The event was organized by International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF). It is usually held biennially and it was first held in 1999. One thousand four hundred and twenty four (1424) athletes from 156 countries were set to compete at the IAAF World Youth Championships, Cali 2015, making it the biggest international athletics event to be held in South America.
