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REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE YEAR 1961

Review of the Year

Despite the uncertain economic conditions which prevailed during the year 1961 there was little change in the volume of work passing through the department although as was to be expected there was a slight decline in the number of new companies, business names, chattels transfers and trade marks registrations. One encouraging aspect was the falling off of new bankruptcies after the previous year's all time record.

2. The chief points of interest connected with the multifarious activities of the department are given in the succeeding paragraphs. At the end of the Report are set out Appendices which give statistics covering the more important subjects and provide comparative figures over the last decade.

Companies Section

- 3. The section comprises the registries of Companies, Business Names, Limited Partnerships, Trade Marks, Patents and Chattels Transfers.
- 4. The number of new companies, both public and private, incorporated during the year was 271 compared with 300 in the previous year. The amount of nominal capital of new companies together with increases of capital of existing companies was significantly lower at £5,931,813 compared with £8,157,196 in the previous year and £14,057,414 in the year 1959.
- 5. There was a slight increase in new foreign companies registered and a very considerable increase in the number of foreign companies removed from the register—41 compared with only 14 in 1960. This arose as a result of a drive to remove from the register numerous foreign companies which had ceased to have a place of business in the Colony and which had never given notice of cessation to the Registrar. In the majority of cases the companies concerned had ceased to have a place of business many years previously and the figure of 41 companies removed from the register is not necessarily associated with the present conditions.
- 6. There were 4,288 locally incorporated companies on the register at 31st December, 1961, of which 286 were public and 3,002 private. The number of foreign companies on the register fell by four and stood at 584 at the end of the year.
- 7. Of the new companies incorporated during the year 39 per cent were formed and controlled by members of the European community, 49 per cent by members of the Asian community, 7 per cent by members of the African community and 5 per cent by members of both the European and Asian communities. The corresponding figures for the previous year were European 50 per cent, Asian 42 per cent, African 4 per cent and European and Asian 4 per cent, showing a marked decrease in Asian and African companies.
- 8. The volume of borrowing by companies, exclusive of borrowing on current account in respect of which no figures are available, remained steady with £8,195,557 outstanding at 31st December, 1961, compared with £8,288,035 at the end of 1960. The number of memoranda of satisfaction of mortgages recorded

during the year was 117 compared with 285 in the previous year. There is no statutory obligation on companies to notify the Registrar when a mortgage has been satisfied and it may well be that the figure of £8,195,557 includes mortgages which have been repaid but in respect of which no memoranda of satisfaction have been entered.

Business Names

9. Registrations of new business names were slightly down with 1,195 compared with 1,222 in 1960 and the number of registered changes in particulars of existing businesses fell by 57 to 549. There were 194 business names removed from the register during the year but there is evidence that many businesses have closed down without notifying the Registrar and it is possible that the figure of 194 should be somewhat higher. At the end of the year there were 19,585 business names on the register.

Chattels Transfers

10. The volume of borrowing on security by way of chattels transfer fell by approximately £200,000 during the year, the total amount borrowed being £1,718,117. There were 1,477 new instruments and 1,125 satisfactions. As in the previous years the majority of registrations related to agricultural assistance under the Agriculture Ordinance, 1955.

Patents

11. There were 112 registrations of patents during the year reflecting an increase of approximately 80 per cent over last year. A patent normally lapses at the expiration of 16 years unless any extension is granted. As at 31st December, 1961, there were 711 live patents on the register.

Trade Marks

- 12. New applications and registrations were considerably down compared with the figures of 1960 which was a record year. Seven hundred and one applications were made, and 537 registrations were effected during the year, the balance of the applications being held pending subject to amendment or the acceptance of conditions imposed by the Registrar. Four opposition cases were decided by the Registrar during the period, three being in favour of the applicants and one in favour of the opponents.
- 13. Statistics relating to the general work of the Patents and Trade Marks registries with comparative figures for the last decade are shown in Appendices VII and VII (a).

Births, Deaths, Marriages and Naturalization Registration Section

14. This section carries out the work connected with the Registrar-General's duties as Registrar-General of births and deaths and of marriages (including his duties as such under the Adoption and Legitimacy Ordinances). It also carries out registration work in connexion with naturalization.

VITAL STATISTICS

15. Current registrations of non-African births totalled 8,162 compared with 9,029 in 1960 reflecting a decrease of 867. Late registrations were also down on the previous year with a total of 1,654 compared with 1,837 in 1960. With an approximate non-African population of 289,000 as at mid-1961, registrations indicate a birth rate level of approximately 28.2 per thousand.

- 16. The total of non-African deaths registered in the Colony, excluding 12 late registrations, was 1,488 giving a crude death rate based on mid-1961 population estimates of approximately 5.1 per thousand. It is considered that this figure is rather lower than is likely to be the case which suggests that, if non-African population estimate is reasonably accurate, all non-African deaths are still not being registered.
- 17. Although it is compulsory to register deaths of Africans occurring in townships, with very few exceptions, no such deaths were registered by next of kin during the year. In districts other than Nairobi, District Registrars have registered particulars of African deaths from medical certificates received from local hospitals. A total of 5,093 African deaths has, therefore, been included in the statistics of death. Little benefit can be derived from the figures of African deaths in urban areas, however, until it proves possible for the District Registrar in Nairobi also to register such deaths.
- 18. The duty to register a death remains with the next of kin and other persons as provided under the Ordinance. It would seem, however, that until there is a general need amongst the African community for proof of death for evidential purposes there is not likely to be compliance with this requirement unless it is possible for the authority issuing burial permits also to register the death at the same time.
- 19. The analysis of deaths registered during the year was based on the intermediate list of the International Classification of Diseases, Injuries and Causes of Deaths. Most deaths—1,139—were, as in the previous year, under the class "ill defined and unknown causes of morbidity and mortality", followed by bronco-pneumonia (582) and gastro-enteritis and colitis (489).

MARRIAGES

- 20. The number of marriages celebrated under the Marriage Ordinance and the African Christian Marriage and Divorce Ordinance amounted to 9,179 reflecting an increase of 445 over the previous year.
- 21. In August, 1961, the Marriage (Amendment) Ordinance, 1961, came into operation. The Ordinance provides a minimum age of 16 years for the contracting parties to the marriage whereas the minimum ages were previously 12 years in the case of females and 14 years in the case of males. The amendment does not, however, affect marriages of Africans, Arabs or Asians. The Ordinance also empowers the Minister to make rules prescribing forms and regulating fees payable to the Registrar. These were previously included as schedules to the Marriage Ordinance and any amendments thereto required amending legislation and accordingly the new Ordinance simplifies the procedure in this respect.

Public Trustee Section

22. This section carries out the administration of deceased estates under the Public Trustee Ordinance and the management of trusts accepted under the same Ordinance. In the majority of cases the Public Trustee undertakes the administration of those estates where the assets are unadministered either because there is no heir interested or available to apply for letters of administration or the executor or administrator previously appointed has died or cannot be traced. In some cases the Public Trustee is specifically appointed to be an executor by a testator but in such cases the consent of the Public Trustee must be obtained at the time of making the will. The advantages of appointing the Public Trustee to be an executor are, firstly, that there is guaranteed continuity of office by

virtue of the Public Trustee's status as a corporation sole and, secondly, the fees charged by the Public Trustee for undertaking and completing the administration of estates are strictly regulated by statute and are not therefore subject to rapid change.

- 23. The Public Trustee is also from time to time appointed manager of persons of unsound mind under the Mental Treatment Ordinance, 1949, and is required to make an annual report on accounts submitted by other managers during the course of each year.
- 24. The number of estates accepted for administration during the year was 436, showing an increase of six over the previous year, and the number of estates finalized and distributed was up by 12 compared with 1960 with a total of 451 for the year. The gross value of all estates distributed in 1961 was £236,941, which was more than double the value distributed the previous year. Details of payments to creditors and beneficiaries may be found at Appendix XV and details of assets held by the Public Trustee as at 31st December, 1961, may be found at Appendix XXX.

Bankruptcy and Companies Liquidation Section

- 25. This section deals with bankruptcies, the compulsory winding up of companies and the registration of deeds of arrangement.
- 26. The expected increase in new bankruptcies did not materialize and it was gratifying to note that the number of new receiving orders during the year fell by six to 119 and the number of adjudication orders made dropped by 44 from 156 in the previous year. Shopkeepers and other traders again provided the highest number of new bankruptcies with 55 cases, compared with 67 in 1960 followed by builders with 16 new cases compared with 30 in the previous year. Ninety-one receiving orders were made at Nairobi, 17 at Mombasa and 11 at Kisumu.
- 27. The total value of the assets of debtors as estimated in their statements of affairs was £238,341 with liabilities totalling £704,208, the latter figure being less than half the corresponding figure for 1960. The total deficiency for the year was £466,289. Dividends paid to creditors during the period totalled £84,257 which, although a considerable fall compared with the year 1960, was nevertheless well above the average for past years.
- 28. It is difficult to give any accurate reason for the decline in the bankruptcy rate which was contrary to expectation in view of the depressed economic position which continued throughout 1961. It may well be that the spate of bankruptcies which gave rise to considerable concern in the commercial world in 1960 completely expended itself in that year or it may have been partly due to the vigorous campaign of prosecutions undertaken against bankrupts for various offences under the Bankruptcy Ordinance which was made possible by the addition to the department during the year of further qualified legal staff.
- 29. A total of 111 prosecutions against debtors, bankrupts and directors of companies being wound up by the Court was recorded for the year and of these 64 persons were sentenced to terms of imprisonment ranging from 18 months for failing to keep proper books of account to one month for failing to file quarterly returns. In the remaining cases the persons concerned were either placed on probation, fined or bound over. Five persons were acquitted of the charges against them and 22 persons were discharged absolutely.

Company Liquidations

30. There were 14 winding-up orders made during the period—two fewer than in the previous year—and in all cases but one the Official Receiver was appointed liquidator in the winding-up. Figures of assets and liabilities, details of which are given at Appendix XXIII, shows little change compared with the previous year.

Deeds of Arrangement

31. There were 11 new deeds of arrangement registered in which the total assets were shown as £115,527, liabilities as £228,736 and a total estimated deficiency of £113,209.

General

- 32. Although there was a falling off in the number of new bankruptcies during 1961, there was nevertheless an increase in the volume of work passing through the section and with the additions to the professional staff made during the year it was found possible to dispose of the large arrears of public examinations which were a disturbing feature in previous years and to give more detailed attention to the examination of debtors and bankrupts with a view to ensuring that full disclosure of assets was made and the investigation of fraudulent practices was facilitated. A further indication of the increase in turnover of work in this section was the increase in fees collected by the Official Receiver from £6,846 in 1960 to £11,151 in the year under review.
- 33. The appointment of a debt collector to recover debts owing to bankrupt estates and to collect the assets in these estates enabled the Official Receiver to realize a much larger proportion of such assets than in the past as may be seen from the figure of £200,963 in realization compared with £145,338 in the previous year.

Bankruptcy Contingency Fund

34. The Income and Expenditure Account for the year 1961 and a Balance Sheet as at 31st December, 1961, are set out at Appendix XX and Appendix XXI respectively.

Banks, Building Societies, Insurance Companies and Estate Duty

35. No new banking institutions were licensed during the year. Statistics of the operations of commercial banks in Kenya are published in the Kenya Statistical Abstract and in the Statistical Supplement of the Kenya Trade and Supplies Bulletin. It is therefore considered unnecessary to reproduce them here.

Building Societies

36. No new societies were registered during the year. Statistics as to the business transacted by local and foreign building societies are set out in Appendix XXVII. Part I of this Appendix relates to the business transacted by local building societies, Part II to local business transacted by foreign societies and Part III to the overall business transacted by foreign societies registered under the Ordinance. It is not possible to evaluate the financial status of a foreign building society by reference to its local transactions. In order to arrive at such evaluation the whole of the society's transactions must be considered in all of the territories in which it is operating. Owing to changes in the presentation of the statistics in Part I of Appendix XXVII it was not possible to include comparative figures for previous years in the Appendix.

Insurance Companies

- 37. The Insurance Companies Ordinance, 1960, supported by the Insurance Regulations, 1961, became law on 2nd May, 1961. The Ordinance made provision for insurers incorporated both in Kenya and elsewhere, to apply for a licence to conduct one or more classes of insurance business in Kenya. By 31st December, applications had been received from most insurers writing business before the introduction of the Ordinance, but a few insurers withdrew from the Colony.
- 38. Licences to conduct insurance business have been issued to 115 insurers with paid up capital of more than £50,000, and three mutual associations, although up to 31st December some insurers had not submitted a complete set of documents with applications.

- 40. The issue of a licence to one other Kenya insurer has been withheld until such time as the company has complied with the minimum provision of the Ordinance as to issued capital.
- 41. Two insurers not licensed to operate in Kenya although having offices here, are conducting closed funds at the request of the appropriate authorities of the countries in which they were incorporated.
- 42. Applications received include three insurers which are mutual associations with no issued share capital and, as provided for in the Ordinance, have made application for exemption from the necessity to make deposits as required.
- 43. Of the 118 licensed insurers the following table gives an indication of the classes of business conducted:—

Estate Duty

- 44. During the period from 1st January to 31st December, 1961, 46 new estate duty affidavits were received. Out of the total of 46 no duty was assessed in 33 cases since the net estate was less than £5,000. From the remaining 13 estates a total sum of £4.663 was assessed.
- 45. In the same period 79 corrective accounts were received and a further sum of £18,164 was assessed.
- 46. It will be observed from the Appendix that the net income in respect of estate duty for the year 1961 was only £3,593 as compared with a sum of £12,420 in 1960. The reduction in collection is due to the fact that the Estate Duty Ordinance was repealed in 1959, and as a result estate duty is not assessed on estates of persons dying after 29th April, 1959.
- 47. Total duty assessed but outstanding as at 31st December, 1961, was £32,110. Certain estates are making payment by instalments as provided in section 14 or 23 of the Estate Duty Ordinance. In other cases the amount of duty assessed has not been agreed, or the persons accountable are unable to raise funds to pay the duty.

Trade Unions

- 48. At the end of the year there were 68 trade unions on the register comprising 51 employees' and 17 employers' unions. The employees' trade unions consisted of 26 African, seven Asian, seven European and 11 unions with mixed membership, whilst the employers' unions comprised seven with European and Asian members, seven with mixed membership, and one with European, one with Asian and one with African members. During the course of the year 12 new unions were registered, nine being employees' unions and three employers' unions, while six unions were struck off the register, five being dissolved and one employees' union having its registration cancelled. Of the five unions dissolved, three were employees' unions and two were employers' unions. One trade union catering for African employees extended its scope to include workers of all races and changed its name from Cable and Wireless African Workers Union to the Cable and Wireless Workers Union of Kenya.
- 49. Details of the book and voting membership of the various trade unions on the register, with particulars of their income and expenditure as shown by annual returns, are set out in Appendix XXVI hereto. The totals of the book and voting members of employees' trade unions were 171,688 and 104,710 respectively, whilst employers' trade unions had a total of 802 book members and 761 voting members. The figures in respect of employees' trade unions were considerably in excess of the 1960 membership totals.
- 50. During the year several groups which had broken away from unions already on the register applied for registration on the grounds that the unions concerned did not fully represent the interests of the break-away factions, but in the event only two break-away unions were accepted for registration. In almost all other cases the break-away groups were organized and led by former officials of the unions who had, for various reasons, been removed from office. In the case of the Railway Union of Subordinate Staff (Kenya)—a break-away from the established Railway African Union—an appeal to the Supreme Court against the Registrar's decision to refuse registration was dismissed.
- 51. For the first time since the Trade Unions Ordinance, 1952, came into force the Registrar was reluctantly compelled to cancel the registration of a trade union after giving the statutory notice inviting the union to show cause why its

registration should not be cancelled. The grounds were unlawful expenditure of union funds and failing to comply with an order of the Registrar to comply with the Trade Unions (Accounts) Regulations, 1960, and to file the union's annual return. The union was unable to show sufficient cause and the union—the Coffee Plantation Workers' Union—was accordingly removed from the register. At the beginning of the year two applications for registration of a new coffee workers' union were received but were still pending at the end of the year because neither union could prove sufficient support from workers in the industry to enable the Registrar to decide which was the appropriate union to be accepted for registration.

- 52. At the beginning of the year the Trade Unions (Accounts) Regulations, 1960, came into force, their purpose being to standardize the accounting procedures employed by the trade unions and to reduce to a minimum instances of speculation among collectors of trade union funds. It will not be possible to gauge the full effect of these regulations until the system has been in operation for a full year during which time the unions will become fully acquainted with the new procedures.
- 53. Old rivalries between unions again flared up in the latter half of the year and it was regrettable that even some of the more responsible unions resorted to poaching members from other unions. Appropriate warnings were issued by the Registrar to each of the offenders.
- 54. The addition to the staff during the year of another senior officer will enable the department to carry out more detailed investigations into trade union affairs than was possible in the past.

Societies

- 55. At the end of the year there were 1,846 registered societies and 1,068 societies which were exempted from registration.
- 56. The number of applications for registration and exemption from registration again increased over the preceding year; 384 new registrations being effected as against 285 in 1960 and 114 societies being exempted from registration as against 80 in 1960. Thirty-five societies were refused registration, one society had its registration cancelled for failing to produce audited accounts and the registration of 167 societies was cancelled on the grounds that they had ceased to exist. The racial breakdown of the 384 societies registered by reference to the community of the office bearers or actual membership was African 321; Asian 18; European 10; Arab 10; Somali 14; multi-racial 7; Sudanese 2 and Seychellois 2. Thirteen new political associations were registered during the year; these comprise 8 African plus 38 branches; 3 Asian; 1 European; 1 Arab plus 4 branches and 12 branches of a Somali society.
- 57. A determined drive was made during the year to get in outstanding annual returns from registered societies. This resulted in bringing to light the fact that many societies on the register were defunct and suitable action was taken to cancel their registration. Similarly a good start was made in getting in up-to-date information from societies exempted from registration; this again brought to notice that some of these societies were, in fact, defunct and the necessary action was taken in this respect.
- 58. The standard of education of many of the office bearers of societies is very low, this results in a great deal of unnecessary correspondence and badly drafted constitutions which have to be re-written to make them workable and intelligible.

Books and Newspapers

59. At the end of the year there were 57 newspapers and 70 books registered. Of the former 20 were in English, 25 in a vernacular and 12 in English and a vernacular; of the latter 18 were in English, 49 in a vernacular and three in English and a vernacular.

Accounts and Establishment Section

REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE

- 60. Fees collected by the department in respect of its various services totalled £66,868. A further £3,593 was collected as estate duty and miscellaneous revenue produced £759, thus giving a total departmental revenue of £71,220. The total expenditure of the department on personal emoluments and other charges was £60,579.
- 61. A statement showing the various investments, deposits and cash balances held by the Registrar-General in his various capacities as at the beginning and end of the year will be found at Appendix XXX. Immovable property and personal effects of estates under administration in the Department are excluded from the Statement. Because of the large increase in the amount paid to beneficiaries and creditors by the Public Trustee during the year, the cash balances and investments in the hands of the Registrar-General at 31st December, 1961, fell by over £22,000 to £497,018.

ESTABLISHMENT

62. The establishment of professional officers in addition to the Registrar and Deputy Registrar-General remains at five Assistant Registrars-General and two Legal Assistants; one Assistant Registrar-General and one Legal Assistant joined the department during the year leaving one vacancy for an Assistant Registrar-General still to be filled. A new professional post for an Adviser on Accounts was created during the year and an experienced qualified accountant was recruited for the vacancy. His duties are mainly concerned with investigating and advising on the accounts of insurance companies, banks and building societies and, to a limited extent, with estate duty and bankruptcy accounts.
