost of the Flemming salaries revision being greater than estimated in 1961/62. The increase in the Miscellaneous item is due to greater use of the Police vehicle workshops by the Prisons Department and the Kenya Regiment, and to sales of the new Kenya Police Force History.

The estimate for the Ministry of Education is £6,945,200 compared with £6,800,600 in 1961/62.

In the African Primary and Intermediate Sectors it will be be possible to allow a degree of expansion as in the current year, but the rate of expansion will be limited by the inability of African District Councils generally to provide more funds. It will not be possible to expand in both the Secondary and Teacher Training sectors to the extent planned by the Regional Education Boards, but it is hoped to open 16 new Secondary forms and a number of new Day Secondary Schools in the course of the year.

In Asian Education it will be possible to maintain normal expansion, but only by a reduction in the present staffing ratio.

In European Education a general reduction in expenditure has been made possible by lower enrolments in the schools which have been matched by reductions in staff and equipment.

In Technical Education provision has been made for the Kenya Government's contribution towards a five-year scheme of assistance which is being provided by the United Nations Special Fund for the Kenya Polytechnic and which is expected to start in 1962/63; even so, reductions have had to be made in the planned development of this institution. Provision is also made for the opening of a new Trade School in the Rift Valley; this will be made possible only by provision of a staff ratio well below normal and at the expense of withdrawing certain staff from other Trade Schools; nevertheless every effort will be made to maintain standards even with the reduced staff.

An increase of some £47,000 in the provision for Higher Education is required to enable the Kenya Government to meet its commitments towards the University Colleges in East Africa.

The net estimate for the Ministry of Agriculture and Animal Husbandry is £2,706,100 as compared with £1,636,280 for 1961/62. The increase of £1,069,820 is due to four major factors:—

- (i) The Appropriation in Aid from the Development Fund has been reduced by £67,600. Of this £24,000 relates to Co-operative Development, £30,000 to the Soil Conservation Service and the remainder to the Swynnerton Plan.
- (ii) Appropriations in Aid of £53,700 from the Kenya Meat Commission have been reduced to £28,448, as a result of a change in the financial arrangements relating to the operation of the canning factory. This decrease is partly offset by the increase in Colony revenue from interest and redemption of £13,500.
- (iii) Provision for guaranteed returns under Subhead K has been increased by £67,000. Of this, £17,000 reflects the increase in the rates introduced in respect of 1962 planted crops and the balance to payments which have still to be made in respect of the 1961 planted crop. This latter increase will be covered by a special grant from H.M.G.
- (iv) Provision of £885,000 has been made to cover expenditure necessary to rehabilitate agriculture in the scheduled and non-scheduled areas after the recent famine and flood. £850,000 will be covered by a special grant or loan from the United Kingdom government.

Expenditure of £189,648 has been included in subhead X and represents a transfer of expenditure from Vote 14 of the 1961/62 Estimates.

Provision has also been made for expenditure which falls to be borne by the Kenya Government in respect of overseas experts and volunteers, the majority of whom will be provided by the American Government.

There has been a net decrease of 72 posts mainly due to the closing down of the AGRON Workshops (23 posts) and a reduction in the Coffee Advisory Services (175 posts). Against this decrease of 198 posts there have been increases of 27 posts for tea development, 34 posts for the Co-operative Development and 60 subordinate scale posts in the Mariakani Milk Scheme where provision has been made previously but the posts not specified. There has been one up-grading of an A scale post to the Lower Super Scale.

At £2,074,400 the net estimate for the Ministry of Health and Housing is £36,581 in excess of the 1961/62 net estimate of £2,037,819.

Responsibility for Social Affairs has been passed to the new Ministry of Social Services and responsibility for Housing previously included in the Vote of the Ministry of Labour and Housing has now been included with Health.

The increase of 106 posts in Subhead A.1, A.2 and A.3 arises principally from the need to absorb trainees who will qualify during 1962/63.

The provision for Medical and Surgical Stores and Equipment Subhead G is increased by £27,630 and attracts an increase in Appropriations-in-Aid of £15,000 on account of sales of Polio Vaccine and £12,500 sales of Stores and Equipment.

The increase of £10,000 in Subhead H—Maintenance and Upkeep of Medical Establishments reflects the rising cost of maintaining existing standards and an element of increased hospital accommodation.

Subhead K—Government Grants to Hospital Fund Authorities, provision has been reduced by £57,500 as the basis of the grants is to be amended from £1 to £ 4 to £1 to £8.

The net Estimate for the Ministry of Social Services is £1,602,300, compared with a total of £1,640,421 in 1961/62 for the services now incorporated in this Ministry. The Ministry was created on 7th April, 1962, being comprised of the Prisons Department, the Probation Service, the Children's, Approved Schools and Remand Homes Department and certain services provided by the former Ministry of Health and Social Affairs. The addition of a Minister's office has necessitated the creation of eight new posts, in addition to transferring certain existing posts from the Ministries formerly responsible for these services; some additional provision for House Allowances, Passages and Other Charges has also been necessary. The increased cost resulting from the creation of a Minister's office is £14,500.

Personal Emoluments for the Prisons Department, taking into account the cost of increments at about £24,000, and allowaing for an increase, based on actual expenditure of £8,500 on allowances, show a saving of £17,500. This has been achieved by reducing the numbers of warders and detention camp overseers provided for by 180, although in order to allow for flexibility to cope with possible increases in the prison population the number of posts has only been reduced by 30. To adjust for intakes under the Localization and Training programme, 10 posts of Assistant Superintendent have been surrendered against 10 new posts of Chief Officer Grade I, producing a saving. In other small reorganizations, 20 Warder posts have been converted to Warder Clerk posts; the post of Assistant Commissioner (Tutor) has been abolished, and a post of Chief Steward (inspection of records and accounts) created. Eight junior technical posts have been abolished. Posts of Prison Chaplain and Catechist, cut out in 1961/62, have been restored. To prepare for the opening of the new Borstal Institution, four posts of Assistant Welfare Officer and five of Teacher have been created. Six Storemen posts have been created for Kamiti Prison. The changes in staff give a decrease of 31 uniformed officers, and 21 extra civilian staff, a net decrease of 10 posts.

The anticipated lower daily average prisons population has made possible reductions of £30,350 on Clothing and Equipment, £54,880 on Food and £3,750 on Miscellaneous Stores. There is also a reduction of £4,459 on Passages and of £1,700 on Farm Supplies. There is an increase of £9,000 on the Expenses of Vehicles, underestimated in 1961/62. Increases of £5,600 on Tools and Plant and of £42,650 on Raw Materials are fully covered by increased Appropriations in Aid. Provision for Electricity, Water, Conservancy and Fuel was seriously underestimated in 1961/62, so that even with a reduced population the Estimate has had to be increased by £5,000. The Prisoners Earning Scheme, after a year in operation, is proving less expensive than anticipated, and provision is therefore reduced by £3,500. The net increase of £47,100 in Appropriations-in-Aid is almost entirely due to increased activity in Prison Industries and Prison Farms and to a change in accounting for Raw Materials, offset to a small extent by reductions on Other Items.

Certain Subheads of the Prisons Department have been altered so that they refer to the type of articles to be purchased rather than to the branches of the Department using them.

There has been a reorganization and redesignation of posts in the Children's, Approved Schools and Remand Homes Department, resulting in a reduction of the total number of posts but with some rise in overall provision. There are also some changes in the Probation Service staff. The Other Charges expenditure of both these departments has been reduced.

The net estimate is £1,552,200 compared with the 1961/62 estimate of £1,513,000.

The reduction in the provision under Subhead A is the result of variations in the 1961 Valuation Roll of the Nairobi City Council.

The additional provision under Subhead B reflects increases in the salaries of Chief Officers following the adoption by the Central Government of the recommendations of the Flemming Commission.

The increase under Subhead D reflects anticipated rate collections by African District Councils.

The provision under Subhead E is reduced as grants to Nairobi, Nakuru, and Naivasha County Councils expire in 1962.

At £279,000 net the Vote for this new Ministry includes the Lands Department, the Survey Department and the Town Planning Division previously included in the Ministry of Local Government and Lands. The net increase over the provision for 1961/62 is £12,525.

The Ministerial staff includes eight new posts in addition to the Minister and Parliamentary Secretary with provision of £13,800.

The Lands Department has assumed responsibility for the African Lands Branch which in 1961/62 was included in Vote 7. As a result of this and other minor changes, the complement of the Department has been increased by 15 posts. The net vote of the Department is £121,600 compared with £124,365 in 1961/62 savings having been achieved by the reduction of two posts of Valuer Scale A under Subhead F.1 and a reduction in provision for Miscellaneous Other Charges, Subhead F.7.

The complement of the Survey Department has been increased by 35 posts but the provision for the current year at £130,200 is the same as for 1961/62. With the emphasis shifting to aerial surveys it has been possible to reduce the complement of Staff Surveyors by one post and the provision for casual labour in the field at £7,795 has been halved. Under Subhead J.1 an additional eight posts of Assistant Photogrammetrist have been provided in order to absorb trainees, but against this two posts of Senior Photogrammetrist which have remained unfilled have been surrendered. Provision has been made for an additional ten Drivers bringing the total complement to 67 to cover a vehicle establishment of 77. Provision for the 20 additional posts under Subhead K.1—Agriculture Settlement Schemes—will attract an equivalent sum in Appropriations-in-Aid from Development Funds.

The net Estimate for the Ministry of Tourism, Forests and Wild Life is £642,000, as compared with £587,750 in 1961/62. Of the increase of £54,250, £26,500, which has been made available by the British Government as a special grant to facilitate the rehabilitation of areas affected by the recent floods, is being spent on the repair of roads in the Royal National Parks (£18,00), in A.D.C. Game Parks (£6,000) and in Forest Areas (£2,500).

As regards the remainder of the increase, £4,000 is due to a decrease in the Appropriations-in-Aid from A.D.C.'s which has fallen owing to the reduction in timber royalties; a sum of £3,000 has been provided for the meeting of the International Union for the Conservation of Natural Resources which will take place in 1963, and the balance, which relates to Personal Emoluments, is mainly due to the incidence of Flemming increases to minor employees.

The Estimate includes one upgrading from the A Scale to the lower Superscale and four upgradings from the subordinate service scale to the E Scale. There is a net decrease of one in the number of posts.

The net Estimate for 1962/63 totals £3,349,500 compared with £3,396,546 in 1961/62, a decrease of £47,046.

The Estimate includes provision for the Ministry, for Printing and Stationery, for the Government Coast Agency and for the Mombasa Water Supply, which were previously shown in four separate Votes. Following the transfer of responsibility for Communications to this Ministry, provision is also made in the Vote for Personal Emoluments and Other Charges of Headquarters Communications Staff, of the Road Transport Branch, of Nairobi Airport, of the Aerodrome Fire Services and of staff seconded to the Road Authority. In addition, provision is included for certain Miscellaneous Other Charges and for Subsidies and Contributions relating to Communications.

Staff reductions total 44. The requirement for Personal Emoluments for Works Staff shows an increase of approximately £20,000 and that for Road Staff a decrease of a similar amount, as compared with the 1961/62 Estimates. The increase covers a larger requirement for Leave Pay and Gratuities to Contract and Temporary Staff.

The principal changes in Other Charges subheads are: --

- (i) In Subhead A.6, a reduction of £20,000 in the requirement for Professional Fees results from the decrease in the size of the Ministry's construction programme.
- (ii) In Subhead A.7, an increase of approximately £25,500 will cover the cost of repairs to flood damage to buildings and will be met by a grant from the British Government.
- (iii) In Subhead A.8, an increase of some £28,500 will be offset by a corresponding increase in revenue from Public Water Supplies through Appropriation-in-Aid, and by a contribution from the British Government to cover the cost of flood damage repairs.
- (iv) In Subheads A.10 and A.16, reductions of £104,000 and £53,500 respectively result from a decision not to extend the Common Services Scheme for the maintenance of Government transport to the degree originally envisaged, and from a lower utilization of plant through a reduction in the Works Programme. Corresponding reductions are made in the relevant Appropriations-in-Aid.
- (v) In Subhead D.7, an increase of £61,000 is made in the provision for paper, stationery, printing materials, etc. The reduced provision for these requirements in 1961/62 was related to a rundown in paper stocks. The provision now proposed for next year is the same as that made in 1960/61.
- (vi) In Subhead A.15, the Special Contribution to the Road Authority amounting to £216,000 covers requirements for repairs to flood damage. A total of £486,000 in 1961/62 and 1962/63 has been generously provided by the British Government for this purpose.

As concerns Appropriations-in-Aid, the main changes apart from those mentioned above relate to an increase of £82,000 in Aviation Landing Fees and a decrease of £33,000 in Agency Fees.

The 1962/63 gross Estimate for the Public Debt amounts to £4,860,000 compared with the 1961/62 gross Estimate of £4,259,208, an increase of £600,792.

The increase in the Funded Debt amounts to £33,000. This takes into account the deletion of provision for Interest and Sinking Fund payments on the £375,000 Loan of 1936 which was repaid in 1961 and the addition of provision for similar payments on the £3,340,000 Loan of 1961.

As concerns the Unfunded Debt, the principal increases are an additional £45,000 for Interest on Deposits and Short-term Borrowings, a further £51,900 for Interest and Redemption on loan finance for the Special Road Programme, and £24,000 for a similar purpose for the Barclalys Overseas Development Corporation Loan for Government Offices. In addition, a further £384,900 will be required for Interest and Redemption on Exchequer Loans obtained in the current financial year for the Development Programme, £37,100 in respect of the International Bank Loan for the development of African agriculture, £73,600 for International Bank and Colonial Development Corporation Loans for Land Development and Settlement and £29,000 in respect of interest on drawings of the West German Loan for Development. The gross increase is partly offset by an anticipated increase of £208,500 in provision included in the Revenue Estimates for additional interest and redemption on loans made by the Government. The real increase as compared with 1961/62 is thus approximately £392,000.
