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CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

This report contains the Committee's proceedings on the consideration of the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill (N.A. Bills No. 2 of 2020), which was published on 4th March, 2020 and read a first time on **17th March, 2020** pursuant to Standing Order 127.

The drafting of the Bill was necessitated by a letter written to the Parliamentary Service Commission by the Chairperson of the National Assembly Committee on Members Facilities and Services requesting the Commission to address various concerns related to poor services and facilities at the Catering Department of Parliament. The Commission considered the issues raised in the letter and resolved that catering services to Members of Parliament should be provided in a manner similar to the Parliamentary Mortgage and Car Loan Schemes. Resultantly, the Parliamentary Catering Services Regulations, 2019 were adopted by the Commission and presented to the respective Committee of each of the Houses of Parliament responsible for delegated legislations.

On 4th April, 2019, the Clerk of the National Assembly communicated the comments and observations made by the National Assembly Committee on Delegated Legislation and the same were considered at length by the Parliamentary Service Commission. The Commission further considered the final draft of the Catering Regulations in its meeting held in June, 2019 and resolved that they should be published for enactment. The adoption of the aforesaid report necessitated the Commission to amend section 24 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 through the Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendment) Act No. 18 of 2018.

Following the enactment of the Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendment) Act No. 18 of 2018, Mr. Okiya Omtatah and 3 others filed a constitutional Petition in the High Court challenging a number of issues in the Act including the amendments proposed to section 24 of the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Act, 2012 citing that the amendments are unconstitutional because the amendments were neither in the memorandum nor in the Bill and therefore no public participation took place on the same and the High Court declared the amendments null and void.

The Parliamentary Service Act, 2019 has no provisions enabling the Commission to setup a Fund under the Public Finance Management Act, 2012. It therefore follows that subsequent to the Court's annulment of section 24(2A) of the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA) which anchored the Public Finance Management (Parliamentary Catering Fund) Regulations, 2019, the Commission is unable to make Regulations setting a fund pursuant to the PFMA, 2012 which is the preserve of the Cabinet Secretary to the National Treasury under section 205 of the Act making the Regulations inconsistent with the PFMA. Following advice from the Directorate of Litigation and Compliance Services, the amendments were re-introduced in the House through the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill (N.A. Bills No. 2 of 2020) for consideration.

The Bill has three (3) clauses and it seeks to amend the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 to empower the Parliamentary Service Commission to establish a fund for Parliament or a House of Parliament. The Bill further seeks to amend the Act to require the approval of the National Assembly on borrowing and guaranteeing of loans by the National Government. In particular, it seeks to provide that the National Government shall only borrow money for the budget approved by the National Assembly and for allocations of loans approved by the National Assembly.

In processing the Bill, the Clerk of the National Assembly invited comments from the public by placing advertisements in the print media on **Friday, 20th March, 2020** pursuant to Article 118 of the Constitution but no memorandum had been received by the Committee at the end of the period of submission. In a bid to carry out stakeholder participation, the Clerk wrote a letter to the National Treasury (Ref: NA/DCS/F&NP/2020/21 dated 24th April, 2020) requesting for their comments on the Bill but the National Treasury had not responded to the letter by the time the Committee was considering the Bill.

On behalf of the Departmental Committee on Finance and National Planning and pursuant to provisions of Standing Order 199 (6), it is my pleasant privilege and honour to present to this House the Report of the Committee on its consideration of the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill (N.A. Bills No. 2 of 2020).

The Committee is grateful to the Offices of the Speaker and the Clerk of the National Assembly for the logistical and technical support accorded to it during its sittings. I also wish to express my appreciation to the Honorable Members of the Committee who made useful contributions towards the preparation and production of this report.

It is my pleasure to report that the Committee has considered the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill (N.A. Bills No. 2 of 2020) and have the honour to report back to the National Assembly with the recommendation that the Bill should be **approved with an amendment**.

CHAPTER ONE

1 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment of the Committee

1. The Departmental Committee on Finance & National Planning is one of the fifteen Departmental Committees of the National Assembly established under *Standing Order 216* whose mandates pursuant to the *Standing Order 216 (5)* are as follows:

 - vi. To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order No. 204 (Committee on appointments);
 - vii. To examine treaties, agreements and conventions;
 - viii. To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation;
 - ix. To consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and
 - x. To examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.

1.2 Mandate of the Committee

2. In accordance with the Second Schedule of the Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to consider, public finance, monetary policies, public debt, financial institutions (excluding those in securities exchange), investment and divestiture policies, pricing policies, banking, insurance, population revenue policies including taxation and national planning and development.
3. In executing its mandate, the Committee oversees the following government Ministries and departments;
 - a. The National Treasury and Ministry of Planning
 - b. Ministry of Devolution and ASAL
 - c. The Commission on Revenue Allocation
 - d. Office of the Controller of Budget

CHAPTER TWO

2 OVERVIEW OF THE PUBLIC FINANCE MANAGEMENT (AMENDMENT) BILL (NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BILLS NO. 2 OF 2020)

2.1 ANALYSIS OF THE BILL

6. The objective of this Bill is to amend the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 to empower the Parliamentary Service Commission to establish a fund for Parliament or a House of Parliament. The Bill further seeks to amend the Act to require the approval of the National Assembly on borrowing and guaranteeing of loans by the National Government. In particular, it seeks to provide that the National Government shall only borrow money for the budget approved by the National Assembly and for allocations of loans approved by the National Assembly.
7. **Clause 1** of the Bill is the short title;
8. **Clause 2** of the Bill seeks to amend section 24 of the Act to provide for the establishment of a fund for Parliament or a House of Parliament; and
9. **Clause 3** of the Bill seeks to amend section 50 by deleting the word “Parliament” and substituting with the words “National Assembly”.
10. The enactment of the Bill shall not occasion additional expenditure of public funds.
11. The Bill does not concern county governments within the meaning of Article 110 of the Constitution.

2.2 CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL

12. In considering the Bill, the Committee held two (2) sittings. In the first meeting, Members were briefed on what had necessitated the amendments proposed in the Bill and the intent of the proposed amendments and in the second meeting, the Committee considered the Bill clause by clause and adopted the report on the consideration of the Bill.

CHAPTER THREE

3 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION/STAKEHOLDER CONSULTATION

13. Following a call for memoranda from the public through placement of advertisements in the print media on Friday 20th March, 2020, the Committee did not receive any memorandum from members of the public. In a bid to carry out public participation as per Article 118 of the Constitution, the Committee sought for comments on the Bill from the National Treasury vide a letter Ref: NA/DCS/F&NP/2020/21 dated 24th April, 2020. The National Treasury however, did not submit any comments on the Bill to the Committee.

CHAPTER FOUR

4 COMMITTEE'S OBSERVATION

The Committee observed that:-

14. The empowering of the Parliamentary Service Commission in order to establish a Fund will go along in promoting the smooth running of Parliament as well as safeguarding the independence of the Legislature.
15. The Bill will operationalize the Public Finance Management (Parliamentary Catering Fund) Regulations, 2019; and
16. The Bill will help improve the services and facilities offered by the Catering Department in Parliament.
17. The removal of the role of the Senate in approval of any borrowing by the National Government will contravene Article 211 of the Senate which stipulates that "*Parliament may by legislation prescribe the terms on which the national government may borrow*".

CHAPTER FIVE

5 COMMITTEE'S RECOMMENDATION

18. The Committee having considered the Public Finance Management (Amendment) Bill (National Assembly Bills No. 2 of 2020) recommends that the House approves the Bill with the amendment proposed in the schedule.

CHAPTER SIX


6 SCHEDULE OF COMMITTEE'S PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Clause 3

19. That the Bill is amended by deleting the proposed clause 3

Justification

20. The proposed amendment will be against the spirit of Article 211(1)(a) of the Constitution which provides that, "*Parliament may by legislation prescribe the terms on which the national government may borrow*".
