# **REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE YEAR 1965**

## **REVIEW OF THE YEAR**

The volume of work dealt with by the Department once more showed a substantial over-all increase.

Registrations of new companies during the year continued at the same high level as in the previous year and it is encouraging to note that the proportion of African participation in new company formation showed a substantial increase and for the first time almost matched the shares of the other communities. Once again the number of new African firms registered under the Registration of Business Names Act was in excess of those formed by members of all other communities.

A good indication of the increased volume of registration work with which the Department now has to deal is that as a result of the expansion of the compulsory registration scheme, the number of births registered during the year was more than four times that of the comparative figure three years previously.

Once again it is satisfactory to record that the only branch of the Department's activities in which a downward trend was noticeable was in bankruptcy and company liquidation, where the number of Receiving Orders and Winding-up Orders made during the year was again less than in the previous year, whilst the total estimated deficiency in these cases was also substantially lower than in 1964.

## **COMPANIES SECTION**

The section comprises the registries of Companies, Business Names, Limited Partnerships, Trade Marks, Patents and Chattels Transfers.

The number of new companies, both public and private, incorporated during the year was 427, the same figure as in the previous year. The amount of nominal capital of new companies, together with increases in capital of existing companies, showed a reduction with a total of £14,759,659 as compared with £17,029,495 in 1964.

There were 38 foreign companies registered and 21 such companies removed from the register during the year.

A total of 5,611 locally incorporated companies were on the register at 31st December 1965 of which 316 were public and 5,295 were private. The number of foreign companies on the register stood at 653 at the end of the year, showing an increase of 17 compared with the previous year.

Of the new companies incorporated in the year, 34 per cent were formed by members of the Asian community, 28 per cent by the European community, 24 per cent by the African community, and 14 per cent by persons of two or more communal groups. The corresponding figures for the previous year were European 36 per cent, Asian 35 per cent, African 19 per cent, and European, Asian and African 10 per cent.

## **BUSINESS NAMES**

The registration of new businesses was slightly down with 1,620 firms registered, compared with 1,739 in 1964 but the number of changes registered in particulars of existing businesses was 818 compared with 809 in the previous year. Two hundred and nine business names were removed from the register during the year, leaving a total of 29,913 on the register at the end of the year.

## **CHATELS TRANSFERS**

The volume of borrowing on security by way of chattels transfers rose by £646,085, the total amount borrowed being £4,024,182. A total of 13,901 new instruments and 906 satisfactions were registered.

## **PATENTS AND TRADE MARKS REGISTRY**

There was a slight increase in the number of patent registrations, whilst the increase in initial trade mark applications and related incidental matters was substantial. There was, however, a proportionate decrease in the number of trade marks actually registered due to a change of staff in the section.

Of the 20 applications shown as withdrawn, abandoned or refused, two were refused registration (in one case under section 3 of the National Flag, Emblems and Names Act 1963), whilst 11 applications were withdrawn after the advertisement stage and seven applications were withdrawn after opposition proceedings had been commenced.

In addition to the above figures, two applications which were the subject of opposition proceedings during the previous year were registered and 13 applications were still the subject of an opposition at the end of the year.

### **Trade Marks**

Statistics relating to the general work of the Trade Marks and Patents Registry, with comparative figures for the last decade, are shown in Appendix VI. Five hundred and twenty-two trade marks were registered during the year, an increase of 73 on the comparative figure of 449 for 1964. Registrations effected still continue to disclose the same lively interest of applicants in most sections of the patent medicine and chemical trades. The number of initial applications received, that is 892, also showed a substantial increase of 268, or 42 per cent over the corresponding 1964 figure of 624. The number of trade marks on the register as at 31st December 1965 was 12,345.

### **Patents**

There is as yet no machinery for the original registration of patents in Kenya, only for the re-registration of patents previously granted in the United Kingdom. This registration has the effect of extending the patentee's rights to the patent in Kenya.

Arrangements for the setting up of a registry of patents on an East African basis under the East African Common Services Organization were examined during the year by a Working Party consisting of the Registrar-General and his colleagues in the other East African territories, together with representatives of the Organization, but their recommendations were still under consideration at the end of the year.

During the year 40 of these patents were registered, making a total of 1,445 on the register as at 31st December 1965. The number of live patents for the same period was 877.

## BIRTHS, DEATHS AND MARRIAGES SECTION

This section carries out the work connected with the Registrar-General's duties as Registrar-General of Births and Deaths and of Marriages under the Births and Deaths Registration Act, the Legitimacy Act, the Adoption Act, the Marriage Act and the African Christian Marriage and Divorce Act.

### Vital Statistics

Considerable progress was made during the year under the phased programme for spreading the areas of compulsory registration of births and deaths throughout Kenya and in consolidating registration procedures in those areas which were already the subject of compulsory registration orders. Registration of births and deaths was made compulsory on 1st July, in Bungoma, Mombasa and Kwale districts and in Nakuru Municipality.

In Bungoma the work of registration was placed under the direct supervision of a member of the staff of the Department appointed as Registrar at District Headquarters, the registration function in the field being undertaken by schoolmasters and Health Department personnel appointed as Deputy Registrars. In Mombasa the considerable task of undertaking registration in the district was accepted by the Medical Officer of Health of the Municipal Council of Mombasa, whilst in Nakuru, with the co-operation of the Municipality, registrations were undertaken by the staff of the Town Clerk. In Kwale, although schoolmasters were appointed Deputy Registrars, it had not proved possible by the end of the year to make fully effective arrangements for registration throughout the district.

By the end of the year, however, the machinery of registration was working satisfactorily in all the other areas and this factor was largely responsible for the total of births and deaths registrations effected throughout the country for the first time exceeding a figure of 50,000. It is clear, however, that a considerable number of deaths are not being reported to Deputy Registrars in the field and consideration is being given to simplifying the procedure in order to ensure that a greater proportion of such deaths are reported in the future. The opportunity was taken during the year to simplify the birth registration form and it was found possible at the end of the year to make arrangements for the Department to take over from the Statistics Division of the Ministry of Economic Planning and Development the machine work needed to produce registration statistics. By utilizing a new procedure for punching coded information from registration forms on to a tape, it will in future be possible to make use of the Government's computer system which will be much quicker and more efficient than the card-punching procedure formerly used.

From the data recorded in respect of the Nairobi and Nyeri areas, it has been possible to estimate crude live birth rates for the year as follows:—

The comparative figures for the previous year were 36.9 per thousand for Nairobi and 15.0 per thousand in Nyeri. Similar figures for Bungoma District and for the Mombasa and Nakuru Municipal areas based on the six-month period from 1st July to 31st December 1965 for which figures are available, were as follows:—

The explanation for the low rate in Bungoma lies, no doubt, in the fact that the need to register all births may not yet be known throughout the district. In the case of Nakuru, many persons normally resident outside the municipal area give birth to children in institutions within the area. In some cases the fact that the mother is not a resident of Nakuru may be concealed because non-residents pay a larger fee than do residents.

In calculating these and other rates, it will, of course, be appreciated that the longer the period that has elapsed since the last Kenya census, the less accurate will be the estimated population base upon which the rates are calculated.

A table of vital rates for the five compulsory registration areas showing figures in the case of Nairobi and Nyeri, both for 1964 and 1965, is annexed as Appendix IX (a). Whilst an age-limited birth rate is included in the table, it is clear that, save in the case of Nairobi, the effect of substantial under-registration, coupled with the now doubtful basic population data upon which the figures have necessarily had to be calculated, produces figures which have at present little real significance.

In regard to deaths, the crude death rate for 1965 for Nairobi was 8.9 per thousand, whilst infant mortality rate in respect of deaths under six months was 49.8. As these figures show little variation from the figures for the previous year of 8.1 and 49.6 respectively, they would suggest a degree of reliability which is lacking in the other areas. Comparative figures for Mombasa based only on registrations during the second half of the year were 11.2 and 66.2 respectively. Although comparative figures are shown in the appendix for Nyeri and Bungoma, they cannot be relied upon since, as stated above, it is clear that a large number of deaths in these areas have not been reported.

So far as country-wide statistics were concerned, current registrations of African births increased from 14,551 in 1964 to 25,576, whilst the registration of other births during the year totalled 7,173 as compared with 7,985 in 1964.

Late registrations of birth increased to 5,672 during the year, from a total of 5,562 in the previous year, whilst some 20,000 certified copies of entries in the registers of births and deaths were issued, compared with a total of 19,643 during 1964.

The analysis of deaths registered during the year was based on the Intermediate List of the International Classification of Diseases, Injuries and Causes of Deaths. Most deaths (1,870) were under the class Broncho-pneumonia, followed by Gastro-enteritis and Colitis (1,332).

### **Marriages**

The number of marriages celebrated under the Marriage Act and the African Christian Marriage and Divorce Act was 8,748, an increase of 238 over the total for the previous year, which was 8,510.

### **PUBLIC TRUSTEE SECTION**

This section carries out the administration of estates of deceased persons under the Public Trustee Act and the management of trusts accepted under such Act. In the majority of cases the Public Trustee undertakes the administration of those estates where the assets are unadministered either because there is no heir who is prepared or is available to apply for letters of administration or because the executor or administrator previously appointed has died or cannot be traced. In some cases the Public Trustee is specifically appointed to be an executor by a testator but in such cases the consent of the Public

Trustee is required at the time of making the will. The advantages of appointing the Public Trustee to be an executor are, first, that there is guaranteed continuity of office by virtue of the Public Trustee's status as a corporation sole, and secondly, the fees charged by the Public Trustee for undertaking and completing the administration of estates are strictly regulated by statute and are not, therefore, subject to rapid change.

In addition, the Public Trustee undertakes the administration of trust estates. In many cases where a minor is entitled to a legacy or share of the assets of a deceased person and not infrequently, where an award is made by a court to a person not of full age, the executor or administrator, with the consent of the Public Trustee or the court, as the case may be, transfers such legacy, share or award to the Public Trustee, who establishes a trust with it. This is administered by the Public Trustee until the whole trust fund is paid over to the former minor upon his or her attaining the age of majority.

The Public Trustee also administers trust estates which contain no provision for their maturing after the expiration of a stipulated period and for the trust funds then being paid over to particular beneficiaries. Common examples of such trusts are those which are set up for purposes such as the furtherance of education, charity, recreation, etc. The duration of such trusts is by their nature frequently extremely lengthy. In such cases the fact that the Public Trustee is a corporation sole is particularly useful as the trust funds vest in the holder of the office and not in individual trustees. Consequently, the delay and expense involved in the transfer of the funds from individual trustees to their successors in office are obviated.

The Public Trustee is also from time to time appointed manager of the estates of persons of unsound mind under the Mental Treatment Act, and is required to make an annual report on accounts submitted by other managers during the course of each year.

Seven hundred and one estates of deceased persons were accepted during the year, reflecting an increase of 31 in relation to the comparative figure for the previous year. Thirty-four trusts were accepted, reflecting an increase of nine over the previous year. The number of estates finalized and distributed was 521 as against 598 in 1964. The gross value of all estates distributed during 1965 was £102,196 as against £235,086 in 1964. Details of payments to creditors and beneficiaries may be found at Appendix XV and details of assets held by the Public Trustee as at 31st December 1965 may be found at Appendix XXXIV.

## **BANKRUPTCY AND COMPANIES LIQUIDATION SECTION**

This section deals with bankruptcies, the compulsory winding up of companies and the registration of Deeds of Arrangement.

### **Bankruptcies**

During the year 23 Receiving Orders were made against 25 debtors—some Receiving Orders cover more than one debtor—of which six were made at Mombasa, six at Kisumu and 11 at Nairobi. This shows a slight decline over the previous year's figures. One Receiving Order made at Nairobi was subsequently rescinded and a composition scheme of another debtor was approved by the court. As at the end of the year five bankruptcy petitions filed by creditors were pending in court. The total amount of deficiency as estimated by the debtors concerned was £64,868, which appears to be lower than the previous year's figures, but this is partly due to the fact that Statements of Affairs have not been submitted in two cases where the debtors absconded prior

to the making of the Receiving Orders. Of the 24 debtors concerned (i.e. excluding the debtor whose Receiving Order was rescinded), 23 were Asian and one African. The classification of their respective occupations is shown at Appendix XIX. The assets realized during the year from debtors' estates and the debtors' contribution from their after-acquired income amounted to £77,393. From these moneys a sum of £46,449 was distributed in dividends to proved creditors. Fifteen debtors were prosecuted for various bankruptcy offences and in eight cases convictions were obtained.

Ninety-five discharge applications were made by debtors and of these none was granted unconditional discharge, 83 were suspended and/or conditionally discharged, ten were refused and two were adjourned.

#### **Company Liquidation**

Five winding-up orders were made by the court during the year, all of them at Nairobi. The Official Receiver was confirmed as the liquidator in five cases, some of which related to proceedings instituted in previous years. Companies in liquidation comprised two trading in general merchandise, two in properties, whilst one was a coffee plantation.

#### **Deeds of Arrangement**

No Deed of Arrangement was registered during the year.

#### **Bankruptcy Contingency Fund and Companies Contingency Fund**

The Income and Expenditure Accounts for these funds for the year 1965 and the Balance Sheets as at 31st December 1965 are set out as Appendix XX, XXI, XXIV and XXV respectively.

### **BANKS, BUILDING SOCIETIES AND INSURANCE COMPANIES SECTION**

#### **Banks**

No new banks were licensed during the year 1965.

A schedule of the banks, hire finance companies and other companies which have been granted banking licences under the provisions of the Banking Act is set out in Appendix XXIX. It may be noted that the following companies are licensed to conduct banking business, although they are not in fact accepting deposits from the public:—

United Dominions Corporation (E.A.) Ltd.

Standard Bank Finance and Development Corporation.

Bank of Tokyo Ltd.

Statistics covering the operation of commercial banks in Kenya are published in the Kenya Statistical Abstract and the Statistical Supplement of the Kenya Trade and Supplies Bulletin. It is, therefore, considered unnecessary to reproduce such data in this Report.

#### **Building Societies**

There is only one building society, known as the East African Building Society, operating in Kenya. Statistics relating to this society are set out in Appendix XXX.

The Kentanda Mutual Building Society was wound up during 1965 and a total of Sh. 19,572/75 was transferred to Government Account, to be kept in trust until such time as the depositors came forward to claim their respective balances.

Up to the end of 1965 a total of Sh. 1,460/50 was paid out to the depositors.



## **Insurance Companies**

At 31st December 1965, 96 insurers were licensed to conduct insurance business in Kenya. During the year five companies ceased writing business and two licences were issued to new insurers. Of the five insurers ceasing to write new business, all have continued to maintain offices in Kenya, but have ceased to issue new policies of insurance.

Statistics showing the countries of origin of insurers and the class of insurance business which they conduct may be found at Appendix XXXI (a) and (b).

## **ESTATE DUTY SECTION**

As in 1964 this section has had during the year to deal with assessments under two classes; those on estates which passed before the suspension of the application of the former Estate Duty Ordinance in 1959 and which have not been finalized, and those on estates which have passed since 12th June 1963 when the Estate Duty Act was re-introduced. The data given in Appendix XXVII has been so arranged as to indicate under which of the two statutes assessments have been raised.

During the year 446 assessments were raised under the Act and the duty assessed amounted to £223,829. Seven assessments were raised under the Ordinance and the duty assessed was £325.

Of the total number of estates passing and assessed under the Act, no liability for duty arose in 319 estates, i.e. 71.5 per cent, as the net value in each case did not exceed £5,000. The remaining 127 estates (comprising 28.5 per cent) attracted duty at percentages varying from two to 19. The corresponding figures for the estates assessed and passing under the Ordinance were six and one respectively.

Corrective accounts were received in 94 estates. Of these 84 were subject to the provisions of the Act and ten to the provisions of the Ordinance. They attracted additional duty to the value of £21,078 and £1,076 respectively.

In 34 estates refunds were made during the year. Of these 32 were subject to the provisions of the Act and two to the provisions of the Ordinance. The duty refunded amounted to £20,050 and £1,189 respectively.

In two estates—one passing under the Act and the other passing under the Ordinance—the duty is being paid by instalments. On re-assessment being made the assessed amounts were reduced by £4,493 and £323 respectively.

The net amount of duty collected during the year was £180,433.

## **TRADE UNIONS SECTION**

There were 61 unions on the register at the end of the year, comprising 46 employees' and 15 employers' unions. A breakdown of these unions consisted of—employees'—one African, three Asian, four European and 38 with mixed membership. Employers'—one African and 14 with mixed membership.

During the year six new trade unions were registered, namely, Tobacco Senior and Supervisory Employees' Association (Probationary), Kenya Union of Musicians, Kenya African Workers' Congress, East African Cargo Handling Services Ltd., Management and Supervisory Overseas Staff Association (Probationary), Kenya Union of Commercial, Food and Allied Workers and the

Mombasa and Coast Tailors Employers' Association. One of the newly registered unions, the Union of Commercial, Food and Allied Workers, was formed by the amalgamation of four registered unions, namely the Kenya Distributive and Commercial Workers' Union, Tobacco, Brewing and Bottling Workers' Union, the Kenya Dyers, Cleaners and Laundry Workers' Union and Tobacco Workers' Union. As a result of the amalgamation the names of the four separate trade unions were removed from the register. Registration of branches proceeded satisfactorily during the year, with a total of 261 branches registered.

The dissolution of five trade unions, namely the Master Plumbers' Association of East Africa, Asian Postal Union, Nairobi City Council African Staff Association, Eldoret Local Government Service Association and the Nairobi Second Branch of the Transport and Allied Workers' Union was registered during the year.

Applications for registration from seven trade unions were refused. Four of these applications were received from break-away factions of registered trade unions, the other applications being received from School Workers' Progressive Union, Kenya National Contractors Employers' Union, the Tea Plantation Workers' Union, all of which were refused registration on the grounds that there were trade unions already registered which sufficiently represented the whole or a substantial proportion of the interests in respect of which the applicants sought registration. None of the unions appealed against refusal of registration.

One employees' trade union registered a change of name, Airline Officers' Association (Nairobi Group) becoming the Airline Officers' Association.

Amendments to the rules of 15 unions were registered during the year.

On 8th June 1965 some important amendments were made to the Trade Unions Act by virtue of the enactment of the Trade Disputes Act 1965. A new definition of a trade union was introduced so as to include any association or combination of trade unions, thus making the Federation of Kenya Employers and the then Kenya Federation of Labour, hitherto registered as societies under the Societies Act, trade unions. These amendments now make it an offence for any person to act or to purport to act as an officer of a trade union or any branch thereof who is not registered with the Registrar as an officer of such trade union or branch. A system of compulsory check-off was introduced enabling the Minister for Labour to make an order, with respect to any trade union of employees, requiring any employer who employs not less than five members of that trade union to make deductions on behalf of such union.

The Kenya Federation of Labour and the Kenya African Workers' Congress were both de-registered following recommendations of a Presidential Ministerial Committee on Trade Unionism in Kenya appointed by His Excellency the President on 23rd June 1965. A new organization to be known as the Central Organization of Trade Unions (Kenya) was to be formed to replace the two. The Committee also recommended nation-wide elections of officials for all trade unions starting at branch level. The elections, mostly completed by the end of September 1965 resulted in three cases being referred to a Trade Unions Tribunal. The unions involved were the Kenya Shoe and Leather Workers' Union, the Nairobi branch of the Transport and Allied Workers' Union and the Nairobi branch of the Federation of Building and Construction Workers' Union. The cases were still pending at the end of the year. Two other notices of change of officers were also referred to a Trade Union Tribunal; a notice of change of officers dated 8th December 1965 of the Common Services African Civil Servants'

Union (Kenya) which was not settled during the year and another notice dated 25th November 1964 in respect of the Kenya Engineering Workers' Union. The claimants in the latter case withdrew the said notice and the Tribunal directed that officials notified to the Registrar before the submission of this notice would be deemed to be the proper officers of the union.

The secretaries of seven trade unions were prosecuted for failing to submit their unions' annual returns for 1964 and each of these prosecutions resulted in convictions with fines being imposed upon the secretaries. A person was successfully prosecuted for improperly acting or purporting to act as an officer of the Nairobi branch of the East African Federation of Building and Construction Workers' Union. On conviction the accused was fined Sh. 200 or one month's imprisonment in default.

One union, the Kenya National Union of Teachers, was suspended on 16th December 1965 for failing to submit its annual returns for 1964 despite a prosecution brought against its General Secretary in the same year for the same offence.

During the course of the year officers of the Trade Unions Section carried out inspections of 148 sets of trade union books of account, comprising accounts of seven head offices and 141 branches. In addition to inspections carried out in Nairobi, inspections were also carried out in Mombasa, Embu, Nyeri and Nanyuki. Although no prosecutions were preferred against any of the trade union officials as a result of the inspections, in a number of cases it was found necessary to make further inquiries of a union's headquarters.

As appears from the above, the year 1965 was an eventful one for the trade union movement in the country and members of the staff of the Trade Unions Registry were kept extremely busy throughout the year.

Details of the book and voting membership of the trade unions on the register, with particulars of their income and expenditure as shown by their annual returns, are set out in Appendix XXVIII hereto. The totals of the book and voting members of employee trade unions were 295,123 and 294,921 respectively, whilst the employer trade unions had a total of 890 book members and 890 voting members respectively.

## **SOCIETIES, BOOKS AND NEWSPAPERS SECTION**

### **Societies**

At the end of the year there were 2,587 registered societies and 1,217 societies which were exempted from registration.

New registrations during the year totalled 383 and in the same period 116 societies were granted exemption from registration. Comparative figures for 1964 were 469 registrations and 87 exemptions.

A total of 72 societies were refused registration whilst two societies had their exemptions rescinded. Registration of 11 societies was cancelled—mainly for failure to comply with orders served under the provisions of the Societies Act and 508 societies had their registration/exemption cancelled on the ground that they no longer existed.

The exercise to check up on societies which were overdue with returns, etc., was stepped up and showed that a vast number of societies had in fact dissolved without notifying the department. These societies were asked to prove their existence in the normal way, and, having failed to do so, they were cancelled. This exercise has been the main cause of the sharp rise in the number of cancellations.

The problems of former years, i.e. the inability of office bearers to complete satisfactory applications for registration and the consequent need for repetitive instructions, were still encountered to the same degree despite the fact that detailed instructions on the correct procedure are issued to all prospective societies.

### **Books and Newspapers**

A total of 64 newspapers were registered at the end of the year but this figure does not accurately represent the number of newspapers actively in existence as some of those still registered did not publish during the year. Eleven new registrations were effected and eight newspapers ceased publication. The total number of books registered now stands at 462, the majority being religious and/or educational and of this total 184 were registered during the year under review. Of the new registrations, 100 were printed in English, 75 were in a vernacular and nine were in English/vernacular.

## **ACCOUNTS SECTION**

### **Revenue and Expenditure**

Fees collected by the department in respect of its various services totalled £72,989 and miscellaneous revenue amounted to £672. A further £201,673 was collected in respect of Estate Duty, but a total sum of £21,239 was paid out by way of duty refunded or remitted. The total expenditure of the department on personal emoluments and other charges was £66,695, a decrease of £5,350 on the total of the previous year.

### **Establishment**

During the year the department lost the services of a number of senior expatriate officers, both in the professional and executive grades, of whom the majority had long experience in the specialized work of the department. That there has been no significant reduction in output of work or over-all standards is due to the sustained efforts throughout the year of the remaining staff members who have cheerfully borne the heavy burden which they have necessarily had to carry.

On the resignation of Mr. R. H. Lownie in February 1965, Mr. O. J. Burns, B.L. (Edin.), was appointed Deputy Registrar-General.
