REPORT ON THE NOMINATION OF COMMISSIONERS TO THE TRUTH, JUSTICE AND RECONCILIATION COMMISSION

1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.11 **Mr. Speaker, Sir**, the Truth, Justice and Reconciliation Act, No.6 of 2008 is an Act of Parliament to provide for the Establishment of the Truth, Justice and Reconciliation Commission and for connected purposes.
- 1.12 Provisions of Part II of the Act deals with the Establishment, Powers and Functions of the Commission.
- 1.13 The membership of the Commission is stipulated in the provisions of section 10 (1) of the Act which states as follows:-
 - 1. The Commission shall consist of nine commissioners, of whom
 - a) three shall be non-citizens, at least one of whom shall be of opposite gender, selected by the panel of Eminent African Personalities; and
 - b) six shall be citizens of Kenya selected by the Selection Panel in accordance with the procedure prescribed in the First Schedule.
 - 2. The commissioners appointed under subsection (1) (a) shall be selected by the Panel of Eminent African Personalities for nomination by the National Assembly which shall forward the names of the nominees to the President for appointment.
 - 3. The Commissioners appointed under subsection (1)(b) shall be selected by and recommended in accordance with the procedure prescribed in the First Schedule and appointed by the President.

1.20 MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

1.21 **Mr. Speaker, Sir,** the Committees' mandate is limited to nominating nine persons for appointment to the Commission pursuant to the provisions of section 10 of the Truth, Justice and Reconciliation Act and in accordance with the procedure set out in paragraphs 5 & 7 of the First Schedule which states as follows:

- 5. The National Assembly shall, upon receipt of the recommendations of the selection panel under paragraph 3, nominate nine persons for appointment as commissioners and shall submit the list of nominees to the Minister for onward transmission to the President
- 7. In nominating or appointing persons as commissioners, the National Assembly and the President shall have regard to gender and regional balance.
- 1.22 Pursuant to the provisions of section 10 (3) of the Truth, Justice and Reconciliation Act and paragraph 1 the First Schedule, the Selection Panel upon open advertisements, successfully conducted interviews for nomination of commissioners.
- 1.23 The selection panel considered the applications, ranked the nominees and submitted its report to the National Assembly.

1.30 COMMITTEES' DELIBERATIONS AND OBSERVATIONS
