

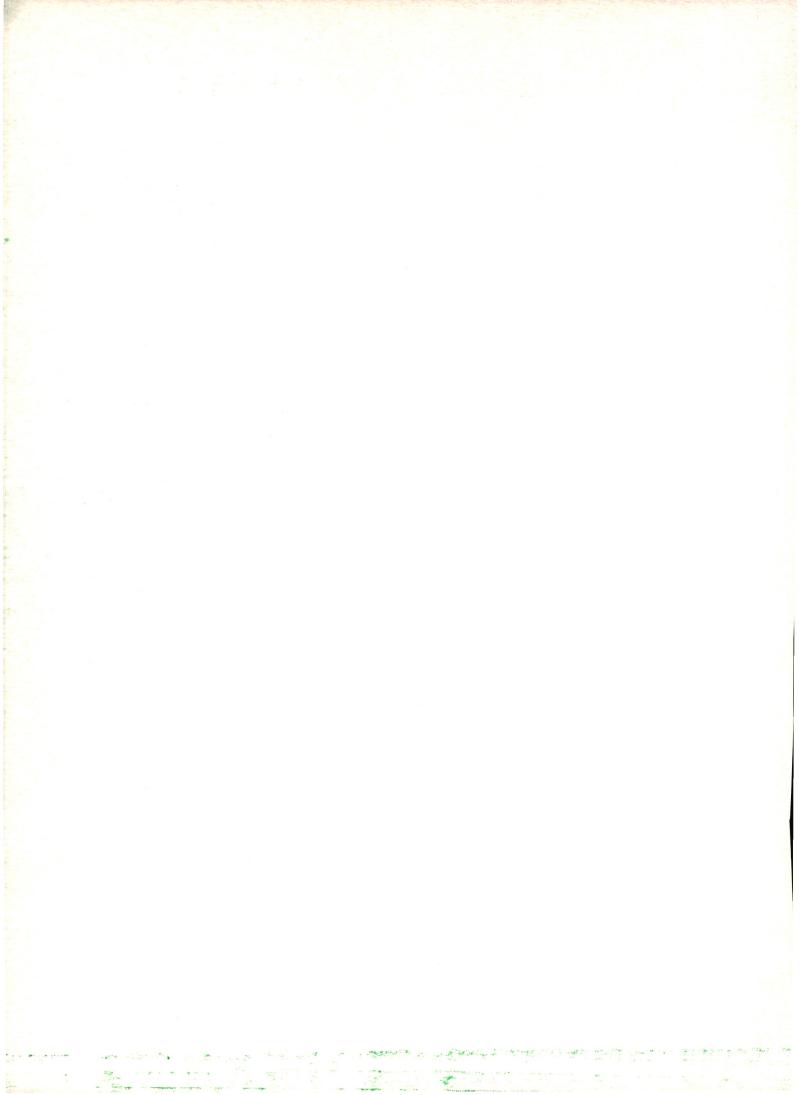

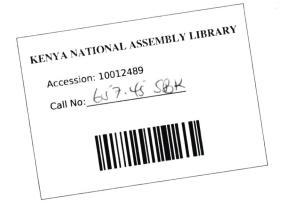

### **SISAL INDUSTRY REVIEW - 1994**

### (a) Sisal Production

There was a slight drop in the overall sisal fibre production compared to 1993. The 1993 production was 34,394 tonnes compared to 33,953 tonnes in 1994. The reason being that the farmers had not recovered fully from poor prices offered coupled with the depressed demand in the world market in 1991/92 and the first half of 1993. So farmers could not respond immediately to the favourable prices offered in the second half of 1993 and 1994.

On regional basis, production of all grades of sisal fibre and tow during the last two consecutive years was as follows:-

### (b) Sisal Marketing

Between 80-90% of all sisal fibre and tow produced in Kenya is exported overseas to over 30 countries every year. The rest is sold locally. In 1994 out of the total production of 33,953 tonnes a total of 26,315 tonnes were exported. The country earned Ksh. 689,046,615 in foreign exchange. In 1993 a total of 26,647 tonnes was exported earning the country an equivalent of Ksh. 684,709,697. In 1994 a total of 7,484 tonnes of sisal was sold locally earning the farmers Ksh. 188,472,024.1994 earnings surpassed 1993 because of favourable prices in all the sisal grades. Our sisal fibre is still in high demand due to its high quality and wide spread of importing countries stretching from Europe to the Far East. Currently the average price of the popular grades UG and 3L stands at US\$510 per tonne f.o.b. Mombasa.

The top ten importers are South Korea, Portugal, Japan, United Kingdom, Spain, Belgium, Saudi Arabia, Philippines, Egypt and Taiwan in that order.

### (c) Sisal Board Operational Results

In 1993/94 financial year the Board's revenue increased by 54% while expenditures went up by 40% compared to 1992/93 financial year. This increase in revenue was as a result of the increase in value of sisal exports due to the high exchange rate of the Kenya Shilling against the United States dollar (the major currency that the sisal exports is denominated in) that was prevalent in 1993/94. This meant a high increase in the inspection service charge collection. The adjustment of the rental charges on the Board's property also contributed to the increase in revenue. The increase in expenditures was reflective of the general level of the Board's activities coupled with the inflationary rate prevailing then. The Board was able to realise a surplus of K£36,176 from its operations in the 1993/94 financial year compared to the registered deficit of K£4,019 in 1992/93.

### **NOTE 1 - ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

(a) The accounts have been prepared on the historical cost basis of accounting.

(b) The fixed assets have been depreciated on a reducing balance method on monthly basis at the following rates:-

(i) Godowns 3%

(ii) Furniture, Fixtures, Fittings and Equipment 10%

(iii) Office Block - Mombasa 3%

(iv) Motor Vehicles 25%

(v) A.S.K. Show stand - Mombasa 10%

(c) Revenues and expenses are recognised and matched with the period to which they accrue.

### NOTE 10 - CESS INCOME

During the 1993/94 financial year a total production of 36,071 tonnes of sisal was invoiced for earning the Board a sum of K£54,107. This reflected an increase of K£4,787 or 10% over the previous financial year's revenue from this source.

### NOTE 11 - RENT INCOME

The rental income of K£150,052 reflects an increase of K£20,094 which represents 16% over the previous year when a sum of K£129,958 was realised from this source. This increase is a result of an upward adjustment on the rental charges on the Board's godowns situated in Mombasa that was effected during the second half of the financial year under review.

### **NOTE 12 - INSPECTION SERVICE CHARGE**

During the 1993/94 financial year the Board earned a sum of K£255,348 from this source of revenue. This reflects an increase of K£134,064 which represents an increase of 111% over the previous year's earnings when a sum of K£121,284 was received from this source. This huge increase is attributed to the remunerative prices in the World market coupled with high demand of the sisal fibre and the adverse effects on the exchange rate of the Kenya shilling against the US dollar in 1993/94.

### NOTE 13 - EXTRA-ORDINARY GAIN

During the 1993/94 financial year the Board sold an assortment of household furniture whose net book value stood at K£6,969 for K£8,326, their cost price, thus realising again of K£1,357.
