1. PREFACE

Hon Speaker,

On behalf of the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs, and pursuant to provisions of Standing Order 199(6), it is my pleasant privilege and honour to present to this House a report of the Committee on the Political Parties (Amendment) Bill, 2015.

The Committee derives its mandate from Standing Order No. 216(5) which provides as follows:-

- a) To investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;
- b) To study the programme and policy objectives of ministries and departments and the effectiveness of their implementation;
- c) To study and review all legislation referred to it;
- d) To study, assess and analyze the relative success of the ministries and departments measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
- e) To investigate and enquire into all matters relating to the assigned ministries and departments as may be deemed necessary, and as may be referred to it by the House or a minister; and
- f) To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendations of proposed legislation.

The Second Schedule of the Standing Orders on Departmental Committees further states the subjects which the Committee is supposed to deal with while discharging its mandate. The subjects are as follows:-

- (a) Constitutional affairs;
- (b) The administration of law and Justice, including the Judiciary, public prosecutions, elections, ethics, integrity and anti-corruption; and
- (c) Human rights.

1.3. First Reading of the Political Parties (Amendment) Bill, 2015

The Political Parties (Amendment) Bill, 2015 was read for the first time on 4th March, 2015 and immediately committed to the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs for scrutiny in line with Standing Order 127 (1) which states as follows:-

"A Bill having been read a First Time shall stand committed to the relevant Departmental Committee without question being put to it"

1.4. Public participation in the consideration of the Bill

The Committee considered and adopted its report on 21st July, 2015 at 10.00 a.m. at sitting held in the Boardroom on 5th floor, Continental House, Parliament Buildings. The adoption of the report was proposed by Hon. Benson Mutura and seconded by Hon. George Kaluma. There was no dissenting voice to the adoption of the report. Minutes of the Committee's sitting adopting the report are annexed hereto as appendix 1. A list of Members who attended the sitting is also annexed hereto as appendix 2.

2.0. BACKGROUND

The Bill is dated 20th May, 2014 and its sponsor is Hon. Chris W. Wamalwa, Member for Kiminini.

The principle objective of the Bill is to amend the Political Parties Act to reflect the purpose for which the Fund was established. The Fund was intended to enable political parties carry out their programmes without influence of individuals who fund them with the aim of taking over, personalizing them and dictating everything to members, contrary to principals of democracy and good governance.

The amendment thus seeks to ensure that Political Parties Fund is made available to all parties irrespective of size and or are unable to secure at least five per cent of the total votes in a preceding general election.

3.0. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN THE CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL

Standing Order 127(3) provides as follows:-

"The Departmental Committee to which a Bill is committed shall facilitate public participation and shall take into account the views and recommendations of the public when the Committee makes its recommendations to the House"

Pursuant to this Standing Order, the Committee invited the public through the Daily Nation and Standard newspapers of 9th March, 2015 to make representations on the Bill. The newspaper advertisement is annexed hereto as appendix 3. The Committee did not however receive any memoranda.

4.0. CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL

The Committee considered the Bill on 2nd July, 2015 at the Media Centre in Parliament Buildings where Members observed as follows:-

- Funding all political parties irrespective of size and votes garnered is not viable considering available resources usually set aside for political parties;
- (ii) Funding of all political parties is likely to be abused as people will form parties purely for financial and not the political gain it is intended for;
- (iii) The funding of all political parties goes against the spirit of competitive politics which is not healthy for the country's political development;

(iv) The Bill if enacted will lead to segmentation of bigger parties thereby weakening them whereas strong political parties are required to ensure democracy and good governance.

5.0. RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee recommends that the House rejects the Bill on account of the cited reasons.
