REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE YEAR 1964

REVIEW OF THE YEAR

The volume of work dealt with by the Department during the year continued to grow. In particular it is pleasing to record a substantial increase in the number of new companies and business names which were registered. Of these it may be noted a growing number are now being formed by members of the African community.

The registration of births and deaths continued to expand as the public in those areas where registration is compulsory became more generally aware of the new provisions.

The revenue of the Department continued to grow particularly in the case of Estate Duty where assessments and collections were considerably in excess of the amounts estimated.

In only one section was a downward trend noticeable and that, it is satisfying to mention, since it is indicative of the continued strength of the economy of the country, was in bankruptcy where there was once again a slight decline in the number of Receiving Orders made against debtors.

COMPANIES SECTION

The section comprises the registries of Companies, Business Names, Limited Partnerships, Trade Marks, Patents and Chattels Transfers.

The number of new companies, both public and private, incorporated during the year was 427 compared with 360 in the previous year. The amount of nominal capital of new companies, together with increases in capital of existing companies, showed a substantial increase with a total of £17,029,495 as compared with £12,404,030 in 1963.

There were 36 foreign companies registered and 24 such companies removed from the register during the year.

There were 5,281 locally incorporated companies on the register at 31st December 1964, of which 299 were public and 4,982 were private. The number of foreign companies on the register stood at 636 at the end of the year, showing an increase of 12 compared with the previous year.

Of the new companies incorporated in the year, 36 per cent of these were formed by members of the European community, 35 per cent by the Asian community, 19 per cent by the African community, and 10 per cent by Europeans, Asians and Africans. The corresponding figures for the previous year were European 44 per cent, Asian 42 per cent, African 5 per cent, and European, Asian and African 9 per cent.

BUSINESS NAMES

Registrations of new business names were substantially up with 1,739 compared with 1,408 in 1963 and the number of registered changes in particulars of existing business was 809 compared with 550 in the previous year. There were 247 business names removed from the register during the year leaving a total of 28,502 on the register at the end of the year.

CHATTELS TRANSFER

The volume of borrowing on security by way of chattels transfer fell by £688,164, the total amount borrowed being £3,378,097. A total of 9,798 new instruments and 894 satisfactions were registered.

PATENTS AND TRADE MARKS REGISTRY

There was a substantial increase in the number of patent registrations, initial trade mark applications received, and related incidental matters. There was, however, a proportionate decrease in the number of trade marks actually registered.

Four trade mark hearings took place before the Registrar, two in respect of Rectification proceedings and a similar number in respect of initial applications advertised. No appeals have been preferred against the Registrar's decisions in these matters. There were several applications pending; some because the applicants were unable to satisfy all the requirements of the Trade Marks Act, and others because such applications were in dispute or were the subject of opposition proceedings.

Renewals effected in 1964 were in respect of those trade marks registered during the years 1922, 1936, 1950 and 1957. The abnormal increase in respect of renewals mainly relates to those registrations effected in 1957 which, as may be seen from Appendix VI, was a record year.

Patents

There is as yet no machinery for the original registration of patents in Kenya, only for re-registration of patents previously granted in the United Kingdom. This registration has the effect of extending the patentee's rights to the patent to Kenya. In respect of these patents 87 were registered during the year, making a total of 1,356 (including 902 live patents) on the register at 31st December 1964. This is a significant increase of 17 per cent over the comparative figure for 1963.

Trade Marks

Statistics relating to the general work of the Trade Marks and Patents Registry with comparative figures for the last decade are shown in Appendix VI. 449 trade marks were registered during the year, a decrease of 118, i.e. $22\frac{1}{2}$ per cent on the comparative figure of 567 for 1963. Registrations effected still continued to disclose the same lively interest of applicants in most sections of the patent medicine and chemical trades. The number of initial applications received, 624, also showed a slight increase of 25 on the 1963 figure of 599. The number of trade marks on the register as at 31st December 1964, was 9,619.

BIRTHS, DEATHS, MARRIAGES SECTION

This section carries out the work connected with the Registrar-General's duties as Registrar-General of Births and Deaths and of Marriages under the Births and Deaths Registration Act, the Legitimacy Act, the Adoption Act, the Marriage Act and the African Christian Marriage and Divorce Act.

Vital Statistics

In the latter part of the year the United Nations registration adviser returned to Kenya and in consultation with the various authorities concerned made an evaluation of the sample registration project upon which he founded his recommendations for future developments. His report was accepted by Government which intends to undertake a programme of phased expansion of compulsory registration throughout the country.

Registration in the sample areas during the year continued to follow the pattern which had been earlier indicated. In Nairobi the system again proved most successful showing that it will serve as a model for Kenya's larger municipal areas. In Nyeri with the stationing of a Registrar at District Headquarters registrations improved although few deaths occurring outside institutions were reported and in some sub-locations no births were registered by part-time registrars. In Kwale and Bungoma where registration continued to be effected under by-laws made by the local authorities, the results were disappointing and relatively few births and deaths were recorded.

From the data recorded in respect of the Nairobi and Nyeri areas, it has been possible to estimate crude live birth rates as follows:—

Nairobi 35.2 per thousand Nyeri 66.6 per thousand

In calculating these rates it will, of course, be appreciated that the longer the period that has elapsed since the census, the less accurate will be the estimated population base upon which these rates are calculated.

It will be noted that the rate for Nairobi is considerably lower than the rate for Nyeri or the rate expected for the country as a whole. The principal reason for this difference lies in the population structure of the two areas since the census figures showed that in Nairobi there were $2\frac{1}{2}$ times as many adult males in 1962 as there were females, whilst in Nyeri at that time there were nearly $1\frac{1}{2}$ adult females for every male. A secondary reason for the discrepancy is that in so far as Nairobi is concerned, a number of births are still not being registered in the fringe areas of the City where maternity and child welfare services are still limited and no visiting midwives are employed. The returns from Nyeri, however, suggest that the birth registration system is now well established throughout the district and the large majority of all births are being registered.

It is of interest to note that the age-limited birth rate for Nairobi is 348.5 per thousand and for Nyeri 295.3 per thousand.

In regard to deaths, the crude death rate for 1964 for Nairobi was 7.9 per thousand, whilst the infant mortality rate in respect of deaths under 6 months was 51.2, and it seems that, unlike the case of births, the system of death registration, which also involves the obtaining of a disposal permit, is working effectively. It would be misleading, however, to give a comparative figure for Nyeri since it is clear that a large number of deaths in the area are still not being reported.

In so far as country-wide statistics were concerned, current registrations of African births increased from 11,041 to 14,551 and registrations of non-African births during the year totalled 7,985 compared with 7,855 in 1963.

Late registrations increased from 2,566 in 1963 to 5,562. This increase was accounted for by the rising demand for passports particularly by the considerable number of people wishing to travel abroad for educational purposes which gave rise to the need to obtain their birth certificates.

The total of African deaths registered was 9,481 compared with 8,597 for 1963.

The analysis of deaths registered during the year was based on the intermediate list of the International Classification of Disease, Injuries and Causes of Deaths. Most deaths (1,451) were under the class "Broncho-pneumonia" followed by "Gastro-enteritis" (910).

The number of marriages celebrated under the Marriage Act and the African Christian Marriage and Divorce Act amounted to 8,510, reflecting an increase of 1,956 over the total for the previous year.

PUBLIC TRUSTEE SECTION

This section carries out the administration of estates of deceased persons under the Public Trustee Act and the management of trusts accepted under such Act. In the majority of cases the Public Trustee undertakes the administration of those estates where the assets are unadministered, either because there is no heir who is prepared or is available to apply for letters of administration, or because the executor or administrator previously appointed has died or cannot be traced. In some cases the Public Trustee is specifically appointed to be an executor by a testator, but in such cases the consent of the Public Trustee is required at the time of making the will. The advantages of appointing the Public Trustee to be an executor are, firstly, that there is guaranteed continuity of office by virtue of the Public Trustee's status as a corporation sole, and secondly, the fees charged by the Public Trustee for undertaking and completing the administration of estates are strictly regulated by statute and are not, therefore, subject to rapid change.

In addition the Public Trustee undertakes the administration of trust estates. In many cases where a minor is entitled to a legacy or share of the assets of the estate of a deceased person and not infrequently, where an award is made by a Court to a person not of full age, the executor or administrator, with the consent of the Public Trustee, or the Court, as the case may be, transfers such legacy, share, or award to the Public Trustee, who establishes a trust with it. This is administered by the Public Trustee until the whole trust fund is paid over to the former minor upon his or her attaining the age of majority.

The Public Trustee also administers trust estates which contain no provision for their maturing after the expiration of a stipulated period and for the trust funds then being paid over to particular beneficiaries. Common examples of such trusts are those which are set up for purposes such as the furtherance of education, charity, recreation, etc. The duration of such trusts is by their nature frequently extremely lengthy. In such cases the fact that the Public Trustee is a corporation sole is particularly useful as the trust funds vest in the holder of the office and not in individual trustees. Consequently, the delay and expense involved in the transfer of the funds from individual trustees to their successors in office are obviated.

The Public Trustee is also from time to time appointed manager of the estates of persons of unsound mind under the Mental Treatment Act, and is required to make an annual report on accounts submitted by other managers during the course of each year.

Six-hundred and seventy estates of deceased persons were accepted during the year for administration, representing a decrease of two in relation to the relative figure for the previous year. Twenty-five trusts were accepted reflecting an increase of six over the previous year. The number of estates finalized and distributed was 598 as against 636 in 1963. The gross value of all estates distributed was £235,086, a very substantial increase in the comparative figure of £128,962 for 1963. Details of payments to creditors and beneficiaries may be found at Appendix XV and details of assets held by the Public Trustee as at 31st December 1964 may be found at Appendix XXXIV.

BANKRUPTCY AND COMPANIES LIQUIDATION SECTION

This section deals with bankruptcies, the compulsory winding up of companies and the registration of Deeds of Arrangement.

Bankruptcies

During the year 28 Receiving Orders were made against 33 debtors—some Receiving Orders cover more than one debtor—of which four were made at Mombasa, one at Kisumu and 23 at Nairobi. This shows a slight decline over the previous year's figures. As at the end of the year four bankruptcy petitions filed by creditors were pending in Court. The total amount of deficiency as estimated by the debtors was £149,702, which is appreciably higher than the previous year's figure. Of the 33 debtors concerned, 28 were Asian, 4 European and 1 African. The classification of their respective occupations is shown at Appendix XIX. The assets realized during the year from the debtors' estates and the debtors' contributions from their after-acquired income amounted to £106,110. From these moneys a sum of £72,888 was distributed in dividends to proved creditors. Nine debtors were prosecuted for various bankruptcy offences, and in six cases convictions were obtained.

Eighty-eight discharge applications were made by debtors and of these, three were granted unconditional discharge, 82 were suspended and/or conditionally discharged and three were refused their discharge. The number of refusals in relation to the number of applications represents a much lower percentage than the relative figure for 1963. In one case an appeal to the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa against refusal of discharge was made and as a result the order of the Supreme Court was varied.

Company Liquidation

Six winding-up orders were made by the Court during the year, of which two were made at Mombasa and four at Nairobi. This shows a slight increase over the previous year. In addition the Official Receiver in one case was appointed Interim Receiver pending the making of a winding-up order. The companies in liquidation comprised three trading in general merchandise, one in electrical contracting, one in petroleum products and one was a bakery.

Deeds of Arrangement

Three Deeds of Arrangement were registered during the year, all the debtors being resident in Nairobi.

Bankruptcy Contingency Fund and Companies Contingency Fund

The Income and Expenditure Accounts for these funds for the year 1964 and the Balance Sheets as at 31st December 1964 are set out as Appendix XX, XXI, XXIV and XXV respectively.

BANKS, BUILDING SOCIETIES AND INSURANCE COMPANIES SECTION

Banks

The Bank of Tokyo was granted a banking licence during the year.

A schedule of the Banks, Hire Finance companies and other companies which have been granted banking licences under the provisions of the Banking Act, is set out in Appendix XXIX.

It may be noted that the following companies are licensed to conduct banking business, although they are not in fact accepting deposits from the public:—

United Dominions Corporation (E.A.) Ltd.,

Standard Bank Finance and Development Corporation,

Bank of Tokyo, Ltd.

Statistics covering the operation of commercial banks in Kenya are published in the Kenya Statistical Abstract and the Statistical Supplement of the Kenya Trade and Supplies Bulletin. It is, therefore, considered unnecessary to reproduce such data in this Report.

Building Societies

No new building societies were registered during the year.

The remaining two building societies in Kenya are the Kentanda Mutual Building Society and the East African Building Society, of which only the latter is engaged in lending operations.

Statistics relating to building societies are set out in Appendix XXX.

Insurance Companies

At 31st December 1964, 101 insurers were licensed to conduct insurance business in Kenya. During the year 10 insurers ceased writing business and three licences were issued to new insurers.

Of the 10 insurers ceasing to write new business, five closed their offices and portfolios in Kenya, and the remaining five continue to maintain offices in Kenya, but have ceased to issue new policies of insurance.

Statistics showing the countries of origin of insurers and the classes of insurance business which they conduct may be found at Appendix XXXI (a) and (b).

ESTATE DUTY SECTION

This section has had to deal with assessments of duty under two classes; those on estates which passed before the suspension of the application of the former Estate Duty Ordinance in 1959 and which have not been finalized and those on estates which have passed since 12th June 1963, when the Estate Duty Act was reintroduced. The data given in Appendix XXVII has been so arranged as to indicate under which of the two statutes assessments have been raised.

During the year 416 assessments were raised under the Act and the duty assessed amounted to £230,904. Twenty assessments were raised under the Ordinance and the duty assessed was £6,817.

Of the total number of estates passing and assessed under the Act, no liability for duty arose in 301 estates, i.e. 72 per cent, as the net value in each case did not exceed £5,000. The remaining 115 estates (comprising 28 per cent) attracted duty at percentages varying from 2 to 18. The corresponding figures for the estates assessed and passing under the Ordinance were 13 and 7 respectively.

Refunds made during the year in respect of estates passing under the Act and the Ordinance amount to £39,594 and £1,197 respectively, the latter figure including a remission of duty of £291.

Corrective accounts were received in 89 estates. Of these 54 were subject to the provisions of the Act and 35 to the provisions of the Ordinance. They attracted additional duty to the value of £8,890 and £8,417 respectively.

The net amount of duty collected during the year was £215,545.

TRADE UNIONS SECTION

There were 64 trade unions on the register at the end of the year, comprising 49 employee and 15 employer trade unions. Those of the employee unions comprised 4 European, 4 Asian and 2 African unions with 39 having a mixed membership, whilst those of the employer unions consisted of 1 African and 14 with mixed membership.

During the year one new union, the East African Railways and Harbours Designated Officers' Association, was registered. Subsequently the East African Railways and Harbours European Staff Association amalgamated with it under the name of the new union. In consequence of the amalgamation the name of the older union was removed from the register.

Four employee trade unions, namely, Harbour Asian Union of East Africa, Municipal Asian Staff Association, Kisumu, Nairobi County Council Staff Association and the Broadcasting Workers' Union (Kenya) were dissolved resulting in the removal of their names from the register. One probationary employee trade union, the Fire Brigade's Union of Kenya was refused registration on the ground that the interests of its members were adequately represented by the Kenya Local Government Workers' Union. The registration of two employer trade unions, the Electrical Contractors' Association of East Africa and the Kenya National General Contractors Employers' Union were cancelled on the ground that the two unions had ceased to exist.

Two employee trade unions registered changes of names. The Cable and Wireless Workers' Union became the East African External Telecommunications Workers' Union (Kenya) and the Kenya African Game Hunting and Safari Workers' Union is now the Kenya Game Hunting and Safari Workers' Union.

Applications for registration from seven trade unions were refused. Four of these were received from break-away factions of registered trade unions. The other three applications were made by the Kenya National Labour Congress, the Kenya Workers' Labour Congress and the Kenya United Workers' Union, all three bodies purporting to represent the interests of multifarious trades and industries which were already represented by other registered trade unions. There were no appeals against refusals of registration.

On 20th October 1964, several amendments were made to the Trade Unions Act. The results of the more important of these amendments were to make the registration of branches compulsory, to clarify the procedure for registering appointments and changes of office-holders, and to define the method of appointment and scope of reference of a Trade Unions' Tribunal. The Trade Unions (Accounts) Regulations were also amended at the same time to make them more stringent and improve the accountancy procedure.

The amended legislation resulted in the registration of 74 branches. Of the estimated 210 branches remaining unregistered at the end of 1964, applications were made by 42, but registration could not be effected, because the applications did not contain sufficient particulars and had to be held over pending the receipt of further information. Approximately 168 branches, therefore, had not complied with the amended provisions of the Act at the end of the year and they will be advised that prosecution proceedings will follow if they persist in failing to apply for registration.

During the course of the year officers of the section carried out inspections of 197 sets of trade union books of account comprising the accounts of 39 head offices and 158 branches. In addition to the inspections carried out in Nairobi, others were carried out at Mombasa, Nakuru, Kericho, Kisumu, Kisii, Lumbwa,

Kitale and Eldoret. As a result of investigations the treasurer of a trade union was prosecuted at Nakuru for failing to comply with the provisions of the Trade Unions (Accounts) Regulations, and a branch treasurer was prosecuted at Mombasa for failing to present the books of account for inspection on the required date. On conviction, fines were imposed upon both.

Details of the book and voting membership of the trade unions on the register, with particulars of their income and expenditure as shown by their annual returns, are set out in Appendix XXXVIII hereto. The totals of the book and voting members of employee trade unions were 253,533 and 246,519 respectively.

The total number of 774 book members of employer trade unions coincided with the total number of voting members.

SOCIETIES, BOOKS AND NEWSPAPERS SECTION

Societies

At the end of the year there were 2,716 registered societies and 1,110 societies which were exempted from registration.

During the year 469 new registrations were effected as against 505 in 1963 and 87 societies were granted exemption from registration as against 112 in 1963. 136 societies were refused registration and 188 societies ceased to exist and had their registrations or exemptions cancelled.

The number of societies refused registration appears to be abnormally high, but the majority of refusals were on technical grounds (mainly because of a failure to submit correct applications) and the total also includes a number of applications which were outstanding from the previous year.

The number of societies which ceased to exist increased during the year as a result of systematic inquiries which are now instituted when societies fail to make the required returns.

As in the previous year, many trading concerns and co-operative societies sought registration under the provisions of the Societies Act. In all such cases the applicants were advised to apply for registration under the Registration of Business Names, Companies or Co-operative Societies Acts respectively and were referred to the appropriate authority.

The inability of some office-bearers of prospective societies to complete applications for registration in the prescribed manner is still a major problem and results in lengthy, repetitive and protracted correspondence. Detailed instructions on the correct procedure are issued to all prospective societies to assist the public in that respect.

Orders were made for the winding-up of two unlawful societies during the year.

Books and Newspapers

At the end of the year there were 61 newspapers on the register, but a number of these were, in fact, not in production although official notification that they had ceased to publish had not been made during the period under review. Nine new registrations were effected and two newspapers ceased publication. The number of registered books is now 277, 62 of these having been registered during the year. Of the new registrations, 33 were printed in vernacular, 27 in English, 1 in Swahili and English and 1 in Swahili, Nandi and English.

ACCOUNTS SECTION

Revenue and Expenditure

Fees collected by the Department in respect of its various services totalled £78,384 and miscellaneous revenue amounted to £1,167. A further £256,336 was collected in respect of Estate Duty, but a total sum of £40,791 was paid out by way of duty refunded or remitted. The total expenditure of the Department on personal emoluments and other charges was £72,045.

Establishment

Two senior expatriate officers resigned during the year, one a member of the professional staff and the other an Assistant Registrar of Trade Unions. These posts were filled by the appointment of Messrs. R. J. Ombere, LI.B., and S. O. Tala, B.A.

A further in-service training course was organized within the Department during the period from May to September. The purpose of this course is to train junior members of the clerical staff in the specialized work of the Department and to help them to acquire the technical skills required to fit them for advancement to the executive grades when they have obtained the necessary practical experience. It is pleasing to record that two clerical officers who had successfully completed an earlier in-service training course were promoted to the executive grade during the year.
