### 1. PREFACE

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### Mr. Speaker,

The Departmental Committee on Defence and Foreign Relations is established pursuant to provisions of Standing Order 198 (1). Under the provisions of Standing Order 198 (3) the Committee is mandated to:-

- (a). investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned Ministries and departments;
- (b). study the Programme and policy objectives of the Ministries and departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
- (c). study and review all legislation referred to it;
- (d). study, assess and analyse the relative success of the Ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with its stated objectives;
- (e). investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned Ministries and departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the House or a Minister; and
- (f). make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.

The Committee is also mandated to scrutinise the budget of line Ministries as provided under Standing Order No. 152 states which that:-

- (1) Upon being laid before the National Assembly, the annual estimates shall stand committed to the respective departmental Committees according to their mandates.
- (2) Each departmental Committee shall consider, discuss and review the estimates committed to it under this standing order and submit its

report thereon to the House within twenty one days after they were first laid before the House.

The Committee oversees the performance of the following Ministries and Government department:-

(i) Defence;

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- (ii) Foreign Affairs;
- (iii) East African Community; and
- (iv) National Security Intelligence Service.

Under the above Ministries, the Committee covers the following subjects;

- (i) Defence matters;
- (ii) Foreign policy;
- (iii) Treaties, Conventions and Agreements;
- (iv) International and Regional Organisations;
- (v) Bilateral and Multilateral Relations;
- (vi) Regional Cooperation policy;
- (vii) East African Community Affairs;
- (viii) National Security Intelligence.

## 2. THE FAMILIARIZARTION VISIT

### Mr. Speaker,

The Committee undertook a visit to the Kenya Mission to the United Nations Offices in Nairobi (UNON) on 16<sup>th</sup> November, 2010. The Kenya Mission to UNON is located in Gigiri area of Nairobi. The purpose of the visit was to familiarize the Committee with the work and role of the Mission.

The Government set up a fully fledged multilateral Mission out of the realization of the importance of the political, diplomatic and multilateral developments as a result of the presence of the United Nations Offices in Nairobi comprising of UN HABITAT, UNEP and UNON. The Mission provides the necessary political and bureaucratic backstopping of the work done by the Kenya based Missions. The Mission has triple accreditation functions to UN HABITAT, UNEP and UNON.

The following Members of the Committee undertook the visit:-

From the visit to the Kenya Mission to UNON, the Committee observed and recommends that:-

- The Ministry of Foreign Affairs should strive to achieve equity in terms of service among Kenya Missions and particularly between domestic Missions and Missions abroad. To bring about equity among the mission, the staff of domestic Missions be accorded facilitation commensurate to the responsibilities they undertake in promoting Kenya's interests, protecting and projecting Kenya's image.
- 2. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs should adequately fund the Kenya Mission to UNON to enable it effectively perform its roles.

- 3. The Ministry should allow the Mission to open and operate independent bank accounts so that it can manage its finances as allocated in the Budget.
- 4. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs should ensure that the Kenya Mission to UNON is fully staffed with personnel who have relevant skills and competences to as to perform effectively.
- 5. The Government of the Republic of Kenya should capitalise on the presence of the United Nations Offices in Nairobi to spur economic growth.
- 6. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs should develop Domestic Missions service regulations specific to Kenya Missions located in Nairobi. This will enhance equity between Missions in line with international practice.

These recommendations form part of the recommendations contained in other parts of this Report.

## 4.0 VISIT TO KENYA MISSION TO UNITED NATIONS OFFICES IN NAIROBI (UNON)

### 4.1 COURTESY CALL ON THE KENYA AMBASSADOR TO UNON

The delegation paid a courtesy call to Kenya Ambassador to UNON Amb. Macharia Kamau. The Ambassador welcomed the delegation and thanked the Committee for visiting the Mission. The delegation was briefed on the operations of the Embassy.

## 4.2 MEETING WITH STAFF AT THE KENYA MISSION TO UNON

The Committee was briefed as follows:-

The Mission was established in January 2009. Three Missions (Kenya Mission to UN Habitat, Kenya Mission to UNEP and Kenya Mission to UNON) were combined to one so as to cut on costs. This has resulted in savings of KES 33 Million.

The Committee was briefed on the Core Values, Mission and Mandate of the Mission which is to perform diplomatic and representational and multilateral duties on behalf of the Government of Kenya with the secretaries of UNON, UNEP, UN-Habitat as well as Diplomatic Embassies and missions accredited to these secretariats and other International Organizations accredited to UNON with the aim of promoting environmental governance ad human settlement.

### (i) Duties of UNON desk

- UNON being the only UN Headquarters in Africa and among the developing countries, the mission facilitates the work of UNON in Nairobi.
- Attends to the locational needs of the UNON campus including infrastructure, security, and political backstopping in Nairobi, Geneva and New York.
- Serve as rapporteur for Ministry of Foreign Affairs within the African Diplomatic Corps (ADC).
- Serve as a liaison for Government of Kenya with UNON.

• Provide hosting support for UN missions to Kenya and related logistical backstopping.

# (ii) Duties of UNEP desk

- Facilitate lead ministries within government that work directly with the environment and UNEP.
- Work directly with UNEP secretariat through the Committee of Permanent Representatives (CPR) and other subsidiary bodies and committees.
- Participate in UN General Assembly (UNGA) on matters related to UNEP.
- Avails special dedicative support to UNEP.
- Provides technical backstopping in negotiations where technical ministry is not represented.

# (iii) Duties of UN-HABITAT

- Facilitates lead agencies within Government that work with the human settlement and UN-HABITAT.
- Participate in UN General Assembly meetings on matters related to UN HABITAT
- Liaise with the secretariat of UN HABITAT in the preparation and chairing of the CPR and subcommittee meetings and planning and organizing the habitat governing council and World Urban Forum.

# Challenges

- Need to capitalize on the fact that UNON, UNEP, and UN-HABITAT are the only UN Headquarters situated in Africa and in the developing world.
- Understaffing and need for competent and qualified personnel.
- Insufficient budgetary provisions.

# 5.0 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

The Committee made the following observations:-

- (i) The Kenya Mission to UNON is understaffed considering the tasks that it is expected to perform.
- (ii) The Kenya Mission to UNON is underfunded considering the role that it plays in representing the country at the U.N. Offices in Nairobi (UNEP, UN-HABITAT and UNON).
- (iii) The finances of the Mission are managed at the Ministry Headquarters, this hampers efficient and effective service delivery by the Mission.
- (iv) The Mission staff are treated like officers at the Ministry Headquarters and can be recalled to the Headquarters to perform other duties at any time thus affecting their performance at the Mission.
- (v) The merger of three Missions, KMUNON, UNEP and UN- HABITAT in the Financial Year 2009/2010 led to savings of Kshs. 33,760,438.

### 6.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee recommends that:-

- 1. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs should adequately fund the Kenya Mission to UNON to enable it effectively perform its functions.
- 2. The Ministry should allow the Mission to open and operate independent bank accounts so that it can manage its finances as allocated in the Budget.
- 3. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs should ensure that the Kenya Mission to UNON is fully staffed with personnel with relevant skills and competences so as to perform.
- 4. The Government of the Republic of Kenya should capitalise on the presence of the United Nations Offices in Nairobi to spur economic growth.
- 5. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs should develop Domestic Missions service regulations specific to Kenya Missions located in Nairobi. This will enhance equity between Missions in line with international practice.

### Kenya Turkish Friendship group

Members raised concern that the Kenya Turkish friendship group was dormant in spite the fact that it had been established. The members resolved to revitalize the friendship groups. The members further underlined the importance of establishing a fully fledged diplomatic Mission in Turkey due to the economic gains that will be realized.

### Inspection of modernization programmes

The Committee directed that the inspection visit to military modernization programmes be expedited. The Committee resolved that the inspections should include the following projects:-
