1.2 Committee's Mandate

The Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs derives its mandate from provisions of Standing order 216(5) which defines functions of the Committee as being to:

- f) vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those understanding order 204 (Committee on appointments); and
- g) make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendations of proposed legislation.

The Committee also has oversight mandate over all matters relating to political parties.

Mr. Speaker Sir,

The Petition on the Mau Mau war veterans and the recognition of the armed struggle received on 24th June, 2014 was signed by ten citizens on behalf of sixty one thousand, three hundred and thirty (61,330) Mau Mau war veterans from all the counties of the Republic of Kenya, whose prayers were that Parliament:

- a. Introduces legislation for enactment that will make it mandatory for every eligible Kenyan to be registered as a voter and thus shift the burden of voter registration from the individual to the state.
- b. Introduces legislation for enactment that will make it obligatory for all eligible persons of the Republic of Kenya to vote.

The Petitioner draws the attention of the National Assembly to the following:

- A. Consider, appreciate and recognise all wars of resistance and national liberation waged by our ancestors and those who followed in their footsteps and note their heroic deeds and record them for posterity through an Act of Parliament;
- B. Recognize the Mau Mau armed struggle for national liberation and independence as waged by Kenyans from all corners of the country, through an Act of Parliament;
- C. Facilitates the writing of the history of the freedom struggle for the benefitof current and future generations;
- D. Consider for recognition, adequate monetary and other material compensation, all heroes and heroines of our national freedom struggles as stipulated below:
 - i) They be given land for their own and their families' settlement because many remain landless despite their major role in the liberation struggle
 - ii) They be awarded some ex-gratia payment as an appreciation for this role


- iii) The living Mau Mau freedom fighters be awarded pensions to see them through their twilight years
- iv) The heroes and heroines of the struggle be accorded representation in the National Assembly
- v) That monuments in honour of the struggles and the heroes and heroines of these wars be erected especially in areas that the Mau Mau freedom fighters were exiled, underwent hard labour or lost their lives in large numbers
- vi) That a freedom and unity university be set up in the country to promote research on nationalism and culture
- vii) That land confiscated from the Mau Mau freedom fighters and their sympathisers during the liberation war be returned or alternative land be granted in compensation
- viii) That the role of the Mau Mau detainees and prisoners in carrying out development work such as the construction of the old Embakasi airport, the Mwea Irrigation Scheme and the Yatta Canal through hard labour, be recognised and appreciated.

The Petition was committed to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs pursuant to provisions of Standing Order 227. The Committee considered the petition on the Mau Mau war veterans and the recognition of the armed struggle.

2.0 BACKGROUND

2.1 PETITION ON THE MAU MAU WAR VETERANS AND THE RECOGNITION OF THE ARMED STRUGGLE

The petition signed by ten citizens on behalf of sixty one thousand, three hundred and thirty (61,330) Mau Mau war veterans from all the counties of the Republic of Kenya and addressed to the National Assembly, seeking the Members support in the recognition of the Mau Mau war veterans and of the armed struggle.

3.0 CONSIDERATION OF THE PETITION BY THE COMMITTEE

In its sitting held on the the 17th March 2015 at Boardroom, 2nd Floor Protection House, the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs considered the petition and interacted with the petitioners.

3.1 Committee's Observations and Findings

Upon due consideration and review of the petition, the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs was of the view that:


- i. The issues raised in the petition are genuine and deserve serious attention of the nation of Kenya. The Committee was unanimous that it is high time that the concerns of the Mau Mau veterans are brought to a foreclosure once and for all.
- ii. The Committee also observed that in addressing the issues, order of priority be made so that the government may be given reasonable time in planning the structures of redress to the views and issues raised in the petition.
- iii. In achieving the roadmap towards the planning and addressing of the issues raised, the Committee observed that it would be important if Committee comprising of different actors was formed, which would look into the issues and outline the agenda towards addressing the issues raised.

4.0 RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE

Having considered the petition in line with the Constitution and the provisions of the Petitions to Parliament (Procedure) Act, and the Standing orders of the National Assembly, the Committee recommended that:

- 1. A committee be established to document the history of Kenya and to collect views of those who were affected during the struggle for liberation and those who participated in the struggle.
- 2. The Committee in their mandate, and in furtherance of recommendation No. 1 above, will look into ways of connecting one generation to another through the well documented history. The Committee will be responsible for documenting the history of liberation of Kenya.
- 3. The National Government to erect monuments of the war veterans in order to remember our history.
- 4. A university be established in honour of the liberation heroes, and among other faculties, the universities will specialize in courses of history, research, leadership, governance and patriotism.
- 5. The Committee to be funded by the national government through the Ministry concerned with culture and national heritage and carry out all the necessary logistical and advisory role on matters to do with the Mau Mau, and in particular, the matters raised in this petition.

The Committee considered the petition and resolved that the Member who presented the petition, Hon. Chris Omulele, be invited to appear before the Committee at an appropriate time.

MIN No.JLA . /2016:-CONSIDERATION OF A PETITION BY THE LUSENO FAMILY ON ALLEGED MURDER OF GLADYS RITHO

The Committee resolved that before making any recommendations on the petition, it would be appropriate to first seek more information from the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) and the Attorney General.

MIN No.JLA./2016:-CONSIDERATION OF A PETITION BY HON. SABINA CHEGE, MP, ON BEHALF OF THE FAMILY OF THE LATE STEPHEN MBII KIERU

The Petition which was presented to the National Assembly by Hon. Sabina Chege, MP and member for Muranga County on behalf of the family of Stephen Mbiu Kieru (deceased) and fifteen (15) citizens sought compensation for the death of their bread winner as a result of a terrorist attack. The Committee recommended that the Attorney General should liase with other State Agencies to formulate a policy and Legislation to establish a Compensation fund for the victims of terror attacks.

MIN No.JLA . /2016:-

CONSIDERATION OF A PETITION BY RESIDENTS OF THARAKA NITHI COUNTY ON ALLEGED NON-REFUNDED CASH BAILS BY MARIMANTI LAW COURTS

The Petition on alleged non-refunded cash bails by Marimanti Law Courts was presented to the National Assembly by Hon. Beatrice Nkatha Nyaga, MP and member for Tharaka Nithi County on behalf of the residents of Tharaka Nithi County. The Petitioner prays that the National Assembly:

- a. Commences inquiry into the unclear circumstances cash bails due to be refunded to the petitioners have not been paid long after their cases were heard and determined by the court.
- b. Intervenes to ensure that the Judiciary reimburses the petitioners the cash bail owed, together with accrued interest as computed from the date the cases were determined and disciplinary action be instituted against any officer (s) who obstructed payment of the said cash bail refunds in one way or another, have the Government provide social assistance to the family and other victims of terror attacks for the loss of livelihood, injuries and any properties.

After lengthy deliberations, the Committee recommended the following:

- a. That, the outstanding cash bails be refunded by the Judiciary in the current financial year 2015/2016 Supplementary Budget Estimates.
- b. That, the Directorate of Criminal Investigations should conclude its investigations expeditiously and take legal action against persons who may have fraudulently contributed to non-refund of cash bails by Marimanti Law Courts.

The Committee went through the Petition and resolved that it should first seek more information on the status of an active matter before a Meru Court before consideration of the Petition.

The Petition was presented to the National Assembly by Hon. Abdullahi Mohamed Diriye, Member of Parliament for Wajir South Constituency on behalf of the Citizens of Kenya referring themselves as the National Victims and Survivors Network.

The Petitioners pray that the National Assembly:

- a. Prioritizes debate on the TJRC Report tabled in the House on 24th July 2013.
- b. Enacts necessary legislation required to anchor the implementation of the recommendations contained therein.
- c. Allocates sufficient funds for the immediate and effective implementation and recommendations contained in the Report.

d. The relevant committee of the House monitors the comprehensive and effective implementation of the Report.

The Committee recommended that the TJRC Report be committed to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs for consideration and thereafter report to the House for debate.


We the undersigned, citizens of Kenyan on behalf of 61330 Mau Mau War Veterans from all counties of the republic of Kenya:







MIN No.JLA./2016:-CONSIDERATION OF A PETITION BY THE LUSENO FAMILY ON ALLEGED MURDER OF GLADYS RITHO

The Committee resolved that before making any recommendations on the petition, it would be appropriate to first seek more information from the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) and the Attorney General.

MIN No.JLA . /2016:-CONSIDERATION OF A PETITION BY HON. SABINA CHEGE, MP, ON BEHALF OF THE FAMILY OF THE LATE STEPHEN MBII KIERU

The Petition which was presented to the National Assembly by Hon. Sabina Chege, MP and member for Muranga County on behalf of the family of Stephen Mbiu Kieru (deceased) and fifteen (15) citizens sought compensation for the death of their bread winner as a result of a terrorist attack. The Committee recommended that the Attorney General should liase with other State Agencies to formulate a policy and Legislation to establish a Compensation fund for the victims of terror attacks.

MIN No.JLA . /2016:-CONSIDERATION OF A PETITION BY RESIDENTS OF THARAKA NITHI COUNTY ON ALLEGED NON-REFUNDED CASH BAILS BY MARIMANTI LAW COURTS

The Petition on alleged non-refunded cash bails by Marimanti Law Courts was presented to the National Assembly by Hon. Beatrice Nkatha Nyaga, MP and member for Tharaka Nithi County on behalf of the residents of Tharaka Nithi County. The Petitioner prays that the National Assembly:

- a. Commences inquiry into the unclear circumstances cash bails due to be refunded to the petitioners have not been paid long after their cases were heard and determined by the court.
- b. Intervenes to ensure that the Judiciary reimburses the petitioners the cash bail owed, together with accrued interest as computed from the date the cases were determined and disciplinary action be instituted against any officer (s) who obstructed payment of the said cash bail refunds in one way or another, have the Government provide social assistance to the family and other victims of terror attacks for the loss of livelihood, injuries and any properties.

After lengthy deliberations, the Committee recommended the following:

- a. That, the outstanding cash bails be refunded by the Judiciary in the current financial year 2015/2016 Supplementary Budget Estimates.
- b. That, the Directorate of Criminal Investigations should conclude its investigations expeditiously and take legal action against persons who may have fraudulently contributed to non-refund of cash bails by Marimanti Law Courts.

The Petition was presented to the National Assembly by Hon. Abdullahi Mohamed Diriye, Member of Parliament for Wajir South Constituency on behalf of the Citizens of Kenya referring themselves as the National Victims and Survivors Network. The Petitioners pray that the National Assembly:

- a. Prioritizes debate on the TJRC Report tabled in the House on 24th July 2013.
- b. Enacts necessary legislation required to anchor the implementation of the recommendations contained therein.
- c. Allocates sufficient funds for the immediate and effective implementation and recommendations contained in the Report.

d. The relevant committee of the House monitors the comprehensive and effective implementation of the Report.

The Committee recommended that the TJRC Report be committed to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs for consideration and thereafter report to the House for debate.
