# CHAPTER ONE: INTRODUCTION

#### Background

Pursuant to the Senate Standing Orders No. 220 (1) (b) Senator Peter Mositet, M.P., Senator for Kajiado County, presented a Petition on Olmorogi Parcel of Land- P. No. 21400 to the Senate on behalf of Members of Keekonyokie Community Trust on 16<sup>th</sup> June, 2015.

The Committee held deliberative meetings with the Principal Secretary in the State Department of Livestock, within the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries; and the Chairman, National Land Commission.

The Committee received documents during and after the deliberative sessions with the Principal Secretary in the State Department of Livestock, in the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries; and the Chairman, National Land Commission.

The Minutes of these sessions as well as the documents and evidences presented to the Committee are annexed to this report.

#### The Petition

The Petition drew the attention of the Senate to the following issues:

- THAT, Olmorogi parcel of land P. No. 21400 Ngong/Ngong was gazetted on 5<sup>th</sup> March, 1957 in Gazette No. 3818 under Section 12 of the Application Notice;
- 2. THAT, the parcel of land was set aside by the Veterinary Department for the establishment of a Livestock Veterinary Farm and Training Centre to improve livestock farming among the inhabitants of the area;
- 3. THAT, the land is approximately 1510 acres;
- 4. THAT, over the years, the land has changed purpose from the original and intended purpose;
- 5. THAT, fifty years down the line the land has not been productive and the natives have not benefited from it or from the project for which the said parcel of land was intended;
- 6. THAT, the planned and approved use of the said parcel has been changed severally unprocedurally.

The Petitioners prayed that the Senate intervenes with a view to:

- 1. Establishing the status of the said parcel of land and having all uncommitted land reverted back to the Keekonyokie Community;
- 2. Ensuring that any land that was irregularly curved from the initial parcel of land is reverted back to the Community;

- 3. Ensuring that all development on the land from other parties other than the Veterinary Department stopped; and
- 4. Ensuring that no further allocation and adjudication of the land by the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries and the Ministry of Land, Housing and Urban Development is permitted.

The Petition was committed to the Standing Committee on Land and Natural Resources on 16<sup>th</sup> June, 2015. The Committee held several meetings with officers from the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries and the National Land Commission.

The Committee held meetings on 3<sup>rd</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> March, 2016 to consider the submissions presented, analyzed the information and made a several recommendations in chapter four.

#### CHAPTER TWO: PRESENTATIONS TO THE COMMITTEE

This section contains the presentations that were made by the Principal Secretary in the State Department of Livestock, in the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries; and the Chairman, National Land Commission.

## 3.1 Response from the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries

- 1. The Principal Secretary (PS), Prof. Fred Segor and the management team from Ngong Veterinary Farm met the Committee on 23<sup>rd</sup> July, 2015 and responded to the petition as follows;
- 2. According to available records, there is no land registered as Olmorogi parcel of land P. NO. 21400 Ngong/Ngong.
- 3. Gazette Notice No. 3818 states the setting apart of land under Section 12 of the Native Lands Trust Ordinance (Cap 100) for use by the Veterinary Department as a Veterinary Farm and Training Centre. This was contained in the Official Gazette Vol. LVIII No. 67 of 18th December, 1956. This Gazette Notice was however cancelled later and replaced with Gazette Notice No. 890 contained in the Kenya Gazette Vol. LIX No. 11 of 5th March, 1957. The land set aside was later registered as Ngong/Ngong/1959.
- 4. As per the Kenya Gazette Notice No.890 of 5th March, 1957 the land set apart for Veterinary Farm and Training Centre at Ngong is approximately 1400 acres. The exact acreage may only be ascertained through surveying.
- 5. Survey work on this farm is at an advanced stage. The Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries has already paid the survey fee to the Ministry of Lands, Housing and Urban Development.
- 6. The land was set apart for use by Veterinary Department as a Veterinary Farm and Training Centre.
- 7. The Veterinary Department's mandate is national and benefits both the local community and the Nation at large. Therefore, he Veterinary Department did not set aside this land for improvement of livestock farming among the inhabitants of the area only but for the entire country.
- 8. The planned and approved use of the land as a Veterinary Farm and Training Centre has been maintained.
- 9. The Ngong Veterinary Farm located on Land Parcel (Ngong/Ngong/21400) houses the following institutions;

- a) AHITI Kabete Satellite Campus for practical training of students in Animal Health and Production;
- b) Ngong Agricultural Training Centre,
- c) National Rabbit Multiplication Centre,
- d) Apiary (Bee Keeping) Promotion Training Centre; and
- e) Leather Science Institute.
- 10. The rest of the portion of land is the current Ngong Veterinary Diagnostics and Efficacy Trial Centre (Ngong Veterinary Farm and Training Centre).
- 11. The statement that the land has not been productive and that natives have not benefited is not true because of the following:
  - a) The efficacy trials done on drugs, vaccines and acaricides are for the benefit of the Local Community and the Country at large.
  - b) The Ngong Veterinary Farm offers practical training ground for Animal Health Students drawn from AHITIs, Colleges and Universities who after graduation provides services on Animal Health, Animal Production and Range Management to the local community and the entire nation.
  - c) The Public Institutions namely, National Rabbit Multiplication Centre, Ngong A.T.C and Bee Keeping Centre have been of great importance to the community.
  - d) The upcoming Leather Science Institute holds great potential in Value Addition of Leather and other animal by products. This will empower the local community and the Country economically.

#### 3.2 Response from the National Land Commission

The Chairman, National Land Commission, Dr. Muhammad Swazuri met the Committee on 19<sup>th</sup> November, 2015 and on 2<sup>nd</sup> December, 2015; and responded to the petition as follows;

- Land Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong 21400 is part of the original land parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/1959 which vide Gazette Notice No, 890 of 3rd March 1957 was set aside as Veterinary Farm and Training Centre. The original acreage for the said land was 1510 acres.
- 2) In 1975, the original parcel No. 1959 was subdivided into 3 parcels, namely Ngong/Ngong/2627, 2628 and 2629 and 2 parcels allocated as follows:
- a) Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/2628, measuring 0.5946 was allocated to Halal Meat Product Limited by the Government for a term of 99 years from 1<sup>st</sup> January 1975.

- On 3<sup>rd</sup> December, 2001 this title was charged to Barclays Bank of Kenya to secure a loan of Ksh. 65, 000, 000/=.
- b) Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/2629, measuring 3.990 Ha was also allocated to Halal Meat product Limited by the Government for a term of 99 years from 1<sup>st</sup> January 1995. Available records also indicate that the land was charged to Barclays Bank of Kenya to secure a loan of Ksh65, 000,000/= on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2001.
- c) Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/2627, remained as veterinary farm and training centre, later it was subdivided/and or resurveyed and given parcel No. 21400.
- 3) A site visit by National Land Commission Surveyors to LR No. Ngong/Ngong/21400 established the land to be approximately 1580 Acres through a perimeter survey.
- 4) The following Institutions were found to be occupying portions of the said land as follows:-

a) Meteorological Department	-	38.47 Ha

- e) A total of 270.99 Ha (669.63 acres) is committed to the above mentioned public institutions and private interest. A balance of 368.41 Ha (910.36 acres) is left for Veterinary Farm and Training Centre.
- f) The National Land Commission is not in a position to state the acreage of unutilized land; this can only be provided by the Ministry of Agriculture, who are in charge of the said veterinary farm.

#### **CHAPTER THREE: OBSERVATIONS**

During the course of consideration of the petition, the Committee made the following observations:

- 1. The land initially set as aside for use by the Veterinary department had only been partially used for the intended purpose;
- 2. There was no evidence that the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries had been consulted when part of the land was hived off;
- 3. Trust land originally set aside for public use had been allocated to private entities irregularly;
- 4. A Cadastral survey to confirm the acreages of the parcel of land had not been concluded;
- 5. There are conflicting details of acreages of the original land; where the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries indicate the acreage as 1510 whereas the National land Commission indicates the acreage as 1580;
- 6. There are other conflicts in acreages arising from the ensuing subdivisions and remainders of the parcel of land.

From the evidence adduced and the observations made, the Committee made the following determinations on the prayers of the petitioners:

**Prayer 1:** Establishing the status of the said land and having all uncommitted land reverted back to the Keekonyokie Community.

- 1. Land Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong 21400 is part of the original land parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/1959 which vide Gazettee Notice No, 890 of 3<sup>rd</sup> March 1957 was set aside as Veterinary Farm and Training Centre. The original acreage for the said land was 1510 acres.
- 2. In 1975, the original parcel No. 1959 was subdivided into 3 parcels, namely Ngong/Ngong/2627, 2628 and 2629 and 2 parcels allocated as follows:
  - a) Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/2628, measuring 0.5946 was allocated to Halal Meat Product Limited by the Government for a term of 99 years from 1<sup>st</sup> January 1975. On 3<sup>rd</sup> December, 2001 this title was charged to Barclays Bank of Kenya to secure a loan of Ksh. 65, 000, 000/=.
  - b) Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/2629, measuring 3.990 Ha was also allocated to Halal Meat product Limited by the Government for a term of 99 years from 1<sup>st</sup> January 1995. Available records also indicate that the land was charged to Barclays Bank of Kenya to secure a loan of Ksh65, 000,000/= on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2001.
  - c) Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/2627, remained as veterinary farm and training centre, later it was subdivided/and or resurveyed.

**Prayer 2:** Ensuring that any land that was irregularly curved from the initial parcel of land is reverted back to the Community

A total of 270.99 Ha (669.63 acres) of the original parcel of land No. 1959 was allocated to public and private entities under unclear circumstances.

**Prayer 3:** Ensuring that all development on the land from other parties other than the Veterinary Department stopped.

The Committee noted that the National Land Commission is mandated by law to stop developments on the land by other parties other than those of the Veterinary Department.

**Prayer 4:** Ensuring that no further allocation and adjudication of the land by the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries and the Ministry of Land, Housing and Urban Development is permitted.

The Committee noted that the two Ministries did not have any mandate or authority to allocate land.

#### **CHAPTER FOUR: RECOMMENDATIONS**

The Committee considered the information presented before it and made the following recommendations;

- 1. A Cadastral survey should be undertaken to establish the actual acreage of the parcel of land allocated to the Veterinary department and a title issued;
- 2. The original land that was set aside for use by the Veterinary Department was only partially used for the intended purpose and should remain for use by the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries;
- 3. The National Land Commission should stop any development by private entities on all parcels of land that were hived off the original land set aside for the Veterinary Farm and Training Centre;
- 4. The National Land Commission should investigate and establish the circumstances under which private entities acquired part of the original land with the view of cancelling the titles to those parcels of land and reverting the same to Keekonyoikie Community Trust;
- 5. The National Land Commission should register parcels of land that belong to beneficiaries appointed by Keekonyoikie Community Trust;
- 6. The Parcels of land hived off from the original land of the Veterinary Farm and Training Centre and allocated to other government agencies should remain for the use as currently is for public good.

The Committee considered the four (4) new set of proposed amendments and resolved as follows;

- 1. Clause 24 (1) (c): The Committee was of the view that the proposed amendment was catered for in clause 24 (1) (b), but only amend the clause by adding the words "appointed by the respective county government" immediately after the word "basin";
- 2. Clause 25 (f): The Committee observed that the proposal was catered for through regulations to be made by the Authority as provided for in Clause 27 (1);
- 3. Clause 64 (1) (b) and 64 (1) (c): The Committee noted that there was no need to have representation of the national government at the Water Works Development Agency level, but amend Clause 64 (1) (b) by adding the words "from the respective counties" immediately after the words "Cabinet Secretary".

## b) Amendment from Sen. Mutula Kilonzo Junior, M.P.

The Committee was informed that Sen. Mutula Kilonzo Junior, M.P. had submitted a proposed amendment to;

• Clause 75 (1) to delete the word "may" immediately after the word "government' and immediately before the word "establish" and replace it with the word "shall".

# MINUTE SEN/SCLNR/337/2016 : ADOPTION OF REPORT ON THE PETITION ON OLMOROGI LAND IN KAJIADO COUNTY

The Committee considered the report on Olmorogi land in Kajiado County and made amendments to chapter three on observations as follows;

- 1. The land initially set as aside for use by the Veterinary department had only been partially used for the intended purpose;
- 2. There was no evidence that the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries had been consulted when part of the land was hived off;
- 3. Trust land originally set aside for public use had been allocated to private entities irregularly;
- 4. A Cadastral survey to confirm the acreages of the parcel of land had not been concluded;
- 5. There are conflicting details of acreages of the original land; where the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries indicate the acreage as 1510 whereas the National land Commission indicates the acreage as 1580;
- 6. There are other conflicts in acreages arising from the ensuing subdivisions and remainders of the parcel of land.

The Committee further made amendments to the determinations on the Prayers in the Petition as follows;

- 1. Renumbering under Prayer 1 number (2) to alphabetical order;
- 2. Number (c) to read as follows: Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/2627, remained as veterinary farm and training centre, later it was subdivided/and or resurveyed;
- 3. Delete what was previously numbered as 6.

#### MINUTE SEN/SCLNR/338/2016 : STATEMENTS

The Committee was informed that there were three responses to statements that were Pending; two from the Ministry of Lands, Housing & Urban Development (MoLHUD) and one from the Ministry of Environment, Natural Resources & Regional Development Authorities (MENRD).

MEETING WITH THE SENATE STANDING COMMITTEE ON LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO DELIBERATE ON A PETITION ON OLMORONGI PARCEL OF LAND-P.NO.21400 MADE BY MEMBERS OF OLMORONGI KEEENYOIKE TRUST

### 1.0 RESPONSE

# 1.1 PETITION (A)

That, Olmorongi parcel of land P. NO. 21400 Ngong/Ngong was gazetted on 5<sup>th</sup> March, 1957 in Gazette Notice No. 3818 under Section 12 of the application notice.

According to available records, there is no land registered as Olmorongi parcel of land P. NO. 21400 Ngong/Ngong.

The **Gazette Notice No. 3818** states the Setting Apart of land under Section 12 of the Native Lands Trust Ordinance (Cap 100) for use by the Veterinary Department as a Veterinary Farm and Training Centre. This was contained in the Official Gazette Vol. LVIII No. 67 of **18<sup>th</sup> December, 1956**. This Gazette Notice was however cancelled later and replaced with **Gazette Notice No. 890** contained in the Kenya Gazette Vol. LIX No. 11 of **5<sup>th</sup> March, 1957**. The land set aside was later registered as **Ngong/Ngong/1959**.

(Copies of both Gazette Notices are attached as Annex 1, 2 and 2-a).

### 1.2 PETITION (B)

That, the parcel of land was set aside by the Veterinary Department for the establishment of a Livestock Veterinary Farm and Training Centre to improve livestock farming among the inhabitants of the area;

- Veterinary Department did not set aside this land for improvement of livestock farming among the inhabitants of the area. It is clear from the Gazette Notice that this land was set apart for use by Veterinary Department as a Veterinary Farm and Training Centre. It further emphasises that the land was to benefit the entire Country. The veterinary Directorates' mandate is National and benefits both the local community and the Nation at large.
- Veterinary Farms are essentially Quarantine areas as per the Animal Disease Control Act Cap 364. This implies there is controlled movement of livestock and livestock products. Indeed the Veterinary Farms are now rebranded as Veterinary Diagnostic and Efficacy Trial Centers.
- **Ngong Veterinary Diagnostic and Efficacy Trial Centre** (Ngong Veterinary Farm) is just one of the seven (7) strategically located Veterinary Farms in different regions of the Country.
- Ngong Veterinary Farm rears cattle, sheep and goats for disease surveillance and diagnostic work. Specifically, sheep are used for production of sheep erythrocytes (blood cells) for laboratory diagnostic work. They are also kept for Disease Surveillance where they act as Sentinel Herds.
- The farm is also a key facility providing infrastructure for testing of locally produced vaccines and imported ones before they are released into the local market. These are strategic undertakings that cannot be conducted in privately owned farms due to the bio-safety risks, costs and the confidentiality involved.

- Currently, the Farm has a total of **238 heads of cattle**, **254 Sheep** and **30 goats** which require adequate grazing area.
- There are plans in place to raise this herd to **400 cattle**, **500 sheep** and **200 goats**. This will provide additional capacity required for Testing of Animal Health Resource Inputs. These inputs include both locally produced and imported animal vaccines, drugs and acaricides. The importance of Ngong Veterinary Farm in this respect is critical, and has been used over the years for these roles.
- This therefore shows the difference between the functions of Veterinary farms and other Livestock Multiplication Farms which are used for breeding of improved livestock for use by farmers

## 1.3 PETITION (C)

# That the land is approximately 1510 acres

As per the Kenya Gazette Notice No.890 of 5<sup>th</sup> March, 1957 the land set apart for Veterinary Farm and Training Centre at Ngong is approximately 1400 acres. The exact acrearage may only be ascertained through surveying. Survey work on this farm is at an advanced stage. The Ministry has already paid the survey fee to the Ministry of Lands. (Annex 3)

# 1.4 PETITION (D)

That over the years the land changed purpose from the original and intended purpose.

The land under consideration was set apart as a Veterinary Farm and Training Centre. The farm has maintained this role effectively.

The Ngong Veterinary Farm houses AHITI Kabete Satellite Campus for practical training of students in Animal Health and Production, Ngong Agricultural Training Centre, National Rabbit Multiplication Centre, Apiary (Bee Keeping) Promotion Training Centre and the ongoing Leather Science Institute.

The current land use at Ngong Veterinary Diagnostics and Efficacy Trial Centre (Ngong Veterinary Farm) is as shown in **Table 1**:

# 1.5 PETITION (E)

That fifty years down the line, the land has not been productive and thus the natives have not benefited from it or from the project for which the said parcel of land was intended

The petition that the land has not been productive and that natives have not benefited is not true because of the following:-

- The efficacy trials done on drugs, vaccines and acaricides are for the benefit of the Local Community and the Country at large.
- The Ngong Vet Farm offers practical training ground for Animal Health Students drawn from AHITIs, Colleges and Universities who

after graduation provides services on Animal Health, Animal Production and Range Management to the local Community and the entire Nation (Annex 4).

- The Public Institutions namely, National Rabbit Multiplication Centre, Ngong A.T.C and Bee Keeping Centre have been of great importance to the community.
- The upcoming Leather Science Institute holds great potential in Value Addition of Leather and other animal by products. This will empower the local community and the Country economically.

# 1.6 PETITION (F)

i.

# That the planned and approved use of the said parcel of land has been changed severally unprocedurally

The planned and approved use of the land as a Veterinary Farm and Training Centre has been maintained. However since the setting aside of this land for use as a Veterinary Farm and Training Centre as per the Gazzette Notice No. 890 of 1957, the following changes have taken place:

- 10th May 1974 Registered in the name of Olekajiado County Council as parcel number Ngong/Ngong/1959
  - 14th March 1975 Land transferred to the Government of Kenya vide Ref 91889/11 of 12th March 1975 (this was a letter from the Commissioner of Lands). It was also closed after subdivision into parcel numbers 2627, 2628, and 2629.
- iii. Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/2627 was Registered under the Government of Kenya as the Proprietor and reserved for Veterinary Farm.

- iv. Parcel Ngong/Ngong/No.2628 (approx. 0.5946 Ha) was registered under the Government of Kenya as the Proprietor and reserved for Treatment Lagoons. On 18th April 1975, this was registered as Leasehold with the Government of Kenya being the Lessor and Halal Meat Products Limited as the Lessee. This was to run for 99 years wef 1-1-75. There was a RESTRICTION imposed stating "No Disposition by the Proprietor shall be Registered without the Written Consent of the Lessor".
- v. Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/ 2629 (approximately 3.990 Ha) was registered under the Government of Kenya as the Proprietor and reserved for Abbatoir. On 18th April 1975, this was registered as Leasehold with the Government of Kenya being the Lessor and Halal Meat Products Limited as the Lessee. The lease was to run for 99 years wef 1-1-75. There was a RESTRICTION imposed stating "No Disposition by the Proprietor shall be registered without the Written Consent of the Lessor".

vi. Parcel No. 2627 was closed on 7/12/1998, after subdivision into two (2) parcels, 21399 and 21400.

vii. Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/21399 (approx. 48.70 Ha or 142 Acres) was registered as Leasehold with Ol'kejiado County Council being the Lessor and Permanent Secretary (to the Treasury of Kenya) as the Lessee. This was to run for 99 years w.e.f 1-02-97. There was a RESTRICTION imposed stating "No Disposition by the Proprietor shall be registered without the Written Consent of the Lessor". This now belongs to Kenya Police.

viii. Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/21400 (approx. 541.01 Ha or 1336.84 Acres) was Registered under the Government of Kenya. Out of this some portions of the land were hived off and allocated to the following institutions:

- The remaining portion of land which is approximately 1031 acres is the current Ngong Veterinary Diagnostics and Efficacy Trial Centre (Ngong Veterinary Farm and Training Centre).
- The National Rabbit Multiplication Centre, Agricultural Training Centre, AHITI Satellite Campus and the upcoming Leather Science Institute are all located on this land (Ngong/Ngong/21400).
- There is also a temporary quarry used as a source of materials for the construction of the Nairobi Southern bypass which is a Government project.

The detailed account of all the above transactions are being pursued by the legal officer of the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries in consultation with the Ministry of Lands and the National Land Commission.

#### AHITI-KABETE

#### HISTORICAL BACK GROUND

Animal Health and Industry Training Institute was started in 1965.AHITI Kabete started as a project of GOK, FAO and UNDP. It was officially opened in 1966 by the first president of Kenya, the late Mzee Jomo Kenyatta.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- To provides training for middle grade technicians and field extension staff in livestock and related disciplines.
- To develop livestock industry in kenya and the whole of East Africa through availing of training to people of East Africa.

#### COURSES OFFERED

Initially the institute was offering certificate courses but due to the demand by the stake holders there was need to move to diploma courses while the other AHITIS (AHITI-Ndomba and AHITI-Nyahururu) remains with certificate courses.

The following courses are offered in the Institute:

- a) Animal Health and Production
- b) Animal Health and Range Management
- c) Leather Technology
- d) Short courses.
  - i) Artificial Insemination
  - ii) Tailor made courses e.g Leather craft, cobblers etc

#### **FACILITIES**

Currently the institute has a population of about 300 trainees. The locality of the main Institution does not have its own training facilities but mainly depends on its Satellite Campus located at Ngong Veterinary Farm. This is a very important training facility because there are other key Institutions within the same vicinity which provide complimentary training facilities. These includes the National Rabbit Multiplication Station and Ngong Agricultural Technologies Training Centre. All these are situated within Ngong Veterinary Farm.

#### A.H.I.T.I –NGONG EXTENSION (NGONG SATELLITE CAMPUS)

This is part of AHITI-KABETE its mainly used for the practicals and accommodation. The courses handled in this part of the institutes are as follows:

# a) Animal Health & Production, Animal Health & Range Management

The facilities in AHITI-Ngong extension are used by the AHITI- Kabete students for accommodation and also to be able to access some of the collaborators in the vicinity for their Practical's .This includes mainly, Supervised work in various livestock sections where students feed livestock (cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, poultry, beekeeping and rabbits), practice milking, organize breeding and care for sick animals. Livestock feed rationing, rearing of young stock, keeping of farm records. Management practices: culling, sexing. Livestock handling and restraining, judging, weighing. Farm structures and maintenance. Pasture production, management and conservation. These practicals are mostly done early in the morning before classes and after classes.

## b) Leather Technology

There has also been a need to train hides and skins producers, the majority of who are farmers and Pastoralists from Arid and semi-arid lands of Kenya (ASAL) areas. These ASAL Communities depend on their livestock for their livelihood. More than 60% of hides and skins produced in the country come from ASAL areas. Most of the animals slaughtered in Nairobi and other urban towns come from ASAL areas. These areas include Baringo, Kajiado, Laikipia, Samburu, Narok, West Pokot, Turkana, Mwingi, Makueni, Isiolo, Marsabit, Mbere, Garissa, Mandera, Tana River, Wajir, Machakos and Kitui districts.

The hides and skins from these ASAL areas have not been given enough attention hence a substantial quantity goes to waste for lack of: -

- Adequate collection of hides and skins
- Proper storage
- Proper preservation
- Nearby or ready market
- Market intelligence

The above problems can be overcome through relevant education of the communities

AHITI is the only institute in the country that offers a comprehensive course in Hides and Skins improvement, Leather Manufacture and Leather goods manufacture.

Currently the institute is rolling out diploma course in Leather Technology starting august this year 2015. Hence there is need to improve and expand the facilities in AHITI-NGONG. It has also the capacity to offer short courses to the farmers, butchers and traders from ASAL areas to address the problems mentioned above. The short courses include: -

- > One month course in footwear manufacture
- > One month course in leather goods manufacture
- > Two- weeks course in Hides and Skins Improvement
- One-month course in Rural Tanning Techniques, (using locally available materials). These courses will be carried out at AHITI-Ngong Extension in collaboration with modern slaughterhouses, tanneries and Leather Goods and Footwear workshops in Nairobi and bordering districts.

The institute has the capacity to offer four such courses during the academic year. The classes will consist of 25 students per course drawn from the above mentioned ASAL districts. The impact of these courses to ASAL communities will be: -

- > Improved quality of hides and skins
- Better prices for the products will be fetched
- The government will earn foreign exchange for through exportation of hides skins, processed leather and handicrafts.
- ASAL communities will be able to form community groups and start cottage industries which will process some of the hides and skins and produce leather articles for local consumption in those areas and export to other districts.
- To carry out these programmes effectively the institute will require: -
- A footwear manufacture workshop
- Two classrooms
- A quality control chemistry laboratory
- An effluent treatment model
- P Renovation and repair of the tannery and hostels
- Capacity building of the personnel at various levels

The above facilities are proposed to be constructed at AHITI-Ngong extension and renovation done on the existing facilities to ensure effective implementation of the three diploma curricula.

Attached is also a table of students who have graduated from AHITI Kabete since the year 1969. They have all utilized Ngong Veterinary Farm as the main Practical Training Centre.

# A PETITION ON OLMORONGI PARCEL OF LAND NO. 21400 (NGONG)

Honourable members I am invited by this committee to send light on the following:-

- a. Olomorongi parcel No. 21400/Ngong /Ngong was gazetted on 5<sup>th</sup> March 1978 in Gazette Notice No. 3818 under section 12 of the application notice.
- b. That the parcel of land was set aside by the veterinary department for the establishment of the livestock veterinary

farm and training center to improve livestock farming among the inhabitant in the area.

- c. That the land is approximately 1510 Acres.
- d. That over years the land user has changed unprocedurally from the original and intended purpose.
- e. That 50 years down the line the land has not been productive and thus the community has not benefited from the project for which the said parcel of land was intended for.

### Reply

# 'A' History of LR No. Ngong/Ngong 1959

LR NO. Ngong/Ngong/1959 came into existence during the adjudication and Demarcation of Ngong registration section in 1970's. The land measures approximately 560 Ha.

Prior to Adjudication and demarcation vide Gazette notice No. 890 of 5<sup>th</sup> March 1957, the said Land had been set aside for Veterinary Farm and Training Centre.

In 1975, the said land was subdivided into 3 parcels, namely – Ngong/Ngong/2627,2628 and 2629 then allocated as follows:

- Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/2628 measuring 0.5946 Ha was allocated to Halal Meat Product Limited by the Government for a term of 99 years from 1<sup>st</sup> January 1975. On 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2001 this titles was charged to Barclays Bank of Kenya to secure a loan of Ksh 65,000,000/=
- Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/2629 measuring 3.990 Ha was also allocated to Halal Meat Product Limited by the Government for a term of 99 years from 1st January 1975. Available records also indicate that the land was charged to Barclays Bank of



Kenya to secure a loan of Kshs 65,000,000/= on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2001.

'B' History of LR No. Ngong/Ngong/21400

Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/21400 is a subplot of original LR No. Ngong/Ngong/2627, it measures approximately 449 Ha, and it belongs to Veterinary Farm. We have no records of any transfer of parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/21400 to anybody, but the following Government departments have got interest on the said land.

- Ministry of Roads
- Army Gravelling Unit & Training
- Ngong Dumpsite
- Kenya Police
- East Africa Motor Sports Club
- Balance with the veterinary Department

The actual acreage occupied by the referred instituting can be established by picking their boundaries to know the exact area for the veterinary department.

## 'C'. Any other Information

From what is provided under item A &B, it is clear that LR No. Ngong/Ngong 1959 was Government Land reserved for Veterinary Department, though latter excision was done and other Government institutions and Private entities got some allocations.

Following a visit on the ground on 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> of October we became aware that a group by the name Gikuyu and Mumbi purports to own the land since 1970's. This allegation is not supported by any ownership documents.

# HISTORICAL BACKGROUND FOR LAND PARCEL NO. NGONG/NGONG.21400

Land Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong 21400 is part of the original land parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/1959 which vide Gazettee Notice No, 890 of 3<sup>rd</sup> March 1957 was set aside as Veterinary Farm and Training Centre. The original a acreage for the said land was 1510 Acres.

In 1975, the original parcel No. 1959 was subdivided into 3 parcels, namely Ngong/Ngong/2627, 2628 and 2629 and 2 parcels allocated as follows:

- Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/2628, measuring 0.5946 was allocated to Halal Meat Product Limited by the Government for a term of 99 years from 1<sup>st</sup> January 1975. On 3<sup>rd</sup> December, 2001 this title was charged to Barclays Bank of Kenya to secure a loan of Ksh. 65,000,000/=.
- Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/2629, measuring 3.990 Ha was also allocated to Halal Meat product Limited by the Government for a term of 99 years from 1<sup>st</sup> January 1995. Available records also indicate that the land was charged to Barclays Bank of Kenya to secure a loan of Ksh65,000,000/= on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2001.
- Parcel No. Ngong/Ngong/2627, remained as veterinary farm and training centre, late it was subdivided/and or resurveyed and given parcel No. 21400 measuring 1122.5 Acres.
- We have written to the Director of Surveys for a copy of the Map for the parcel.

#### **Current Ground Status**

Following a visit by National Land Commission Surveyors to LR No. Ngong/Ngong/21400, a perimeter survey for the whole land was done and it was found to be approximately 1580 Acres.

The following Institutions were found to be occupying portions of the said land as follows:-

1. Meteorological Department - 38.47 Ha

2. Army /training Site - 8.02 Ha

3. IGAD - 5.44 Ha

4. Kenya Institute of Highways and Buildings Technology (KIHBIT - 50.16 Ha.

5.	Police Dog Section	-	50.98 Ha
6.	Quarry Site	-	4 <b>0.</b> 86 Ha
7.	Areas reserved for dumping	-	14.79 Ha
8.	IDD Hassan Malambu	-	9.21 Ha
9.	Halal Meat Product	-	3.99 Ha
10.	Halal Meat Product	-	<b>0.</b> 59Ha

From the foregoing a total of 222.51 Ha (556.27 Acres) is committed to the above mentioned public institutions and private interest.

A balance of 409.48 Ha (1023.72 Acres) is left for Veterinary farm and training centre. (See the sketch plan attached herewith as Appendix I, showing all the commitment on the ground)

### Position on allocation of parts of L.R.No.21400

It was not possible to establish how the above referred Government institutions and private individuals got into LR.NO.21400, because the Director of Physical Planning and most of his staff were in Mombasa picking and planning the Waitiki farm in Likoni in preparation for President to issue titles in January, 2016.

Only the provision or existence of PDPs can explain the number of subdivisions officially done on the land.

### Ngong Land Registry Status

We were unable to get official search in Ngong Land Registry to know the current status of the title for Ngong/Ngong/21400, because the green card for the said parcel of Land was either misplaced or plucked out of the register. However, we have written to the Chief Land Registrar to provide more information and or guide on how to get the official search.

## Procedure and law for reversion of land to the Community

We are not aware of any law allowing the reversion of the land back to the community.

Section 15(2) of the Land Act of 2012 states that "land that has been reserved by the Commission shall only be used for the purpose set out by the Commission in the order designating the reservation and shall not be subject to allocation or development"

Section 16(1) (a), further states that the Commission may by order in the Gazettee, vest the care, control and management of any reserved land with a

statutory body, public corporation or a public agency for the same purpose as that for which the relevant public land is reserved under Section 15 and for purposes ancillary or beneficial to that purpose.

#### Acreage of the Unutilized Portion

The Commission is not in a position to state the acreage of unutilized land, this can only be provided by the Ministry of Agriculture, who are in charge of the said veterinary farm.


#### Reverting land back to Keekonyoike Community

As long as the veterinary farm is being utilized by the above named Government institutions, the land cannot be reverted back to the community.

As for the part of the veterinary land which went to the private individuals, the Commission will investigate how it was allocated with a view of nullifying the titles if the due process of law was not followed. This shall involve inquiries to all the listed institutions and/ or the Veterinary Department, whichever gives the information.
